

Introduction

After three successful training events last season (with many children taking – many passing with distinction – Institute of Chess exams), and the fine performance of Berkshire Junior Chess squads at last season's inter-county tournaments, BJCA is pleased to offer a schedule of three Saturday morning junior chess training events for the year 2015/16. The training events will precede an SAE taking place at the same venue.
