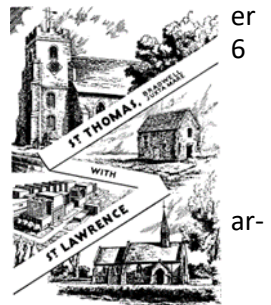
October Village View

A tour of the Essex & Herts Air Ambulance Visitor Centre



For our August meeting, we took a trip to Earls Colne to visit the Visitor Centre of the Essex & Herts Air Ambulance. Living where we do, the Air Ambulance is an indispensable lifeline, and many of us have personal stories of times when we have depended on their critical services.

We began our day with a lovely lunch at The Black Horse Café, within the local Olivers Plants garden centre, before heading to the nearby Air Ambulance Visitor Centre.



Upon our arrival, we were fortunate to witness the helicopter taking off in response to an urgent call — one of up to six calls they respond to daily.


We were then treated to a tour by two volunteers, where we learnt so much more about the vital service. Many of us were surprised to learn just how much the Air Ambulance can do; far from being merely a "hospital taxi service," they are equipped to perform advanced medical procedures, often exceeding the capabilities of a regular land ambulance. Incredibly, they can also reach any location in Essex and Hertfordshire within 20 minutes of leaving the base.

The Essex & Herts Air Ambulance receive no funding from the government, apart from the salary of just one of the four personnel aboard each helicopter. The charity relies entirely on donations from supporters to cover its £12 million annual operating costs.

Living in a rural area, the Air Ambulance is absolutely crucial due to the distance from our local hospitals. It bridges the gap, providing rapid response times that can literally be the difference between life and death in critical situations. Their ability to reach remote locations and deliver expert care on the scene is invaluable, ensuring that we have access to the lifesaving treatment we may one day need.

Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday the 11th of September at the village hall where we'll be joined by Stephen Nunn for our 'Maldon, The Dengie & the battle in the skies' evening. This is an open meeting, so anyone can come along. Doors open at 7:30 pm, and the talk begins at 7:45 pm. Tickets cost £5 each on the door, and there'll be refreshments!

The Othona Community, Summer 2024.

Summer sun started late, but just in time for a wonderful Summer Season at the Othona Community. The International Week was a great celebration of different cultures – and delicious cooking. The shooting stars of the Perseids (also known as the Tears of St Lawrence because they are visible on the day of his martyrdom, August 10th) gave us a nighttime spectacle, as by day we were listening to fascinating, if somewhat complex lectures by Roger Noble, Othona member and astronomer at Jodrell Bank Centre for Astrophysics. A very different week followed, with Machteld Teekens getting the Community in creative mood for Art Week. After a Bank Holiday Weekend of Sea, Sunshine and Tranquility, the Summer Season’s final offering was “Nature’s Chronicles” led by Christina Ravinet; and where better to follow nature than in the increasingly diverse habitats sustained by Othona volunteers, (that could include you.) Our current longer term French volunteers, Quentin and Lou, have been with us for nearly two months and are a great addition to the team, alongside many new and returning summer Team Volunteers. On 17th August Othona held an Open Bradwell, Centre Committee Meeting, an annual opportunity for all to participate in the nuts and bolts of the Centre.

Held in person and on line, the current Committee under the Chair of Rev. Steve Barnes reported on a good record of Health and Safety, our ongoing excellent standard of Food Hygiene, and a sound financial performance, with a reminder that we still have a shortfall of several thousand pounds in our Yurt Refurbishment Fund, with thanks to those who have already made generous contributions; and the imminent necessity to fund the replacement of our ancient and failing septic tank system. There are also concerned discussions about the inadequacy of the accommodation for the resident Core and Volunteers – more at a later date.



The Programme is put together – and delivered – by volunteers, and we were asked for suggestions of anyone we knew who might offer a week or weekend on any topic relevant to Othona. The Othona-wide website is in process of being updated – watch that space! “Membership” is also under review, but in everyday terms a member of Othona is anyone who shares time at the place, and in the spirit, of Othona, including many from our local villages. The meeting was attended by Clare Gough, Chair of the Othona Community trustees. Clare is standing down from this role at our October AGM, for health reasons, and was warmly thanked for her guidance and commitment to Othona over the past six years. If you, or anyone you know, are interested in taking over that responsibility, please look at the Othona website for more information.

As our founder Norman Motley wrote in October 1973, and still just as relevant in September 2024: **“There is immense need. We have material potential. We shall need more than ever the dedication and commitment of old and new members of the Community. Where do you stand?”**

Although the Summer Season is ending, Othona never sleeps, either at Bradwell or our sister Community in west Dorset. No rest for the Centre Team, as they will soon be hosting other groups, starting with the Quaker Voluntary Action Working Retreat to be held at the Othona Community in September. News from RAF Bradwell Bay

We have spoken of events around the D-Day invasion of Europe, let's look at some of the build-up which stretches back into 1943.

In the Autumn of 1943 2 squadrons both equipped with Mosquito aircraft but with different jobs to do.

In September 1943, 488 Squadron came to RAF Bradwell Bay. At the time they were a defensive squadron and had moved from RAF Drem in Scotland. They were active on home defence especially during Operation Steinbock, known as the 'Baby Blitz', in early 1944. On 21st March 1944 the squadron brought down 3 aircraft in 1 night, 2 by the same crew.

Air Marshal Sir Roderick Hill, Air Officer Commanding ADGB, is shown the wreckage of one of three enemy aircraft shot down by aircrews of No. 488 Squadron RAF, flying from Bradwell Bay, Essex, on the night of 21 March 1944.

In October 1943 605 Squadron came to RAF Bradwell Bay from Castle Camps in Cambridgeshire, in their role as an intruder squadron. The day following the move to RAF Bradwell Bay the squadron was carrying the fight across to the continent to soften the Germans and especially the airfields and transport infrastructure in preparation to the planned invasion in 1944. These raids were to be successful in weakening the transport infrastructure and Luftwaffe so that reinforcements would find it difficult to be transported to invasion areas and to assist in gaining air superiority over the German forces.
