Dear Friends,

I wonder how many of us experienced a bit of 'Royal mania' last month around the visit of Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla. Dedham was transformed from a relatively peaceful village to a highly secure public stage for their visit. People came from far and wide to get a glimpse of the couple (notwithstanding the chilly and wet climes that prevailed on the day!).

People prepared cakes, dance moves, songs and speeches for the occasion and some went to great lengths to get a happy snap or a handshake with either or both of them. And then, shortly after they departed, life as normal resumed. But the event left its impression upon us all through photographs, memories and the inevitable flurry of press coverage of the visit.

Only a few months ago at Christmas time, we remembered the coming of another royal. Not in a peaceful English village, but in a fairly modest home in a small city in the Middle East. His arrival attracted some attention (both at home and abroad), but was otherwise fairly unremarkable. But his legacy and what He came to teach and to do for humanity was unimaginably profound.

He came to rescue us from the difficulties and darkness that sap us of the fullness of life to which many of us aspire.

He came to deal with the spiritual isolation we face because many of us find ourselves in dark and hopeless paths in life we never thought we'd end up. And He came to demonstrate the sin-forgiving, death-defeating victory He won from us through His sacrifice once for all upon the cross.

The Church is currently in the season of Lent. At this time Christians often try and slow down and pause or take time out to examine themselves, to turn away from what seems to rob them of life and hope, to give up something so that they might seek God more intentionally.

Do you ever feel life goes at such a pace that it seems to just pass you by? Why not take some time to slow down, to 'unplug from the matrix' and to reconnect with your Maker? “Restoration is imperative for the healing of the earth.”

Robert Wall Kimmerer, Braiding Sweetgrass

When I was writing about “the bear ladies” in BBC TV’s Repair Shop yesterday, I used the word “restore” to describe the work they do, bringing old, damaged or worn soft toys back to life. And, as I was writing that piece, my mind went back to a prayer that was familiar for many decades to those associated with the Iona Community. It was part of the Daily Liturgy of the Community’s worship, and it was penned in the 1950s by George MacLeod, the founder of the Iona Community.

George’s prayers had a deeply mystical quality. Some of them have been collected in a lovely little book *The Whole Earth Shall Cry Glory* (<https://www.ionabooks.com/product/the-whole-earth-shall-cry-glory/>), and they’re well worth reading, pondering and absorbing in their beauty.

The particular prayer I have in mind is sometimes called “The Master Carpenter” prayer, and it runs like this:

*O Christ, the Master Carpenter,
who, at the last, through wood and nails,
purchased our whole salvation,
wield well your tools in the workshop of your world,
so that we, who come rough-hewn to your bench,
may here be fashioned to a truer beauty of your hand.
We ask it for your own Name’s sake.
Amen*

It’s enough today to let George’s MacLeod’s words speak to you in their own way, and I’ll not elaborate on them with much comment. Read them over, several times, if you choose, and let the rhythm of the language and the power of the metaphors do their work. Whether we are “rough-hewn”, old, damaged or worn, isn’t it good to be reminded that there is always the possibility of restoration, redemption, repair, if only we would give ourselves to the possibility of that taking place?

If the ecologist Robert Wall Kimmerer is right when he suggests that “restoration is imperative for the healing of the earth”, isn’t it also imperative for your healing and mine?

Supporting Church music in the Tendring area

March 8th

The Deanery choir will be singing at **St Georges Church, Great Bromley CO7 7TS at the 11am communion service.** The choir will sing 'Locus Iste' by William Byrd. William Byrd was an English Renaissance composer. Considered among the greatest composers of the Renaissance, he had a profound influence on composers both from his native country and on the Continent. He is often considered along with John Dunstaple and Henry Purcell as one of England's most important composers of early music.

Byrd's first known professional employment was his appointment in 1563 as organist and master of the choristers at Lincoln Cathedral. Residing at what is now 6 Minster Yard Lincoln, he remained in post until 1572. His period at Lincoln was not entirely trouble-free, for on 19 November 1569 the Dean and Chapter cited him for 'certain matters alleged against him' as the result of which his salary was suspended. Since Puritanism was influential at Lincoln, it is possible that the allegations were connected with over-elaborate choral polyphony or organ playing. Good Friday - 3rd April Advanced notice

It was a tremendous honour to host Their Majesties during their visit to Dedham, meeting and thanking members of our local community. From fellow village businesses and Friends of Dedham Church to St Helena Hospice volunteers, Dedham Therapy Farm, and some of our brilliant suppliers championing British produce, including Thorrington Mill and Danbury Ridge wineries, more than 100 people packed the pub throughout the morning, building a very real sense of anticipation ahead of their arrival at 11.40am. Countless more brave souls outside withstanding the weather.

