From the County Council

The Chancellor of the Exchequer will present the Comprehensive Spending Review to Parliament on 20th October this year. The results of this long awaited announcement will dictate how close the County Council is to making the very significant savings that will almost certainly be required to meet the current and future financial pressures and budget cuts. The County Council's progress to meet this need is covered by the EssexWorks Transformation Programme; which is reviewing all the County Council's services and facilities; looking at where they are now and where they may required in the future so that the best services can be maintained for the best value where they are needed most.

The **Programme** has, over the past few years, made good progress in reducing costs and providing better value for money; and whilst it is ahead of the game at the moment, there is little doubt that greater effort will be needed in the next few years. Currently the **Programme** is on track to reach its target of £89 million of savings by 2010/11 against its longer term target of at least £300 million by 2012/13.

As part of this challenge for better ways of working, Kent County Council and Essex County Council have submitted a joint proposal to Government Ministers for approval to create a Local Enterprise Partnership; which will promote economic growth, attract investment and create jobs. It will cover those areas that matter most to residents and businesses both sides of the Thames; such as trade skills, housing, tourism, transport and infrastructure. The joint proposal, which has my full support, will, if approved, be fully implemented by April 2011. For further information visit nds.coi.gov.uk

And finally, on a more optimistic note, I am pleased that the **Communities Initiatives Fund** continues this year. The latest round of bids to for our area closes on 29th October with decisions on funding being made in February 2011. For an application form and guidance notes go to the website

UNCONFIRMED REPORT OF THE MEETING OF CHIGNAL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 13th SEPTEMBER 2010 IN THE VILLAGE HALL

Gary Disley from Buzcom explained to the meeting how an internet service can be made available to the residents of Chignal who are unable to receive Broadband at the present time. It was confirmed that the telephone box in Chignal St. James is now the property of Chignal Parish Council. A circular has been distributed to local residents requesting a list of volunteers to keep the kiosk clean and also for ideas on its use.

County Councillor Aldridge explained that the County Council is looking at costs and in order to save money, has signed an economic partnership with Kent which includes, as encouraged by Central Government, using the same suppliers.

Cllr. Aldridge reported that the Chief Constable needs to achieve a large saving between 2010 and 2012 which will have an impact on policing throughout the County.

Councillor Chambers explained that the Census will take place on 24th March 2011 and volunteers will be required for various positions to help complete the Census.

Grants up to £10,000 are still available to Parishes but the closing date for applications is 21st October.

SUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

VILLAGE HALL LIAISON – Representatives were asked to contact the Committee to ask about the possibility of having a Broadband connection in the Village Hall.

NEWSLETTER INCL. WEBSITE – A list of deadlines for the Newsletter will be included in the next edition and the editor requested that all Clubs update their information particularly if there have been changes to personnel.

GRAVEL LIAISON – The next meeting will be held on 13th October 2010. The removal of the Cemex plant will be completed by the end of September. Progress with land raising has a completion date for final restoration for the end of 2012 but this might be difficult to achieve because of problems with sourcing suitable waste streams. The resurfacing of Pengymill Lane has yet to be completed.

VILLAGE WATCH – The Chairman explained that the co-ordinator, Tony Wilkins, has decided to retire and a volunteer to take on the role is needed. Tony was thanked for the efficient and dedicated way he has carried out his duties for many years and it is hoped a successor can be found

HIGHWAYS – Roads in the Parish are in very good condition following the resurfacing work and it was reported that the damage to the verge near the church, caused by builders lorries will be repaired shortly.

FOOTPATHS /BRIDLEWAYS – There have been no objections to the proposed diversions. . PLANNING

The Bungalow – demolition and erection of new dwelling – a decision is awaited.

Pieces Cottage – appeal against enforcement notice re marquee, gates and posts – the appeal was dismissed.

Westleas – single storey rear extension – the application was approved.

Hunters End – two storey side extension – the application was approved.

Broomwood Manor – retrospective application to alter roof on single storey element – pending Broomwood Manor – single storey rear extension - pending

STANSTED AIRPORT – it was agreed that no action be taken on a request to contact the Minister of State for Transport.
