Minutes of a Meeting of Bulmer Parish Council held at 7.15pm on Monday 20th November 2023 at Bulmer Village Hall

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the extra ordinary meeting of 3rd October 2023 were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman

5. PROGRESS CHECK

5.1 Defibrillators: The 4 Bulmer defibrillators are now installed at 1. Kitchen Hill, 2. By Bulmer Street noticeboard, 3. The Fox at Bulmer Tye and 4. Church Road by post box. These will shortly be registered with the Community Heartbeat Webnos system which shows the ambulance service the nearest defibrillators which are "rescue ready" so residents can be directed to use them during a 999 call. The code to access each defibrillator will be displayed on the outside of the cabinet, this is recommended as a measure to ensure no lives are lost due to lack of access. Incidents of theft or vandalism of defibrillators are a very low risk but the defibrillators will be checked and monitored at least monthly and the policy reviewed if problems occur.

6. HIGHWAYS & PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

- **6.1 Local Highways Panel (LHP):** A LHP application for improvement of pedestrian & playground signage at Coes Meadow entrance in Bulmer Street has been submitted.
- **6.2 A131 Footpath Bulmer Tye**: Cllr Schwier, ECC and Cllr Holland BDC had supported the Parish Council in raising this issue with Cllr Tom Cunningham, BDC Cabinet member for Highways. Although the verge has been cut, the side growth of invasive weeds in the footpath is still making it dangerous and inaccessible for pedestrians. This was raised again with Cllr Schwier when he reported after item 12. Points to note are:
 - Lack of a spring verge cut causes invasive weeds/grasses to spread horizontally and self-seeding in footpath cracks. The autumn verge cut is done with a tractor mounted side flail which does not tackle this low growth
 - Essex Highway Rangers used to deal with the lower growth on footpaths (this is called "siding") by selective spraying or clearing. Highway Rangers were disbanded in April 2023 so this is a service which since this year is no longer provided. Use of weedkillers has been reduced generally by BDC and ECC



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- Parish Council responses will be sought for the planned BDC review of the autumn only verge cutting trial during the second half of 2024/25.
- Reporting problems: All residents are encouraged to use the https://www.essexhighways.org/tell-us
 reporting tool. Using What3words https://what3words.com/ in photo mode allows a photo to be uploaded with the exact location, which enables Highways inspectors to identify the site and the problem more accurately. This saves time and avoids errors which delay remedial action being taken.

Action: Photos and other evidence to be sent to Cllr Schwier to enable him to raise this again with Highways

7. REPORTS

- **7.1** Police/PCSO/Neighbourhood Watch Changes to Neighbourhood Watch activity in the village were noted. **Action**: Clerk to add Braintree District weekly Neighbourhood Watch newsletters to the Bulmer website.
- 7.2 Essex CC report Cllr Schwier arrived and reported between items 12 & 13. He then left the meeting.
 - **ECC updates**: These are emailed regularly to the clerk. Those relevant to Bulmer residents are now shared on the new Latest Posts section on the Parish Council website https://e-voice.org.uk/bulmerpc/. Bulmer residents are encouraged to request membership of the website and opt in for weekly email updates on new content that has been added.
 - Essex Primary School applications: these are now open until 15th January, details available at https://www.essex.gov.uk/schools-and-learning/schools/admissions/primary-school-places
 - Highways: Drain jetting crews have been working ad hoc to clear drains following heavy rain
 - **Sandbags**: These are not supplied by ECC, householders needing a supply should contact the Environment Agency. ECC provides funding help for residents with flooding concerns, call Essex County Council general enquiries on 0345 743 0430 Monday to Friday, 8:30am to 5:00pm or use the general enquiries online form at https://www.essex.gov.uk/general-enquiries
 - Winter operations: pothole repair work is not effective when carried out in freezing conditions. Crews are redeployed on winter gritting and there are now 50 gritters, with 2 smaller electric ones for accessing narrower rural roads. 40% of highways are covered each night, spreading around 21,000 tonnes of grit. Last year the gritters were deployed on 70 nights.
 - Police, Fire & Crime: The commissioner has a current consultation on increasing the budget, see .

 - **ECC Consultations:** Draft Waste Partnership consultation ends on 22nd November, and the Vehicle Booking for recycling centres consultation ended on 19th November In answer to a question from Cllr Raymond, Cllr Schwier gave feedback on progress with requesting clearance of the A131 footpath (see item 6.2)
- **7.3** Braintree DC report Cllr Holland apologised for absence due to a conflicting meeting and sent a written update:
 - **Budget**: BDC is currently amid the budget setting process and a key stage is reached this week when the Budget is the main subject of the Corporate Scrutiny Committee on which I sit. So, if there is a matter relating to this that you want to raise, one option is to drop me a line so that I can feed it into the process.
 - Verge cutting: I continue to make the case for verge cutting appropriate to ensuring the safety of our community members.
 - Planning: The Kitchen Hill planning application comes before the Planning Committee on Tuesday 28th
 November. If there are matters that you feel you have yet to raise with respect to this application, you can
 of course still feed them into the decision-making process by registering to speak and attending the meeting
 - Planning Policy: new policy documents that have the potential to impact our lovely rural area are being developed or adopted. Biodiversity net gain is a recent one with energy and infrastructure. Supplementary Planning Documents yet to come. We should also be aware that special area status with respect to improving the natural environment is being worked up. I feel that we must understand this because it could be highly beneficial to us. This matter is being driven by the County Council with the support of BDC



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• **Meetings**: My intention is to attend the entirety of Parish Council meetings such that I am aware of all of the issues that concern you. 8.1 Allotments report: Mr Mike Crome, Allotments Officer apologised for absence and sent a written report. Water extension stand pipe not yet installed. No further work carried by UKPNW on installing base for transformer. **Action**: Clerk to contact both contractors for an update
