Wine Discovery

Baythorne Wines is a local independent wine merchant and the product of a local farming family diversifying into fresh areas – they have transformed some of their farm buildings between Halstead and Haverhill into a cookery school, function space and wine shop. We welcomed George from Baythorne to present a range of seven interesting Italian wines to us in January.

These are three of them which really struck me as lovely wines as well as good value - they were all available to us at a discount on the night, for just under £10.



Ribola Gailla, Fantinel - this sparkling wine, from a good Prosecco producer, is a more yeasty, toasty version than usual which everyone liked. Apparently, some 75% of exported Prosecco comes to the UK!

2012 Salice Salentino Riserva, Casato di Melzi - this red wine is from Puglia in the south of Italy and has been aged in oak barrels for 24 months. It was brick red, indicating its age and was smooth and rich with soft tannins.





2016 Passimiento, Baglio Gibellina -Sicily is producing some new and exciting wines now and this Passimiento contains some of the Nero d'Avola grape variety which is big in Sicily. It was rich and concentrated, ideal with game.

<u>ECC Aldridge</u> – Issues about Countryside putting in a footpath along Chignal Road as there is no access from Little Hollows to Copperfield Road by car. The footpath needs to go in at 95% dwelling occupation. Lighting along the access road to Hollow Lane will be out of keeping. Road resurfacing in Chignal and Mashbury discussed but no immediate prospect. Essex Lottery is open and trying to raise money for good causes within Essex. Essex looking to reduce budgets by £120mil. London has per capita £583 to Essex per capita £193.

CCC Chambers – proposed Business Improvement District (BID) to support retailers. Approximately 465 retailers in the city. A ballot due in February 2018. Community Orchard - three ways to help the trees

We have all noticed that the Community Orchard did not fare as well last season as it had the year before and the lack of fruit was disappointing. The ever-vigilant Orchard Committee have identified several factors affecting the trees and have leapt into action with three ways to tackle the problems.

The first is water - or lack of it. Our bit of Essex saw over a year of near drought from mid 2016 to late summer 2017. Visitors to the orchard will see that the mulch mats which are actually quite water resistant have been taken up and the soil around each tree loosened. When the tree roots have absorbed as much rain as this winter brings us we will put down a loose mulch which will make irrigation easier if we get another drought.

The second problem is pests and there are two main culprits. Little birds, which we love to see most of the time, spend late winter and early spring pecking off the highly nutritious buds on the trees. The result is bare branches and no fruit. From late February onwards you will see a variety of flapping, rattling and tinkling bird scarers among the trees. To be successful the element of surprise must be maintained so we will keep moving them around. If you are in the orchard please move them or swap them over to keep the birds guessing.

The other pest is aphid - blackfly and greenfly on the young shoot tips. We will be squishing them as we spot them. If you have work gloves with you please do join in.

The third activity has already happened. We don't know if Wassailing the trees has any impact but it can't do any harm so in January we held a terrific Wassail Night with the help of Good Easter Molly Gang and local residents. The trees were woken up, sung and danced to and wished 'Good Luck'.

Let's hope that all of these things together bring us good results.

If you want faster broadband in the parish you need to take action.

At present only 28% of households in the parish have registered to show an interest to receive an improved fibre broadband service with Superfast Essex.

It Only takes 2 minutes to register on the Superfast Essex website, go to register your interest or use the link below

https://forms.essex.gov.uk/default.aspx/RenderForm/?F.Name=gzooof7waFK&HideAll=1 *If you run a business from home you can register it in addition to your domestic show of interest.*

After the failure to deliver fibre to each house in July 2017 the Parish Council have been pressurising Essex County Council and BT Openreach to install the planned fibre upgrade but at present we still have no firm date apart from the delivery being by Dec 2019.

Registering your interest with the providers does not commit you to a subscription but is used by Essex County Council to identify demand in an area before they commit to releasing funds and the priority for delivering additional infrastructure to provide a better service to the remaining 5% of essex households without fast broadband.

It is in your interest whether you currently use the internet a lot or not to register. With everything from passport applications to tax returns, school home study and TV streaming being driven online it is in every

household's interest to ensure their house is future proofed. Broadband speeds are also now an important element of maintaining a property's value.

As a possible alternative to waiting for BT/Openreach we have been in contact with FibreWifi Ltd which some households already use. They have told us they are willing to invest in additional masts to give coverage across the Parish, subject to the government grant being available for households with very poor broadband and sufficient houses in the Parish being interested. The Parish Council will continue to pursue this avenue and are currently checking to see if grants are available for properties in the Chignals.

Please register an interest it will not only help yourself but all residents in the parish. The more registrations we can achieve the quicker an upgraded will be delivered