The weather (always the weather) delayed proceedings just enough to mean Their Majesties departed with a bottle of gin rather than pulling a pint - but only after The Queen had lent a hand preparing some ravioli with Jack, our Head Chef

The King and Queen spent time talking to our teams, both front of house and chefs about their jobs, our menu and produce and apologising for getting in the way of lunch preparations! It was a special moment for the village and a number of our young team who were very proud to be part of the visit, getting the pub ready, looking after the visitors and resetting for lunch once everyone departed.

THE ESSEX ROSE TEA ROOM - TIPTREE PATISSERIE.

The Tiptree Patisserie team were proud to present a handmade celebration cake for Their Majesties, King Charles & Queen Camilla, marking the occasion of 25 years at The Essex Rose Tea House in Dedham and 140 years of Jam Making at Tiptree.

The handmade cake, in a traditional book shape was skilfully made by their patisserie chefs, with layers of Victoria sponge and Little Scarlet Strawberry Conserve, finished with hand piping and edible flowers. The cake was sliced by Her Majesty and enjoyed by guests of the special occasion and local customers.

Outside the Essex Rose, their Majesties stopped to speak to Nick Wickenden, Tiptree Museum Curator, about the blue plaque that was erected in 2024 for Alice Lee (1858 - 1939). Alice was a highly respected mathematician and craniologist who was recognised for her contribution in demonstrating that intelligence is not limited to skull capacity. Alice was born in Dedham and lived in the village until she went to University in 1876 (Also the year of the first issue of the Dedham Parish Magazine).

Alice was awarded The Reid Scholarship by Bedford College, (tenable for 2½ years) entitling her to free instruction at Bedford College, London (value 24 guineas per annum, and 15 guineas a year towards the expenses of the College Boarding-house). She became one of the first women to graduate from London University. She was also among the first class of women to attend Bedford College to study higher mathematics. Alice received her PhD in 1901 from the University of London.

Note: 24 guineas equivalent to £2,550 today.

MUNNINGS ART MUSEUM.

On Thursday afternoon, 5th February 2026, The King and Queen took a tour of the Munnings Art Museum in Dedham, Essex. The museum is at Castle House, the former home of the East Anglian artist Sir Alfred Munnings (1878-1959) and is celebrating its 65th anniversary in 2026.

Munnings is most well-known for painting horses and The King and Queen viewed a selection of his most recognisable pictures including *Ponies in the Ringland Hills, Norfolk (1911)* and *My Wife My Horse and Myself (1935)* – a portrait of the artist and his wife at Castle House.

Their Majesties also looked at pencil studies, done at various racecourses on the backs of racecards, and letters and photographs from the museum's large archive of personal ephemera. Charles Proudfoot, a long standing volunteer who talked to The King about some of the historic documents said that, "The visit has been a real honour."

Following the tour of the pictures, Their Majesties viewed the newly restored Garden-Room at Castle House, for which they later unveiled a commemorative plaque, and spoke with a number of artists involved in the museum's activity programme. Museum Director Jenny Hand said "the museum is a special place for artists, we hope that coming here inspires both beginners and accomplished painters alike".

Finally, Their Majesties went into the former working studio of Sir Alfred Munnings, which still houses his brushes and easels, and met and chatted with fifty of the museum's volunteer room stewards who greet visitors each year.

Dedham Parish Council Meeting Report – Monday, 12th January 2026.

Trading in Royal Square

A space has been created in the Square for trading, and appropriate signage will be erected.

Parish Plan

Letters are to be sent to all organisations and businesses in the village outlining the Parish Plan and seeking their views on priorities for Dedham.

A proposal will be developed to create a strategy informed by the Parish Plan, including a timetable. Information gathered will be used to produce an action plan for works and developments within the village. Timescales will be agreed once responses to the letters are received, after which the next stage will be the production of a detailed action plan with agreed timescales.

Dedham – Munnings and

Constable Update

Plans are underway for the research project, and the Council agreed to cover the costs of the Essex Record Office.

Constable 250th Anniversary

There is a proposal to hold an event in July at the Church, featuring short talks about Constable with musical interludes. It was also suggested to identify whether anyone currently organises village walks, which could potentially include areas featured in Constable's paintings.

Local Plan Consultation Update

Proposed developments in neighbouring villages will have an impact on Dedham. These include plans for 900 houses in Langham, 150 houses in Boxted, and approximately 12 properties in Dedham. Rainwater runoff from Langham will feed

into Black Brook, which flows through Dedham, and this could have significant flooding implications.

Sports Club

A partnership meeting between the Council and the Sports Club is to be arranged. Unfortunately, a pipe burst at the Sports Club during the cold period has caused damage, and an insurance claim will be made.

Budget and Precept for 2026/2027

The proposed budget for the year is £265,150, with a precept of £44,693. This represents minimal increases from the previous year.

Report and Recommendations from Planning Group Meeting

The main item for discussion was plans for Shakespeare House, which the Group supported in principle.

Bus Service Timetables Update

A new bus company, Konnect, is now operating services for Dedham. Updated timetables are displayed on village noticeboards, on the website, and at bus stops throughout the village.

