SECTIONS

Beginners' Section

Berkshire players may enter if their Berkshire grade is under 600 on 30th September 2017. Non-Berkshire players may enter by special permission, if they consider themselves "beginners". This section is for inexperienced chess players and is suitable for those who have had limited tournament experience. Players may not have won any tournament. There will be up to 9 rounds with 20 minutes for each player. Berkshire players' games will be graded in the Berkshire Junior Chess Grading List.

Open Under 10 and Under 12 Sections

To qualify for the London Junior Championships, players must score 3½ points to compete in the Minor, and 4½ to compete in the Major. An U/8 player can qualify for the London U/8 by scoring 3½ points in the U/10 section. There will be 6 rounds and 30 minutes for each player. Games will be graded in the ECF Rapid Play List.

Open Under 14 and Under 18 Sections

There will be 5 rounds and 40 minutes for each player. Games will be graded in the ECF Rapid Play List.

Pairings: The basic principles of the Swiss system will be used for all pairings.
