R.V.B.C and LCC have been informed. notified of the intense problems occurring in the Village.

Authorities have been out to clear drains at this time.

Councillors discussed Road safety in the Village, pedestrian footpaths, parking and speeding issues. It was noted that the PCSO for this area has been to the village issuing Parking Tickets

Councillors have agreed to hire a SPID machine to be placed on an existing pole with a plate in the village. Data to be collected and analysed by the Police.

The possibility of a PCSO with a speed gun coming to the Village.

The option of CCTV in the Village was also discussed.

Boundary Constituency changes are to take place in this constituency. Nigel Evans M.P. has proposed to stand again to represent us.
