PSHE CPD Accredited Course

What is it? Who is it for?

We have been successfully involved in the national PSHE Certification programme for the last 12 years. We are now recruiting teachers, nurses and other professionals who deliver PSHE to be involved in this year's programme, which will run from December 2016 to July 2017. Training will take place at the Ammerdown Centre, near Radstock

Aims of the programme

- ❖ To improve the competence and confidence of those delivering PSHE
- ❖ To raise the quality of teaching and learning in PSHE
- ❖ To effect positive changes in PSHE Curriculum planning, leadership and delivery
- ❖ To provide recognition for the individual's knowledge, experience and skills
- ❖ To contribute to wider Government initiatives and to meet OFSTED requirements

What will the training include?

We do our best to model the kind of activities and approaches which can then be adapted to use in sessions with children and young people. Topics include :-

- Developing a safe climate for learning
- National guidance on PSHE
- Legal guidance around e.g. SRE, Drugs
- Overcoming anxieties about teaching about relationships, sex, drugs, mental health etc.,
- Teaching strategies
- Student needs / starting points
- Assessment and evaluation
- How PSHE links with other Health programmes, such as the Director of Public Health Award
- Professional networks and support services
- Increasing the participation of children and young people
- Difference & diversity

When does it run?

The training will run on **Thursday December 8**th and **Friday December 9**th **2016 Tuesday February 21st and Wednesday May 10**th **2017**, all at Ammerdown.

What is involved?

The commitment necessary from each participating teacher / nurse / other professional is as follows:-

- Attendance at 4 training days (see above)
- ◆ The assessment process will include a lesson / session observation to be undertaken by local leads; an evaluation of the lesson / session and a reflection on participants' learning
- ◆ Teachers / nurses / other professionals will have external support, advice and guidance throughout the process from local leads
- ♦ We particularly welcome and encourage applications from schools and settings which have not yet been involved in the programme.
- Because of the increase in accreditation costs by Roehampton University we have to charge all maintained schools, nurses and other professionals £100 towards course fees
- ♦ We welcome the involvement of colleagues from Academies and Independent Schools, however a £250 cost towards the national accreditation will apply plus the £100 course fees (£350 in total)
