## Superfast Broadband is available in the Chignals

You may have seen BT Openreach engineers in the villages over recent months installing new fibre optic cables on the poles. The good news is that after a lot of chasing by Councillors Chris Anstey and Steve Middleditch Essex County Council and BT Openreach have delivered the fibre service ahead of their published schedule of December 2019.

At present Chignal St James and parts of Chignal Smealey are active at the exchange, the parts of the parish that are not connected at present are due to be upgraded soon.

As the Superfast Essex interactive map is only updated once every three months your property may still be showing the 2019 date instead of showing that your property can be connected to the fibre cables now.

A few residents have upgraded their contracts already and have had the fibre cables extended to their houses by BT and a new router installed. They are reporting a vast improvement to their previous internet connection.

If you wish to see if your property can be connected and upgrade your account you can contact BT to check prices and take out a new contract. Alternatively you can speak to your existing supplier to check if they are able to upgrade your property to fibre on the new cables.

#### 5. <u>County and City Councillors' Reports</u>

- **a.** Essex County Councillor Report Concerns on the proposed redesign of the junction with Hollow Lane and delays in constructing the foot/cycle path connecting to Copperfield Road..
- b. **Chelmsford City Councillor Report -**.Gov e-mail possible: Loughton Town Council use this email address. Purchase of Community Orchard site by the Parish Council refused. The 1 acre site was previously used for hay making and now houses air monitoring equipment which requires a 20m space around it and no overgrowth by trees. Persimmon Homes has been served with a Temporary Stop order for 28 days. Enforcement team investigating next steps if Persimmon fails to address the concerns raised.
- 6. <u>To note the Orchard Sub Committee minutes of the meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> July</u> Fruit Celebration event planned on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> October at 3pm. Orchard fruit will be a bit limited due to the hot weather and aphid damage. *Resolution:* Noted

#### 8. <u>Planning Applications :</u>

 Re-use and conversion of existing buildings on site to a residential dwelling. Planning Application Barn South Hillcroft Chignal Road Chignal Smealy Chelmsford Essex Ref. No: 18/00882/FUL

The Structural Engineer's report on this building seems to indicate that it needs demolition and rebuilding to comply with current building regulations for insulation, ventilation, and daylight openings. It comments that the roof, external boarding, the timber stud walls and the unreinforced concrete floor slab need substantial repair or replacement so there would not be a lot left of the original structure.

There are also no services to the plot so Electricity, Water and drainage would have to be installed. The photographs show rotten timbers, cracked concrete floor slab and years of decay in the structure.

In the Chignal Villages Design Statement, (page 18) reference is made to "the trees and hedges in and around the good sized housing plots in the Woodhall area of Chignal Smealey helping to maintain the rural feel and the gaps between the properties emphasise the rural location by showing that there are no buildings behind".

The need for any additional housing in this part of Chignal is being met more than adequately by the new residential development in the parish north of Copperfield Road.

The Parish Council also has concerns regarding access to this site as it has limited sight-lines on a blind bend, on to the Chignal Road. The Parish Council made similar comments in relation to a previous planning application for a house on this site (14/01320/OUT).

#### Resolution: the application be refused.

E) <u>Community Safety</u> West Chelmsford is still 2<sup>nd</sup> safest place in Chelmsford. Defibrillator still requires a grant to fund it: likely through Chignal Community Group. Fibre Broadband may arrive later this month!
 F) <u>Highways (to include Hedges)</u> Concerns with ditches and lorries driving over the ditch edges. The ditches should or can be piped.

G) Footpaths/Bridleways Community Group planning local walks in liaison with Parish Council.
