Tales from RAF Bradwell Bay

Health and Safety wasn't a phrase used in the war, various factory acts had been passed but the Health and Safety at Work act did not come into law until 1974. WW2 was heavily industrialised and so accidents were bound to happen on the ground as well as in the air.


On 1st September 1943 the FIDO system was being installed by the contractors William Press and Son. The foreman and his team were digging just south of Runway 2. At 1540 they stopped work and returned at 1600. The foreman, Mr Neal, noticed that 3 of the workers, Schofield, Grant and Smith were taking a short cut across the runway. He called them back and told them of the correct procedure. They agreed to take his advice then changed their minds and continued to take their original route.

Runway 2 was the active runway and training flights were being carried out by a Mosquito H.J.877. S/L Wallington had flown in from Sculthorpe to give some dual instruction in a 29 squadron Mosquito. At the time of the incident the pilot under instruction was F/Sgt Alexander.

The three workmen realised the danger they had put themselves in when they saw the Mosquito landing and tried to run. F/Sgt Alexander tried to avoid the men on the runway but unfortunately hit Mr Schofield who was found on the north side of runway 2 about 24 yards away.

He was severely injured; the four fingers of his left hand and the thumb had been severed. Two fingers of his right hand were injured, and he was suffering from a head injury and shock.

The subsequent inquiry exonerated the Mosquito crew and the foreman of the contractors as he had given them safety warnings. The cause of the accident was given as the negligence of Mr Schofield.

Alfred the Great, King of the West Saxons, scholar, d AD 899

Can you think of a politician who deserves to be called a saint? If no one currently living politician comes to mind, never mind – there is always King Alfred of Wessex (871-99).

This remarkable and best known of all the Anglo-Saxon rulers may have dozed off and let some cakes burn while a peasant woman was hiding him from the Vikings, but he did so much else which was of lasting good for the Anglo-Saxon people.

It was a desperate time for the Anglo-Saxons – the kingdoms of Northumbria, East Anglia and Mercia had fallen to the Vikings. Only Alfred's province remained free. Through some inspired military manoeuvring, Alfred managed to keep them at bay. As a Christian, he became the defender of all Christian Anglo-Saxons against the pagan Vikings. (His son and grandsons went on to conquer the Vikings, and thus ensured the future unity of England.)

Alfred was also a scholar, and admired certain writings which had laid down models of ideal Christian kingship. He tried to put these principles into practise, such as producing a law-code. Alfred believed strongly that anyone in authority should have to study in order to learn how to govern. Not such a bad idea for leaders today!

Alfred was never canonised by the Church, but his translation of Consolation of Philosophy by Boethius is often thought to be a fitting epitaph: *I desired to live worthily as long as I lived, and to leave after my life, to the men who should come after me, the memory of me in good works.* 9

The Othona Community.

In September 1976 the founder of the Othona Community, Canon Norman Motley, wrote: "Othona is a strange phenomenon where the fraternal dialogue may truly take place. No-one can define precisely what happens, but of this we may be sure. The Holy Spirit is free there to direct and lead in the lives of people without prescribing (as the Church so often has done) His mode of operation. To put it more crudely, the Divine Spirit, Who blows where He lists, and who does not take kindly to being confined to the intentions of men, does seem to express Himself in a hundred and one new ways in the uninstitutional character of the Community." (Letters to a Community 1970-1980.)

Othona is still a strange phenomenon. Many people ask what it is, what it's for, what goes on down there. Those of us who have shared in community at Othona over a number of years have still not found the answers – but we still need the questions. For each who visits, stays for a while or joins the Team, the answers are different – and changing imperceptibly, as we realise when we look back. The Christian Spirit, and thus the Holy Spirit, leads us to new openings as the Community shifts and changes shape – which it does each day, as the make-up of the Community changes. As one who has visited, stayed and worked at Othona over hundreds of days, I believe there has never been a time when I have sat down to a

meal with the same people around the table. Yes, there will be the stability of many familiar faces - alongside new faces, and the return of those who have held the memory of Othona for many years.

Picture a day in early September, as the Summer Season drew to a close. Astronomy week was well attended, and many stayed on over the Bank Holiday Weekend, joined by others. Two surprise visits – a retired wom-



an I had known as a young and somewhat troubled young Mum, returned after 30 years because she simply could not keep away, and was so happy to find familiar people in Community; and who was drawn, as a Windrush immigrant, to give comfort and advice to a new family of refugees fleeing the corruption of a South American country. Also – a return visit by a woman who had kept Othona in her heart for 50 years, soon enjoying conversations and music as if the troubles of the years were melting away. Conversations are frequently light-hearted, funny, good -humoured, and inclusive.

Encounters turn to friendly chats, and it is a surprising reality of Othona that at times, as an unexpected gift of the Holy Spirit, true friendships and lasting relationships develop, taking the spirit of Othona beyond the confines of space and time. Then, 101 new ways of sharing Othona spring from the Spirit.

We had an Autumn Retreat on the Weekend of 23/25 September, led by our Bishop John Perumbalath, then our ever-popular Harvest Working Weekend from 30 Sept to 2nd Oct – local people welcomed to come and share the fun, fellowship and fruit. **More activities in October include:**

Silver Sunday


Silver Sunday is a national event to celebrate older people and help to tackle the problem of social isolation and loneliness. Essex Library Service is hosting events on