Communications

The Council now has access to an IT specialist who can assist councillors with IT issues, website development, and communications. It was agreed to review the Parish Council's new logo.

Training

Councillors were reminded that they agreed to undertake training when signing the Code of Conduct upon accepting their position.

A CROWD, A HOST, OF GOLDEN DAFFODILS

It's March! Finally! And the spring equinox is just a few weeks off which means serious sowing and planting can get underway and brings our Spring Show on Saturday 21st March. We've brought it forward a couple of weeks to avoid the Easter holidays but also to catch increasingly early-flowering daffodils (*Narcissus* if you want to get Latin about it).

There's no cost to enter the show and you don't need to be a member of the Society, and we have a great programme with classes for everyone. Just download the Schedule and Entry Form from our website where a search for 'daffodil' will return a few tips and images to help you exhibit. If you have any questions, just email dedhamgardening@gmail.com and we'll try to help.

The classification of daffodils can be confusing, so here's a run-down of the differences to help you choose what to exhibit. Don't worry about getting it wrong though – let us know when you bring your exhibit in and we can make sure it goes into the correct class.

Daffodils are typically yellow but there are also varieties in shades of white or orange. The flower itself has two key parts: the corona (also called the trumpet or cup) in the centre, which is surrounded by a perianth of (usually) six segments (the petals or tepals). This is important because it helps you put your daffodil in the right class when exhibiting.

Think of the daffodil lying on the ground with the corona face up. Sometimes it suggests a teacup resting on its saucer, and this gives a clue to one of the alternate names for the corona, the cup. Sometimes the corona is longer, so it's called a trumpet (imagine the cone-like shape of the musical instrument). Got that? Great.

Next, daffodils are exhibited in thirteen descriptive divisions. Classes 1-6 are for trumpet daffodils, where the trumpet must be longer than the petals. To test, gently fold one of the petals forward over the corona: if it is the same length or shorter than the corona, then you have a trumpet.

Identify cupped daffodils by folding the petals forward again. If they are longer than the corona, then you have a cupped daffodil – some of the cups are small in diameter, others are much wider. Both count as cupped daffodils, 'small' or 'large'. You need large-cupped for classes 7 and 8 but can put small-cupped varieties into classes 11, 12 and 15, and – if the flower is small enough – 13 and 14 too.

Double daffodils can be difficult to classify correctly. The flower itself must be doubled, a peony-like mass of corona and perianth. A daffodil with two or more flowers on the stem (ie multi-headed) is NOT classified as a double daffodil unless each of those flowers has

that peony-like mass. Our show schedule asks you to exhibit one or three stems in classes 9 and 10, so you can exhibit multi-headed varieties here, just make sure every head is a double. Good multi-headed varieties include 'Bridal Crown', 'Cheerfulness' or 'Erlicheer' ('Early Cheer').

Classes 13 and 14 are essentially for 'any other' type of daffodil. These include multi-headed varieties, as well as the weird-looking (I think) bulbocodium and the pretty split-cupped. Then there's the pheasant's eye, which has pure white petals and an almost flat corona with a red rim.

If you can't be bothered remembering all that, just find 12 daffs, make them look nice in a vase and enter class 15. And if you're not sure what you have, we don't mind if you circle all the daffodil classes on your entry form and we will help you out on the day.

The British weather being what it is, it doesn't matter if – on the day – you don't have everything you'd hoped to exhibit.

The Show is not just about daffodils of course. There are classes for other bulbs and, as it might prove too early for many tulips, we've created a dedicated class for grape hyacinths (muscaria) this year. Class 20 requires 12 stems of small or miniature bulbous plants with a minimum of three different varieties. There's nothing stopping you from

including miniature daffodils or muscari here, even if you've also used them in classes 13, 14 or 18, while scilla, puschkinia and ipheion all have smaller varieties. Although not officially bulbous, we ask our judge to be kind here so anemone, cyclamen and crocus (rhizomes, tubers and corms respectively) can also be included in this class.

Remember that a variety can be the same kind of plant but look different. For example, 'Dutch Master' and 'Mount Hood' are both trumpet daffodil types, but the first is an all-yellow variety, the second all-white. If they were miniatures (they're not, don't try it) they would count towards two of the three needed in class 20. For miniature daffs, where the blooms are usually less than 2 inches (50mm) in diameter, 'Tête-à-Tête', 'Rip van Winkle', 'Sun Disc' and 'Minnow' are all very different varieties.

For class 21, 12 stems of spring flowers, you'll probably have to draw on any hellebores, primroses, primulas, wallflowers, pansies or violas that you haven't already used in other classes. You can't use any bulbs or shrubs, so daffodils and spring blossom will be disqualified here.


Do have a look at the schedule on our website. It would be great to see more people taking part and supporting Dedham's gardening group. I know the show sounds a bit intimidating but we're a friendly bunch and are happy to help and offer advice and encouragement.

Even if you don't exhibit, make sure to put the afternoon of 21st March in your diary and come along for a look around, a hot drink and the raffle! We'll see you there.
