Southside supports individuals and families living in Bath and North East Somerset to make positive changes in their lives. Rooted in the heart of the communities we have served since 1997. We aim to ensure that children, young people and adults with multiple and complex difficulties in Bath and North East Somerset access the care and support that they need, so that their families can enjoy the safety, experiences and opportunities that they deserve.

For over twenty years, Southside has been working with families with entrenched and complex needs, people whose lives have been damaged by violence, abuse and neglect.

Their newest venture engages and trains people with lived experience who have used our services to help others.

They are the Champions!
Southside's Family Champions

The 17 strong team of Family Champions are experts in their

own right: from their lived experience, they know what has worked to support them and what needs to improve. They give a unique perspective on the impact (intended or otherwise) of the available services and current or future policy and help Southside and local decision makers understand how they can implement change.

Latest achievements include setting up a Stay and Play group in Odd down; launching a new Community Hub Group at Bath City farm in Twerton; and they will be starting a new group of Young Advocates aged 13-16 in the New Year in Foxhill. This is in addition to their day to day work of offering one to one support or helping in our Community Hub Groups.

With their support we have recruited a new group of 20 trainee Family Champions who will start their training programme in January.



The launch of the community hub was held at Bath city Farm on Monday 17th December where families got to meet father Christmas and join in with a range of free fun activities.

Southside employs a 'whole family' approach to meet multiple and complex needs within our communities. This means that all of Southside's work with families is to promote the general wellbeing of the whole family and to improve the life chances of individual family members.

"Thanks to the help I received from Southside I understand my child's emotions and behaviour much better. Now my child is happier and I feel far more confident dealing with him. We now have a real relationship..."

National News & information

Inheritance Tax Report

The Office of Tax Simplification (OTS) has issued its first report in its national review of Inheritance Tax, in which it references the tax as 'unpopular' and 'complicated' and recommends the implementation of a digital system to simplify the administration of estates. The report, published on 23rd November, has been welcomed by Remember A Charity. It suggests that Government should implement a fully integrated digital system for Inheritance Tax and probate applications, and also observes that 'regulating the will writing market would help improve the administration process.' Gifts in wills contribute the largest single source of voluntary income to the charity sector, generating around £3 billion a year.

Contactless Fundraising Badges

2018's Movember campaign has seen the launch of contactless donation badges across the UK, America, Canada and Australia. The badges enable people to donate through a Near-field communication (NFC) chip. Tapping their badge opens a webform on the donor's phone where they can select an amount and make a payment using Apple Pay, Google Pay or PayPal. Gift Aid can also be collected. Soon contactless fundraising will be a pivotal tool for most charities.

Local & Regional News & information

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Consultation

Bath and North East Somerset Council has an overarching SEND strategy to meet the changing needs of pupils and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). As part of this strategy, the needs of children and young people with autism and their families are a key area of focus. In response to the analysis of the current and future need, the local authority and its partners aim to build a sustainable range of support. The goal is to develop services so that children and young people with autism can be supported in their local communities and local educational settings. The consultation including focus groups will begin in December 2018 and end in January 2019, however we would appreciate if the ASD survey could be completed by the end of Wednesday 19th December 2018. Draft Community Asset Transfer Policy and Guidance

In 2013 the Council agreed to a programme of transferring community-based assets and services to voluntary groups and parish councils, beginning with a series of "Quick Wins" alongside the development of a more detailed framework and criteria. Since then there have been a number of successful Community Asset Transfers, for example for example Scout land at Kelston Rd & Alexandra Bowls Club. Business & Fundraising

Main Grants Programme – BBC Children in Need

This programme is open to charities and not-for-profit organisations applying for grants over £10,000 per year for up to three years. The programme looks to support projects which seek to address disadvantage experienced by children and young people of 18 years and under

The next deadline for applications is 13th January 2019.

The Tampon Tax Fund – DCMS

The Tampon Tax Fund for 2019/2020 is a Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) fund that supports projects in the following four fields. A detailed description of initiatives that can be supported under each of the four funding areas is provided further down. 1. Violence against women and girls 2. Female homelessness and rough sleeping

The deadline for the 2019/20 round is midnight on Sunday 20th January 2019.

The Lovelace Trust

The Lovelace Trust makes grants across England and Wales to children and young people for:

- The prevention or relief of poverty
- Education and training

Grants are allocated at 6-monthly trustee meetings which are held January and July.

The Les Mills Fund for Children

The Les Mill's Fund for Children works with carefully selected organisations who share their views of creating a healthier and fitter planet by making the opportunity available to everyone. Funding up to £1,000 is available to organisations who they believe will do their most to improve the education and physical and emotional wellbeing of children and who focus on one or more of the following areas: Living in Poverty; Physical & Mental Health Problems; Health & Wellbeing; Living with Disability. The committee meets every three months with award deadlines falling in February, May, July, and October.

St John's Foundation

In 2019, St John's Foundation in Bath will award a further £2.12m to organisations and individuals in crisis. Their Funding Support Programme will re-open on Wednesday 2nd January 2019.

Yeo Valley Charity Evenings

Yeo Valley are hosting 10 Charity evenings in 2019. As part of this initiative they will help 10 charities to put on a fundraising event. Yeo Valley will completely cover the venue and food costs, so the charity can send every penny raised to the great cause that it's supporting.

If you're involved in a charity or want to organise a fund-raising event for one and think you can fill up to 100 seats on the night, then you can apply for one of the evenings **before the end of December 2018.** Yeo Valley will be in touch before the end of January to tell you if you've been selected.
