#### Bath Building Society

Each year, Bath Building Society selected a charity to be its nominated Charity Of The Year and benefit from year-round fundraising support from the Society's employees. Other charities and community groups from the local area will share £6,500 from the Annual Charity Awards programme or receive a pair of Bath Building Society hot air balloon tickets for fundraising. Open to charities with a turnover of less than £250,000 per year.

Bath & North East Somerset Council has donated £8000 raised from the recycling of metals reclaimed from Bath's Haycombe Crematorium to the Treehouse charity. The not-for-profit Recycling of Metals Scheme is run by the Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management of which Bath & North East Somerset Council is a member. Treehouse provides bereavement support to children and young people under the age of twenty five following the loss of a loved one. To qualify for donations from the scheme, charities are selected on the basis they have to assist the bereaved or those who are terminally ill. 
#### College opens state-of-the-art SEND Centre thanks to £300k investment

Bath College has opened a new Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Centre, Wellow House, which houses a whole range of state-of-the-art facilities for those with learning difficulties. The centre includes a sensory room, a de-escalation calming room, an accessible kitchen and a fully operational onebedroomed flat.

### **Business & Fundraising**

<u>I Dig Trees – TCV and Ovo Energy</u> The 2019/20 'I Dig Trees' programme is now open with 350,000 trees to give away to community groups and volunteers for free. There are two ways to get involved – either applying for community tree packs or volunteering to take part in tree planting at a location near you.

<u>The Sun Newspaper</u> – Sun Readers Fund The Sun has announced that it is to give away £1m to small local charities over the next year through the new £1m Sun Readers Fund. The fund has been launched to celebrate the paper's 50th birthday. Charities can be nominated to receive a donation of anything between £2,000 and £20,000. Nominations are open now, until 18th December, and nominees can use up to 400 words to tell The Sun why they deserve a donation. More information on how to enter is available online.

The Margaret Dobson Further Education Trust: A small but established Trust that awards grants to small UK registered charities, CIOs and CICs (turnover under £1m) that provide support to young adults with learning disabilities after they leave school with the specific aim or giving them practical skills to prepare them to be able to lead independent lives and fulfil their potential. Although nominally the Trust awards grants up to £10,000, in reality awards rarely exceed £5,000. There is a match funding requirement for this funder as the Trust likes to see what other funding has been sought and secured by applicants towards their project. Annual deadline of 31st March.

The JJ Charitable Trust JJ Charitable Trust is an open grant scheme to which any UK registered charity or charitable organisation may apply. The average grants are around £33,500. Please note that this is an extremely competitive grant programme. There is no specific requirement for match funding. Applications may be submitted at any time and must be made via the online application form available on the Sainsbury Family Charitable Trusts website.

#### The Ann Rylands Small Donations Programme

Grants up to £1,500 – including funding towards core costs - for UK registered charities supporting sick and disadvantaged people. Grants are intended to support charities that share the organisation's vision of helping sick and disadvantaged people, particularly charities that will use the grant for a specific project of a humanitarian nature or to supplement their core funding. UK registered charities may apply for a grant of up to £1,500. There is no requirement for match funding and applications can be made at any time.

#### The Sunrise Foundation CIO

Grants for charitable organisations and individuals in England, Wales and Peru in the areas of mental and/or physical illness, young people and social inclusion. Bristol-based the Sunrise Foundation CIO is a new grant-making Trust (founded 2017).

#### Community Chest – Foxhill/Combe Down, Bath

The Community Chest will provide grants to support initiatives that help 'to make a positive and profound contribution to the neighbourhoods where we work – supporting people to succeed in life' – Curo's mission. They welcome applications from individuals, Curo residents and voluntary and community groups. Projects must benefit residents living in Combe Down ward, including Foxhill.

#### **GLL Community Foundation**

The foundation supports projects which encourage local people to be active, learn and play together with a potential pledge of up to £5,000. GLL operate leisure centres in Bath and North East Somerset.
