Hugh's uncle, Apsley Cherry-Garrard, wrote a classic account of Antarctic exploration titled "The Worst Journey in the World", which told the whole story of Captain Scott's final and fatal "Terra Nova" expedition.

However, the book's title particularly referred to a journey that "Cherry" took, along with two companions who later died on their return from the South Pole. This was the 'Winter Journey' - taken in darkness and extreme cold, to collect Emperor penguins' eggs from Cape Crozier.
