Hearing and responding to the Word of God

Readings

The first reading is from Genesis 29.15-28

¹⁵ When morning dawned, the angels urged Lot, saying, 'Get up, take your wife and your two daughters who are here, or else you will be consumed in the punishment of the city.' ¹⁶ But he lingered; so the men seized him and his wife and his two daughters by the hand, the LORD being merciful to him, and they brought him out and left him outside the city. ¹⁷ When they had brought them outside, they[™] said, 'Flee for your life; do not look back or stop anywhere in the Plain; flee to the hills, or else you will be consumed.' ¹⁸ And Lot said to them, 'Oh, no, my lords; ¹⁹ your servant has found favour with you, and you have shown me great kindness in saving my life; but I cannot flee to the hills, for fear the disaster will overtake me and I die. ²⁰ Look, that city is near enough to flee to, and it is a little one. Let me escape there—is it not a little one?—and my life will be saved!' ²¹ He said to him, 'Very well, I grant you this favour too, and will not overthrow the city of which you have spoken. ²² Hurry, escape there, for I can do nothing until you arrive there.' Therefore the city was called Zoar. ²³ The sun had risen on the earth when Lot came to Zoar.

²⁴ Then the LORD rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulphur and fire from the LORD out of heaven; ²⁵ and he overthrew those cities, and all the Plain, and all the inhabitants

of the cities, and what grew on the ground. ²⁶ But Lot's wife, behind him, looked back, and she became a pillar of salt.

²⁷ Abraham went early in the morning to the place where he had stood before the LORD; ²⁸ and he looked down towards Sodom and Gomorrah and towards all the land of the Plain, and saw the smoke of the land going up like the smoke of a furnace.

The 2nd reading is: Romans 8.26-39

²⁶ Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷ And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

²⁸ We know that all things work together for good[®] for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family.[®] And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

God's Love in Christ Jesus

³¹ What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³² He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³ Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵ Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Parable of the Mustard Seed

³¹ He put before them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; ³² it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.'

The Parable of the Yeast

³³ He told them another parable: 'The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.'

Three Parables

- ⁴⁴ 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.
- ⁴⁵ 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; ⁴⁶ on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.
- ⁴⁷ 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; ⁴⁸ when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. ⁴⁹ So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous ⁵⁰ and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Treasures New and Old



Sermon: By Revd Steven:

We begin with another of St Paul's great verses of scripture in verse 38 and 39 of Romans 8:-

³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

These mighty verses gives us further hope and comfort at this time, as we hear that God will never separate himself from us in Christ, because Paul says in verse 32:-

³² He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else?

Christ has triumphed over all things, and they are now in submission to him. Within this passage, Paul lists five truths about God's providence:-

- 1. We know that God works, or is at work, in our lives. Here, we are to put ourselves continually guided by God, in all the events of our lives.
- 2. God is at work for the good of his people. The good which is the goal of all his providential dealings with us is our ultimate well-being, namely our final salvation.

- 3. God works for our good in all things. Thus all that is negative in this life is seen to have a positive purpose in the execution of God's eternal plan.
- 4. God works in all things for the good to those who love him. Paul rarely speaking of loving God is probably referring to the first and great commandment to love God with our whole being.
- 5. Those who love God are also described as those who have been called according to his purpose. For their love for him is a sign and token of his prior love for them.

Paul continues these stages he names foreknowledge, predestination, calling, justification and glorification. With regards to predestination here, this is not to say that God predestines people who are going to believe because the ground of their salvation is in themselves and their merit, instead of in God's mercy and free initiative of grace. We know from elsewhere in the New Testament that Jesus wants to draw all people to himself and desires all peoples to be saved. This is summed up in verse 29 that we should be conformed to the likeness of his Son.

This is part of his trinitarian argument with the working of the triune God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in action with the world and the God is for us in verse 31, is of the greatest value.

This greatest value is the theme of our Gospel reading with the parables of the mustard seed, leaven, pearls etc. For these parables are about the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, and he is not exaggerating. Knowing God in Jesus Christ and discovering the kingdom is the greatest treasure this world affords and lasts into the next. How does the value of the kingdom affect our values in this world?

The mustard seed and the yeast are everyday miracles. Everyone knows how they work, and how extraordinary it is that something so small can have such an effect. But had you ever thought of the kingdom of Heaven like that? Surely the kingdom of Heaven is already huge and magnificent, not something tiny, working inconspicuously until suddenly you can't miss it any more? The surprise in these parables is not what the yeast and the mustard seed do, since we know that already. The point is that other things, that you may not be so familiar with, may also behave like this. Don't discount small things until you know what they are capable of. Don't think about big things as though they can never have had small beginnings and that these small beginnings can result in great transformation.

In the long perspective of Genesis, part of the point is to see God's hand in the duplicity and half-faith of the patriarchs. Every day, there are new possibilities in our daily friendship with the living God know matter how small.

We cannot see God's work happening, but that is not to say it isn't happening. With our readings today, we can see God's hand at work, often in small and transforming ways, it is a reminder to us that we too can work in small but transforming ways for the kingdom of God and that they are of the greatest value, Amen.
