Star Project of the Month – The TRC Therapeutic Activity Group is a bi-weekly session for children and young people aged from 5 to 7 years old who have suffered trauma, have graduated from 1:1 therapy with a psychotherapist at the TRC Therapy Centre but need longer term intervention. Research shows that young people suffering from trauma need long term support for lasting change and to ensure they are able to go on to function and enjoy a fulfilling life and contribute to society.



The group is led by the therapeutic play specialist and play worker, and a team of therapeutic mentors, who are trained with an understanding of trauma and therapeutic skills to best support those who are recovering from trauma. There is a range of play based and therapeutic activities on offer each session designed to increase confidence, develop social skills and improve wellbeing.

The group meets at the Bath TRC Centre, and runs on a Thursday from 5.30-6.30pm. Please contact Claire.tinker@trc-uk.org for further information.

Parents could face 'additional charges' for 30 hours childcare - half of early years providers plan to increase or introduce extra charges to parents to recoup the cost of offering the government's 30 hours of free childcare policy. The scheme, which is also being trialled in another seven areas in September, was a key promise in the Conservative general election manifesto. It is scheduled to be rolled out across the rest of England in 2017.

Business and Funding

Variety Club Equipment Grants - This scheme offers funding for specialist equipment which will be of clear direct benefit to a child or children up to the age of 18 with a disability/disabilities and/or with special needs.

Most grants are for less than £5,000. Find out more.

World War 1 - Then and Now - Grants of up to £10,000 are available for not-for-profit organisations to support community projects in the UK which explore, conserve and share the heritage of the First World War.

Projects should enable communities to understand more about the heritage of the First World War and benefit a wide range of people. Find out <u>more</u>.

Help with Applying for Funding - HHJ Consultancy is established in the South East and now setting up in the South West. They would like to support small charities and community groups to raise much needed funds for their work and on-going sustainability. Last year, they raised over £300,000 for groups. They do not charge for their service until the money they apply for has been received by the group they are supporting. All they ask in return is that the group pays 15% of the total raised. If they are unsuccessful in obtaining funding, they do not ask for any payment. They are also able to construct the evaluation and monitoring of the use of the monies on a group's behalf.

Free Families in Recovery Course is a 10 week programme that aims to support families where there is a problematic drug or alcohol using parent. DHI's B&NES Drug and Alcohol Service and Bright Start Children's Centres are excited to be able to offer a new programme for the families that you support.
