# **Chignal Parish Council**

REPORT OF THE MEETING OF CHIGNAL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 9th MARCH 2009 IN THE VILLAGE HALL

PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

a) The Clerk was requested to write to the Highways Department to thank its representative for the quick and efficient way that remedial works to a damaged drain together with resurfacing works at the corner of the Green were carried out.

b) Concern was expressed at the flooding which has occurred at Langley's Corner because of water coming off the fields causing the pond to overflow. The problems will be reported to the Highways Department. c) It was reported that vandalism has occurred to equipment in a field in Chignal St. James on three separate occasions and has been reported to the police who are undertaking house to house enquiries. d) Parishioners were asked if they would like to enter the Best Kept Village or Best Kept Churchyard Competitions which will be advertised on the Village Hall notice board.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – the Chairman asked for a volunteer to take his place at the next Neighbourhood Action Panel meeting on 23<sup>rd</sup> April as he is unable to attend.

#### SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

VILLAGE HALL – a grant has been obtained from ECC to carry out works to the car park and other sources of funding are being pursued to complete the project. NEWSLETTER incl. Website – Complaints have been received because of the late delivery of the January issue and it was confirmed that additional help is available if needed.

GRAVEL LIAISON –the latest liaison meeting confirmed that the importation of materials from Writtle has ceased. The access road to Pengymill Lane has been improved and a blocked ditch excavated to improve the flow of water. Lafarge has confirmed that Pengymill Lane will be resurfaced and repair work carried out to unblock the culvert.

HIGHWAYS – Cllr. Aldridge was thanked for his support in arranging a programme of works to carry out repairs to roads throughout the Parish. Repair work has been carried out to the damaged drain at the corner of the Green and problems with flooding at Beadles Hall Corner have been resolved and the culvert cleared.

VDS – the latest draft will be submitted to the Borough Council shortly. The AGM will be held in the Village Hall at 8 p.m. on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April 2009.

COUNTY AND BOROUGH COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Cllr. Chambers next surgery will be held in the Village Hall on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> April 2009 between 11 a.m. and 12 noon.

#### **PLANNING**

Gravel extraction and formation of a reservoir opposite the Village Hall – the Planning Officer has advised that she hopes the application will be submitted to Committee on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2009.

Blue House Cottage – extensions – the application has been approved

The Old Rectory – extensions – approval has been given.

Brittons Hall Farm Buildings – raising of barn roof – the application has been approved.

Importation of sand for the manufacture of ready made concrete – a request is to be made that this application be submitted to 'full Committee'

Hawthorn Cottage – extensions – the amended drawings will be examined and observation forwarded to the Borough Council.

Parishioners were reminded of the VILLAGE CLEAN-UP DAY to be held on Saturday 21st March 2009 commencing at 9 a.m. with starting points at the Village Hall and Woodhall Farm.

Report of the Chignal Annual Parish Meeting held on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2009 in the Village Hall The meeting was well attended by Parish Councillors, a County Councillor, Borough Councillor and 27 parishioners and was chaired by Mr. Chris Philpot.

MINUTES - The minutes of the meeting of 10th March 2008 were read, agreed and signed. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - The Chairman thanked everyone for attending the meeting and also thanked his fellow Councillors and the Clerk for their continuing support. He also thanked the two local councillors John Aldridge and Nicolette Chambers for their help and guidance and the police for their presence at the majority of Parish Council meetings. Myra Wilkins had been nominated earlier in the year

to attend the Mayor's Annual Presentation, an honour which was greatly deserved.

The Chairman highlighted the two most important projects for the Parish in the last twelve months:

- a) The progress made with the VDS which had resulted in many hours of work and discussions with the Borough Council which it is hoped will result in a satisfactory completion in the near future.
- b) Improvements to the village hall which have greatly enhanced the inside appearance of the hall with the next project already planned to improve the car park.

**CLUB REPORTS -**

CHIGNAL & MASHBURY GARDENING CLUB – it was reported that the Club is alive and well, membership has increased and meetings well attended. Talks have been given on a variety of subjects and summer visits have been most enjoyable. New members are always welcome and future events are displayed on the Parish notice boards.

BOWLS CLUB – the Club was founded 20 years ago last year and the event was celebrated with a competition and supper including a special photo cake of all the members. There have also been other enjoyable social events including a pudding evening and club supper at the Three Elms. Ten friendly matches were played and members also entered external competitions, with good results.

WOMENS INSTITUTE – Myra Wilkins, the President, reported on another interesting and successful year. There has been a good variety of speakers and many members helped with the Village Fete. The Art Group continues to thrive and meets on the fourth Thursday each month and is open to everyone not just W.I. members.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH – Tony Wilkins, the area co-ordinator, thanked the local volunteers for regularly distributing the yellow bulletins throughout the year. He warned parishioners to be vigilant of anyone acting suspiciously.

CRICKET CLUB – There were mixed results for the two teams last season and this year the Club has joined the Warsop Stebbing Sunday League and will also play some friendly games and 20/20 evening matches. WINE DISCOVERY GROUP – The Group meets on the second Friday of each month (except August) at 8 p.m. in the Village Hall and membership continues to rise. A few 'special' evenings are planned for the coming year and anyone interested in joining should contact Norman Smith or Dave Thomas.

ST. NICHOLAS CHURCH – Weekly services are held every Sunday with a small regular congregation but the Christmas, Easter services and the Harvest Festival are well attended. The churchyard is well maintained and the ladies of the parish were thanked for cleaning the Church. Thanks was also given to St. Mary's Church at Broomfield for its continuing support.

CHIGNAL CHAPEL The Chapel continues to hold weekly Sunday services as well as special services for Easter, Christmas and Harvest. There is a small Sunday School and coffee mornings are held on the third Wednesday each month from 10.30 – 12 noon. Recently, the Women's World Day of Prayer was held at the Chapel when churches joined together to celebrate the event.

VILLAGE HALL – The biggest event of the year was the Official Opening of the extensions by the then Mayor of Chelmsford, Councillor Nicolette Chambers when over 100 residents attended.

Other improvements included new windows, curtains and a new patio area. A grant has just been received from ECC towards the cost of re-laying the car park, the next area for improvement. The Village Fete will be held on 6<sup>th</sup> June at Woodhall Farm.

VDS – Work started on the VDS in 2005 and approval from the Borough Council has still not been finalised in spite of many meetings and discussions. Good progress is being made and it hoped another version will be forwarded to the Borough shortly, to finalise the general layout. The AGM will be held on 20<sup>th</sup> April and members of the Committee were thanked for all their work and commitment in spite of the many changes which have been necessary.
