I was very proud to be re-elected as the County Council member for Broomfield & Writtle but following the election in June it is back to business as usual. I have retained the Chairmanship of the Economic Development and Environment Policy / Scrutiny Committee and have been appointed a member of the Essex Police Authority. I have listed my other official roles on the County Council website (<u>http://www.essexinfo.net/johnaldridge/</u>).

Many of you will have noticed that a temporary 40 mph speed limit has been imposed on the Chelmer Valley Road and A130 Essex Regiment Way for one year. This is the prelude to the creation of a second **Park & Ride** facility and will enable the construction of fast track bus lane to get people into the centre of Chelmsford. It is hoped that if the new Park & Ride proves as successful as that built at Sandon, it will improve travelling times into Chelmsford from the north east of the County and make another significant improvement to relieving congestion in the Chelmer Valley.

The **Essex Rural Commission**, instigated by the County Council in 2008, will be producing its long awaited report this month. It has been tasked with considering how to improve the quality of life in rural Essex. Its recommendations will be given close scrutiny by the County Council to see where it can use the Commission's findings to inform the future **Essex Rural Strategy**. This whole process will enable our rural environment to be protected and sustained not only against challenges that are facing our communities now but those that will face us over the next several decades. Watch this space!

Essex Trading Standards is there to help protect the public and honest businesses from roque traders and illegal practices. It is currently promoting a "Buy With Confidence" scheme to help householders when inviting small businesses and service providers into their homes. Businesses that are vetted by Trading Standards guarantee not to take advantage of householders and their employees are CRB (Criminal Registration Bureau) checked. The scheme has been well received by Essex businesses which recognise that it adds value and encourages trust. It is hoped to get many more businesses to sign up to this initiative. # **Chignal Parish Council Meeting**

UNCONFIRMED REPORT OF THE MEETING OF CHIGNAL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON MONDAY 13<sup>th</sup> JULY 2009 IN THE VILLAGE HALL

PCSO McDonald attended the meeting and explained that two minor incidents had been reported in the Parish recently regarding motor vehicle misuse. Parishioners at the meeting reported nuisance with cars parking late at night in the Village Hall car park and also an attempted break-in at a house near the Three Elms.

PCSO McDonald clarified the public rights of way on bridleways confirming that motor cycles are <u>not</u> allowed on bridleways. PCSO McDonald can be contacted on 01245 400833.

### PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Questions were asked on the current situation with the planning application for the extraction of gravel and formation of a reservoir opposite the Village Hall and it was explained that the application will not be presented to the July Committee.

Concerns were expressed at the amount of ragwort growing in the Parish.

### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman reported that he had attended the VDS public consultation meeting and was very impressed with the presentation. The Chairman thanked the VDS Committee for all its hard work. Thanks were also expressed to all the parishioners who had organized the very successful Village Fete on 6<sup>th</sup> June.

### SUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

PLAYING FIELDS - the grass has been cut regularly and is in very good condition.

VILLAGE HALL LIAISON – it was reported that the lock to the Village Hall notice board has been repaired. Work commenced on the resurfacing of the car park on 13<sup>th</sup> July and is expected to be completed by 17<sup>th</sup> July.

NEWSLETTER INCL. WEBSITE – it was suggested that, to ensure earlier dates for distribution of the Newsletter, definite dates be set to meet targets. GRAVEL LIAISON – the next liaison meeting will now be held on 24<sup>th</sup> July. There is no further information on when the resurfacing to Pengymill Lane and work to the culvert will be carried out.

FOOTPATHS /BRIDLEWAYS – it was reported that the stile near the Orangery on the Green is to be replaced with one of a more acceptable height. Councillors volunteered to walk the footpaths in the Parish and agree on a programme of works with the Parish Paths Partnership to improve footpaths and bridleways.

HIGHWAYS – it was explained that although some potholes have been filled, some, including a large one between Beadles and the Pig and Whistle, are still outstanding. The contact number for reporting highways problems is 0845 603 7622 or by e-mail http://www.essex.gov.uk

VDS – it was reported that the public consultation meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> May was well attended and many constructive comments received. The latest draft will be submitted to the Borough Council on 3<sup>rd</sup> August following a meeting with the Parish Council on 27<sup>th</sup> July.

BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor Chambers reported that the North Chelmsford Area Action Plan is progressing. The Borough Council has launched a new initiative for redundant residents (RISE) to offer support and advice for people facing redundancy and also a website to access trained advisors for people suffering financial hardship on 01245 606454. Councillor Chambers reported that the Citizens Panel is up and running and parishioners are encouraged to make comments throughout the year to the Borough Council.

### PLANNING

Gravel extraction and formation of a reservoir opposite the Village Hall – the application will not be submitted to the July Committee and no further information was available.

Brittons Hall Farm – landfill site – surveys on invertebrates living in the area have been received and a decision should be made within 21 days. The Old Rectory – extensions – the application has been refused.

Blue Cottage – alterations to side extension – pending.

Woodfall Chignal Smealey – first floor extension – drawings are being examined by the Parish Council and observations will be made to the Borough Council at the appropriate time.

The next meeting will be held in the Village Hall at 7.30 p.m. on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2009.
