Green Homes Grant

The Green Homes Grant is a Government backed scheme delivered by Local Authorities to improve the energy efficiency of eligible homes. The grant helps residents to improve the warmth and comfort of their homes whilst reducing energy bills, carbon emissions and levels of fuel poverty.

Local Authorities in Lancashire have successfully secured £12 million of government funding to install energy saving measures which include:

- Solid Wall Insulation
- Air Source Heat Pumps
- Solar Thermal/Solar PV
- Loft Insulation
- Cavity Wall Insulation
- Under Floor Insulation
- Room in Roof Insulation
- Single Glazed Window Upgrades
- External Door Improvements

Please note this scheme does not cover gas boiler replacements.

The grant is up to £10,000 per property and is free for owner-occupiers. Tenants can apply, with their Landlords permission, but the Landlord will be expected to pay a contribution. To be eligible to apply for the grant you must:

- Have a household income of less than £30,000 or be in receipt of a relevant benefit
- Have a property with an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) Rating of D, E, F or G. If you don't have an EPC then a survey can be done as part of the scheme.

Energy Grants

A number of grants are available to owners, private tenants and private landlords.

Grants are available to residents of Ribble Valley. To qualify the home owner / occupier needs to fulfill at least 2 of the following criteria*:

- In receipt of certain benefits
- Have diagnosed chronic health condition
- · Have children under school age
- Are over 65 years of age
- Low income

All grants are subject to criteria /funding changes, and may not fully cover the cost of the intervention.

Boiler repairs, service and replacement

We offer support for those in need of a new boiler, boiler or central heating service and repairs, or those who need first time central heating (including connection to gas where there is a local supply), subject to the above criteria*.

You could get between £100 and £300 tax-free help to pay your heating bills if you were born on or before 5 October 1954. This known as a Winter Fuel Payment https://www.gov.uk/winter-fuel-payment

You could get a £140 discount on your electricity bill through the Warm Home Discount Scheme https://www.gov.uk/the-warm-home-discount-scheme . This scheme is likely to end so we advise you apply now!

Keeping your house warm through the night

- Try to keep the temperature above 18°C in your bedroom overnight
- Open a window a little at night for ventilation if you use a fire or heater in your bedroom
- Never use a hot water bottle and electric blanket together
- Check what type of electric blanket you have some are designed only to warm the bed before you get in and should not be used throughout the night
- Make sure your electric blanket is safe to use by getting it tested by the Fire Brigade, Trading Standards or Age UK every three years
