Summary of Calls and Crimefiles

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Public Nuisance calls have stayed the same.
- Vehicle crime has increased by 9 reports.
- Vandalism incidents have decreased by 2 reports.

AS3B – Mannofield

- Public Nuisance calls have decreased by 1 report.
- Vehicle crime has stayed the same.
- There are no incidents of Housebreaking.
- Vandalism incidents have decreased by 1 report.

AS3C – West End

- Public Nuisance calls have decreased by 4 reports.
- Vehicle crime decreased by 3 incidents.
- Vandalism crimes have increased by 2 reports.
- Housebreaking crimes have decreased by 4 reports.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND UPDATE ON PREVIOUS QUERIES

As a result of a dedicated operation by Officers in the West End LCT during the month of May, reports of Housebreakings have reduced by over 60%.

As per last month's report, a large proportion of the vehicle crime reported relates to Thefts from insecure vehicles. Residents are urged to secure their vehicles at all time, keeping items of value out of sight or preferably out with the vehicle itself.

The instances of Fireraising relate to an isolated incident involving persons setting Fire to refuse in the street at Bloomfield Road.

Saturday 25 May 2013, saw the arrival of Police Scotland's Mounted Division to the city. Police Horses Glespin and Bothwell patrolled Duthie Park and the surrounding areas as part of Police Scotland's commitment to keeping people safe. This was a great opportunity and one of the positives of the formation of Police Scotland in that we can access resources like this on a national scale.
