A Living Sacrifice

¹Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. ² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be

transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Humble Service in the Body of Christ

³ For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. ⁴ For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. ⁶ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. Peter Declares That Jesus Is the Messiah

- ¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"
- ¹⁴ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."
- ¹⁵ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"
- ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."
- ¹⁷ Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever

you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." ²⁰ Then he ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

May I speak in the name of the living God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Well, I want to begin by asking you 'how is your garden'? Ours has definitely flourished over these last few months. Being able to spend time out there, planting, lots of weeding and remembering to water!

Thinking about that, and the word flourish enabled me to ask another question.

How have you flourished over these months of lockdown?

And more importantly, perhaps, how can we enable others to flourish as we worship in new ways. As we go through the next few months, we are going to be worshipping sometimes on line and sometimes together. We need to ensure that everybody is enabled to flourish.

Looking at today's gospel reading we might begin to discover how Jesus can help us. How did Jesus enable his disciples to flourish, to come to know the kingdom and the Father?

Well, he used a lot of stories and he used questions. In St John's gospel there are 20 questions that Jesus used.

Today, in this story we see Jesus enabling his disciples by beginning with a question. He is encouraging them to discover for themselves who he is.

Let's look a little closer at this story. First of all, where they are is quite important. The city of Caesarea Philippi is next to a spring and grotto devoted to the worship of the god Pan. A heathen place of worship. No Jew would go there, it would be like going into the 'red light' district. It is here that Jesus stops with his disciples and says 'tell me who do the people say that I am?' They reply with 'well some say John the Baptist or Elijah but everyone thinks that you're a great prophet'. 'Yes', says Jesus 'but who do you say that I am'?

And Peter, Peter says 'you are Christ, the Messiah, the Son of the Living God'. Jesus says 'well done Peter, it was God the father who gave you those words.'

And that can happen to us sometimes, when we are praying or with someone, we can find ourselves saying unexpected words that help and we know are God given. Sometime ago I was chatting with someone and I had no idea that she was lonely. We were talking about the 23rd psalm and I found myself saying — 'you need to read this; it says that you need never be lonely because I am with you'. Those were the words she needed to hear at that moment. They were God given.

So, this is what has happened to Peter. He's come out with this amazing statement – 'you are the Messiah'. No-one has said that before. They probably never dared even begin to think it.

You are the Messiah, the son of the Living God. And Jesus says 'Peter, I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

It is on that statement, 'Jesus is the Son of God', that the church is built, and that our belief is founded on.

Then at the end there is a strange sentence where Jesus tells the disciples not to say anything about this. But surely that's what we are supposed to do? Maybe in this context we see Jesus encouraging and teaching his disciples and telling them that they are not to go around shouting that they have found the Messiah until they understand and have been through the crucifixion, resurrection and Pentecost.

So, what does all this have to say for us today? Perhaps it just reminds us that our faith and our belief is founded on Jesus. We don't have to go around with a placard saying Jesus is the Son of God, we have to live our lives knowing and believing in Jesus. Believing in God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit founded on Jesus. In following Jesus our lives will change in such a way that people will ask us the questions. 'Why do you do that? Why do you work with those people? We can answer and say 'because Jesus is the Son of God' and talk about the difference that knowing Jesus makes in our lives.

So that's what today's story is about.

I would like to finish with a prayer written by Laurie.

'Who Am I?'

Peter, who am I?

Our father, who art in heaven.

Blest are you for saying this.

Hallowed be your name.

Peter, what do you want from me?

Thy kingdom come.

It will, it will.

Thy will be done.




