<u>COVID-19 Local testing</u>: If you are experiencing symptoms then you will be able book in for a coronavirus test at a new temporary mobile testing site which is being set-up in Bath within an isolated section of the Odd Down Park & Ride site as part of the COVID-19 National Testing Programme. It will run from Monday June 22 until Friday June 26.

Business & Fundraising:

St John's Foundation, Feeding Britain & BANES: announce a £30,000 fund to support the provision of food during the 2020 school summer holiday period.

The government has confirmed its intention to extend free school meal provision to cover this year's summer holidays. This small grants programme, awards of up to £3,000 will enable charities and statutory services in Bath and North East Somerset to deliver support to households with school-age children at risk of hunger and malnutrition. The deadline for applications is 5pm on Friday 3rd July. Applicants will be notified of the selection panel's decision in the week beginning 13th July. Locally, **Quartet** is still offering its Coronavirus Response Fund, with grants up to £5,000 for individual organisations and up to £20,000 for partnerships. Find out <u>more</u>.

The Ralph and Irma Sperring Charity provide Grants for charitable purposes including schools, community groups, churches and individuals within a five mile radius of Midsomer Norton. Application deadline Friday 21st August. Download an application here: website.

<u>The Wakeham Trust grants</u> provide between £125 and £2,500 for UK registered charities and community and voluntary groups to support small-scale projects with a community emphasis that are finding it hard to obtain funding from elsewhere.

<u>BBC Children in Need COVID-19 Next Step Fund grants</u> between £5,000 and £80,000 for UK not-for-profit organisations working with disadvantaged children aged 0-18. Application deadline Wednesday 1 July 2020.

<u>The National Lottery Community Fund Emerging Futures Fund</u> – COVID-19 revival fund offering grants between £20,000 and £50,000 for UK charities, voluntary & community organisations and social enterprises to help communities towards recovery and renewal following the coronavirus pandemic. The deadline for application is Thursday 25 June 2020.

<u>Sport England</u> have committed another £1 million to combating the impact of Covid-19 on sports clubs and community activity groups, in the form of match funding through Crowdfunder. They are matching crowd funds of up to £10,000 raised by clubs and organisations hit by the COVID-19 crisis – and is in addition to the £210 million coronavirus support package already announced.

British Cycling is working closely with Sport England to develop a national network of new cycling facilities which meets local demand, making use of a £15 million investment programme called Places to Ride. The <u>Places to Ride</u> funding is available to any group that is developing cycling activity in their community and can be used for anything from equipment packages through to a brand-new cycling facility. The programme is open until January 2021.

Small charities and constituted community groups with innovative ideas that benefit their community can apply for funding to the <u>Aviva Community Fund</u> up to £50,000 for projects that build more connected, more resilient communities and give people the tools to become more financially independent. Applications are open until 28 July 2020.


The following training events will run virtually, If you are interested in participating in the session, please click on the following link to book your place
