PROJECT UPDATE

During recent months, work to develop a design that meets our clinical brief (requirements) and is deliverable within the available funds has been ongoing in partnership with the Principal Supply Chain Partner (PSCP), design team, the NHS Grampian Project Team and clinical colleagues. This work took longer than originally planned due to a number of challenges, common with large complex developments, especially on a busy acute hospital campus. This work is now complete, however, and as a result the Outline Business Case is currently going through the approval process within NHS Grampian and thereafter the Scottish

Government. We hope approval will be achieved during March 2018 when we will be able to start the detailed design process in earnest.

Assuming approval of the Outline Business Case in March, construction of The Baird Family Hospital and The ANCHOR Centre is scheduled to commence in the spring of 2019. Before that we hope to undertake a series of enabling works, including the demolition of the Breast Screening Centre, Foresterhill Health Centre and the Eye Clinic, road realignment works and service diversions. The services in the buildings to be demolished are all moving to new



accommodation during the first half of this year to allow the sites to be cleared in advance of construction commencement. We plan to cover each of these service moves in articles in this and future editions of our Newsletter.

Over the coming months the focus of the project team, involving clinical staff, managers, Third Sector representatives and public representatives, will be to work with the design team and the PSCP to develop the detailed designs for both buildings and to put together detailed plans

for the construction phase of this major development. In the meantime, I have included below a few artist's impressions of the emerging plans for both buildings to give you a feel for how they will look and their impact on the ever-changing Foresterhill Health Campus.

Work to make sure that we keep our stakeholders (public and staff) up to date with progress continues. A series of about 90 staff and public awareness sessions is now nearing completion with another series being planned for later in 2018.

As reported in the June 2017 edition of this newsletter, construction work is progressing well on the new Foresterhill Health Centre. Construction commenced in December 2016 on this £7.6 million hubCo-funded facility. It is due for completion around March 2018.

Regular meetings are being held with the Construction Site Team in order to enable us to communicate with patients in the next few weeks with the opening date of the new Foresterhill Health Centre.

Significant work is being carried out with the service users around the procurement of equipment and getting the services ready to move into their new building.

This is to make way for the development of The Baird Family Hospital which will be the ultimate home, once built, for all Breast Screening, Symptomatic and Surgical

services.

Screening Services will restart at the beginning of February at the Interim Centre and patients will receive maps and directions in their invitation letters.

Signposting in the main hospital will also be updated to reflect the location of the Interim Centre. Screening on the mobile units continues during the period of this move.

We have great memories of our time in the centre and of staff, colleagues and patients who have stepped through these doors over the years but we look forward to moving back to this site in future in the our integrated breast imaging services centre in The Baird Family Hospital.

In all big projects, there can sometimes be misinformation about project facts. Some of these rumours take on a life of their own. This section in our newsletter tries to respond to the rumour mill, at least the ones the Project Team hears about!

Heard on the grapevine...

• The new Foresterhill Health Centre is actually The Baird Family Hospital.

The Project Team have heard that there is confusion about building work currently underway on the Foresterhill Health Campus and forthcoming construction related to the Baird and ANCHOR Project. The building nearing completion on the link road around the main car park to the west of the site is the **new Foresterhill Health Centre** (for more information, please refer to the article on page 3 of this newsletter). This building will be finished and operational by around March this year and will allow the existing Health Centre (adjacent to the Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital) to be demolished. Construction of the Baird and ANCHOR buildings are not programmed to start until spring 2019.

 Rumours abound that some core clinical services will no longer be accommodated in the new buildings!

The project can confirm that there are no changes to the services planned to be in The Baird Family Hospital (Maternity, Reproductive, Neonatal, Breast and Gynaecology services). In relation to The ANCHOR Centre (Oncology and Haematology out-patient and day-patient services and aseptic pharmacy), with the exception of the removal of CT scanning department, no other clinical service changes are planned.
