## 16/038 Welcome and apologies for absence

Cllr Fulcher welcomed everyone, item 16/043 Local Plan, this subject has challenged both the Parish Council and Parishioner's, a lot of concern resulted with the Chairman and two councilors resigning. This was also caused by misunderstanding and unofficial information and rumors being circulated, but we now need to try and move forward. On behalf of the Parish Council special thanks to Mike Crome for all his work for the village over many years and the last 5 or more as Chairman, Chris Leigh for all her work as a Councillor over many years with particular reference to her work as Chair of Coe's Meadow Committee and organiser and instigator of the Fun Day and to Cathey Ponty for her work as a councillor over the last 5 years. They will all be greatly missed.

To also draw your attention to the fact that a comment regarding the Extraordinary meeting was made by someone who did not attend that meeting, but suggested that procedures were not followed correctly regarding Suspension of Standing orders, this was in fact offered, as shown in the minutes only 4 members of the public wished to speak so it was not necessary to suspend Standing Orders. It is hoped that if the person involved who made this comment, to the public will ensure that it is corrected accordingly.

## 16/040 Public Participation session

Four members of the public wished to speak.

Question 1. Is it the intention of the Parish Council to give details of the Local Plan 2033 sites, and its response to Braintree District Council to all residents before the Parrish Council Annual Assembly Meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> April? Whilst I acknowledge that some development is probably inevitable, the Parish Council appear to have already conceded that three sites outside of the village envelope could be developed. Will it explain to residents the reasons for this decision so early in the consultation process? To date, the Parish Council has failed to ensure that all residents who could be affected by these proposals and their significance for the village have been aware of them. I do not think it unreasonable that residents should be given sufficient details before the Annual Assembly, so that the Parish Council can get an accurate view of their opinions. It is important that residents, many of whom do not have access to the internet, understand the process, the timescales, and how they can take part in any subsequent consultation. As the proposals for Bulmer will be considered by the Braintree Local Plan Group on 13<sup>th</sup> April, how will it make Braintree councillors aware of the opinions of residents, given the short timescale between the two meetings?

Chairman advised that this would be covered under item 16/043 and that DCIIr Scattergood would respond to this later in the meeting.

Question 2. As an Election is scheduled to take place on 5<sup>th</sup> May and as there are only 4 councillors would the Parish Council defer from making any large financial decisions. Telephone box in Park Lane, still owned and maintained by BT will give Clerk details.

# District Councillor Wendy Scattergood attended the meeting and made the following statement

I fully understand that there has been much confusion over the process of responding to the submitted sites in Bulmer for the new Local Plan.

I would like to explain why the urgency to produce a NEW Plan - the process - the time table - and how all residents in addition to the Parish Council can get involved.

The 2005 Plan is now out of date. Braintree District Councillors of which I am one commenced work on the next plan following introduction of the 2005 plan this work was completed in 2014 the plan was approved by Council to submit it to the inspectorate when the Government advised all local authorities that the housing numbers had to be increased. We then had to start again and in 2015 had to call for additional sites. Over 300 sites were submitted we have to consider the suitability of each and every one of them which has taken several months

What is the urgency why was such short notice given to the Parish Council. The reason is it is essential that BDC produces a new plan as soon as possible because without a up to date plan any land owner or developer can apply for planning permission on any sites submitted right now.

The National Planning Framework states that we must give regard to presumption in favour of development. Our hands are tied we cannot refuse the applications. If the Council fails to determine an application the applicant can appeal to the Secretary of State on grounds of non- determination whilst there is no new Local Plan in place. You will probably recall that we had to grant permission for over 100 homes at Oak Road Halstead.

We have to build 845 homes per year for the plan period 2016- 2033. That total is 14,365 but one crumb of comfort is that we have had sites submitted sufficient for 55,000 homes which is way in excess of the requirement.

The second crumb of comfort is that at the Local Plan sub Committee on 14th March We agreed and voted that overall Braintree and Witham are sustainable locations for new growth. Halstead and the A12 corridor could accommodate some new growth

We concluded that the spatial hierarchy of the District should be

Towns. Braintree Witham Halstead

Service Villages. Sible Hedingham Hatfield Peverel Coggeshall Earls Colne Kelvedon with Feering

Villages. All other settlements in the District enclosed by a development boundary.

Countryside. All areas of the District outside a development boundary

What this means is the we will concentrate development in Braintree Witham and the A12 corridor.

The District North of Halstead is rural with small settlements of which Bulmer is one. Due to the more limited public transport connections, services and facilities and rural setting we do not consider it an appropriate place for major new development although more minor development might be acceptable in larger or well-connected villages.

Whilst I appreciate there will be a difference of opinion between residents of Bulmer as to whether or not some new homes would be acceptable. Minor development is the more likely outcome

How you can have your say.

The sites that have been submitted for Bulmer will be discussed and voted on at the Meeting on the 13th April. The agenda will be published on 5th April Prior to that meeting officers will have considered the Parish Councils comments and they will make recommendations to the committee to either approve or refuse each site. I know that you have your annual public meeting on the 12th I have discussed this with Emma Goodings the planning policy officer she assures me that if the results of the meeting are sent to her as early as possible on the 13th she will let the committee members have sight of the comments prior to the start of the meeting

A Parish Council Representative can attend the meeting and speak. Members of the public can also attend if any member of the public wishes to speak they must register in advance at BDC The number of speakers allowed on each item is at the discretion of the Chairman.

When the draft plan is published in June for consultation any individual can submit either their objections or support for a site, objections would need to be on planning grounds for example flooding, drainage, parking road safety.

Many residents have raised concerns over the lack of affordable housing for local people. Allowing development in the village is not the only way forward to achieve low cost homes in fact small developments do not produce many such homes. There is a way affordable housing can be achieved it is by building on exception sites. These sites are sites that join the village envelope and are built by housing associations this scheme can only be achieved if land owners are willing to put sites forward. An excellent example of this is in Gestingthorpe in Sudbury Road. The advantage of such a scheme is that the homes are only for people that have a connection with the village.

Finally I would like to apologise that the whole process has appeared rushed by BDC but as I explained earlier we are on a tight schedule with urgency to prevent development on unplanned sites. I hope that I can work with the Parish Council to assist in getting the important dates advertised. If any member of the public wants additional advice please contact me.
