The Council is in the process of consulting with the community on the four draft planning documents which will drive development within the borough to 2021 and support the objectives of the Council's planning framework.

The consultation period ceases on Wednesday 1st December. The Site Allocations Development Plan Document allocates land for a range of uses including housing, community facilities and transport infrastructure. The Government's Planning Inspector will review this document in the light of your comments early next year. The document covers the whole of the borough except for the Town Centre and north of the Borough which have specific action plans.

Essex County Council

Now that the clocks have gone we back, we can expect darker evenings and colder weather. Bearing in mind the severity of last winter we should be prepared to deal with ice, snow, rain and low sun which are all particularly hazardous. With last years extremes of weather the demand for salt was high and if the weather this winter is again extreme, the County Council is anticipating that the Government's rationing of supplies will be reinstated.

Salt bins are perceived by many as an important part of the local resilience in icy conditions but their use is unregulated and reliant on the goodwill of the people living nearby to spread the salt in times of need. To help meet demand the County Council has introduced a new scheme "The Salt Bag Pilot" which will supply a one ton bag of salt and sand mix to parishes, on request, which will enable them to decide how and where the salt is distributed. For every parish that participates in the Pilot it will be guaranteed one salt bag refill over the winter season.

The ECC Funding Team, which seeks to optimise the amount of external funding coming into the County, has secured a total of £8.5 million through Government and European funding streams, with the most recent win being a £371,000 investment, to create additional apprenticeship places for female engineers in Essex. With the future prosperity of the County relying on skills development and support for business innovation and entrepreneurialism, the Council is keen to ensure it continues to secure a significant share of the multi million pot of funding available. This will be one way to provide training in valuable skills and subsequent full employment for young people in Essex.

November saw the launch of County Council's Retail Enterprise Fund - an initiative designed to support the rural services which make our small towns and villages such thriving, vibrant communities.

Grants of up to £5,000 will be available to owners of shops, post offices and pubs in rural areas, who wish to modernise or diversify their offering; in order to strengthen their businesses. Grants will also be available to community groups who wish to set up any of these services in their locality. The Fund is principally aimed at businesses which are finding it hard to access finance from more traditional sources.

The Fund was set up following recommendations made by last year's Essex Rural Commission report which outlined the need to strengthen Essex's rural economies by creating additional employment opportunities; giving residents access to essential services locally as well as ensuring the longevity of key community hubs. UNCONFIRMED REPORT OF THE MEETING OF CHIGNAL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 1st NOVEMBER 2010 IN THE VILLAGE HALL

Mrs. Joy Darby the Chief Executive of the Essex Association of Local Councils presented an award to the Village Design Statement Committee and she added her congratulations for its achievement.

The Chairman and Councillors were thanked by the P.C.C. for arranging for the work to be carried out to the highway outside the church in Chignal Smealey.

SUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

VILLAGE HALL LIAISON – the Committee has agreed that it is not a feasible option to have a Broadband connection in the Village Hall.

NEWSLETTER INCL. WEBSITE – deadlines dates for receiving items for the Newsletter have been agreed as 31st January 2011, 31st March, 31st July, 30th September and 20th November.

GRAVEL LIAISON – the latest meeting was held on 13th October 2010 when it was explained that the Cemex Plant is currently under demolition/removal and the work will be completed before the end of December. Once completed, the site will be assessed by Lafarge and a submission of details for restoration made to the Planning Department. Lafarge will install 17 additional gas wells within the infill site which will help to reduce gas seepage. The new wells will be installed before the end of December. An extension to the current completion date of 2012 for infilling is possible because of the shortage of waste delivery.

VILLAGE WATCH – no volunteer has come forward to take on the role of co-ordinator but it was agreed to invite Tony Wilkins, the present co-ordinator, to the next Parish meeting to thank him for all the work he has done in the past.

HIGHWAYS – the Chairman thanked Gordon Lee for all his work in ensuring that the Highways Department carried out the resurfacing work to roads throughout the Parish. It was reported that a chevron has been damaged near Ivy Cottage and a pedestrian sign has disappeared between the Village Hall and Chignal Hall Lane.

FOOTPATHS /BRIDLEWAYS – New signposts – some sites have been agreed but notification on the siting of others is still outstanding.

PLANNING

The Bungalow – demolition and erection of new dwelling – the appeal was dismissed. Broomwood Manor – retrospective application to alter roof on single storey element – approved Broomwood Manor – single storey rear extension – approved.

NOTICE BOARDS – It was agreed to purchase four new notice boards before the end of the financial year. The relocation of one board from the Three Elms to the Green, adjacent to the telephone kiosk, was agreed.
