#### **Parish Council**

Following the resignation of Stewart Amos, which was recorded in the last News, **Janice Williamson** was co-opted on to the Council, so we now have the full complement of seven councillors again. If you think you might like to get involved with the most local form of government, you could give some consideration to standing for election in May, when the four year term of the present Council comes to an end.

Also mentioned in the last News was the dance on 28<sup>th</sup> Oct. At time of writing the bar contribution was awaited & unknown but the profits from tickets sales & the raffle amounted to £244.55, which is going towards the enlargement of the wear area in front of the sports wall. I have received lots of positive feedback about the event, so it looks as though it was a social success as well as profitable. Thanks to everyone who contributed their time to help & also to those who donated raffle prizes.

I have been informed by the housing officer at Chelmsford Borough Council that the names of the individuals nominated for the housing in Old Church Road have been passed to Colne Housing, & that everyone should have moved in before Christmas. I have also heard that the scheme was heavily oversubscribed, & that there are many more disappointed applicants than successful ones.

In the early summer PC had a site meeting with a County Council Highways officer. Several issues were discussed, one of which was traffic speed at various points in the village. We have had the results of one speed census that followed on from that meeting. The census was carried out over three days at the Common within the 30mph speed limit. It was found that 85% of northbound traffic was travelling at or below 35.6, 35.7 & 35.8mph on each day, & 85% of southbound traffic was travelling at or below 35.9, 35.4 & 35.5mph. I hope to have more information on traffic speed & associated matters for the next News.

This is the last issue of the News that **Daphne Sherry** will be editing. PC would like to thank her for her eight years of dedicated service keeping the community informed. If there is anyone who would like to take on the role of **Editor** please get in touch with Daphne, whose contact details are inside the front cover, to find out what is involved, or contact me if you are definitely offering to take on the role.

I have recently set up the **Village Diary 2007** on the PC website. Please let me have details of your village group events, so that I can post them in the Diary. The earlier they are placed in the Diary the less likely they are to clash with other village events.

Parish Council Meetings continue on the fourth Thursday of each month (except December) at 8pm in the first floor meeting room at the Village Hall. The Agenda is posted on the PC noticeboards & the website three days before each Meeting. At each Meeting members of the public are given an opportunity to speak during Public Question Time.

# ARE YOU PREPARED TO GET INVOLVED IN THE FUTURE OF YOUR COMMUNITY?

The Parish Council is aware of the increasing reliance by policy making bodies, such as the County and Borough Councils, and by grant giving bodies on **COMMUNITY-LED PLANS** to inform and influence their decision making.

Presently East Hanningfield does not have a community-led plan, and the Parish Council sees this as a barrier to the wishes of the residents, the community, being upheld when important decisions are being made.

If you think that you might like to get involved in the creation of a community-led plan, such as a **Village Design Statement** or a **Parish Plan**, please get in touch with the **Clerk to the Council** on **400628**. When enough volunteers have registered their interest a meeting will be arranged with an advisor who will explain the process and help get the project underway.

To help communities understand the planning framework within which community-led plans have to operate a **Statutory Planning Guidance Pack** was recently published by the Rural Community Council of Essex. It is also a good basic introduction to the Local Development Framework, which is replacing the Local and Structure Planning system. Our stall at the village fete raised £45 for the group, with which we have purchased some beanbags, so that those mums with babies can play with them at their own level in a little more comfort. The latest visit from the Pre-School Learning Alliance was a success, with only a few additions to the administration required. The introduction of 'healthy' snacks has also gone well, with carrots, apples & breadsticks disappearing at an alarming rate, although we mums do miss the biscuits.

Hanna's Tots runs at the village hall every Friday morning, from 09:30 to 11:30, for children under 5 & their parents / carers. We have a vast array of toys to play with in the hall, in addition to those available on loan in our toy library. I would like to express my thanks to everyone who worked hard to make the Village fete held in September so successful. In particular I would like to thank the various sponsors including Martin Gard, for event sponsorship, Heritage properties for 1st Prize (£100), Fordhams for 2nd Prize (Case of Wine), East Hanningfield Motors for 3rdPrize (MOT), The Windmill Pub for 4th Prize (dinner) and also The Royal Tiger for the Champagne Buffet Lunch.

The entertainment provided by each of our regular hall users was very welcome including the demonstrations from the Dog Training Club, Jan's Aerobics and Angel Dance. I am glad that we were once again lucky with the weather.

The village fete is organised as a joint event with All Saints Church. Other local organisations are welcomed and I am pleased to report that Hanna's Field Charity and All Saints Church shared the profit of approximately £1,800.00 between us. In addition the local organisations who ran their own stalls will have made a surplus and hopefully enjoyed the afternoons activities. If you have any ideas or input regarding the organisation of next year's fete we would be pleased to hear from you.

In October we ran a joint event with the parish council, a Village Ceilidh, which for the over 120 people who attended was a very enjoyable event. Any surplus made on the evening will be used by the Charity to complete the Sports wall and Youth Shelter project.

Chelmer Housing Partnership have confirmed we have been successful with the £5,000 grant requested to complete the sports wall wear area matting and we will now proceed with extending the matting area to cover all of the worn grass in front of the sports wall

We have been consulting villagers about the proposals to build a clubroom above the Small Hall. So far the feedback has all been

positive. If we do go ahead with this work it will require major assistance and input and not a little fundraising.

Jan Marsh is looking for new starters for her Aerobics classes in the Small Hall. If you have been thinking of getting in shape now is the time - Jan needs more people or the classes may have to fold. They are every Tuesday between 6.30-7.15.pm. Any age/any gender can attend. #### **ALL SAINTS' CHURCH**

Regular readers will recall that our previous notes spoke of the financial problems faced by the village church.

The congregation has been concerned about this for some time now and addressed the problem with the advice and help of Revd Martin Wood (whose grand title is the Bradwell Area Team Parish Development Officer!) specifically through a programme called TRIO – The Responsibility Is Ours. Regular and occasional members of the congregation were briefed at a meeting held in the village hall on 19th October. Despite appalling weather on the night, over 30 people attended the presentation and were given a clear picture of the financial demands on the church (e.g. weekly costs of £335) and the steps required to make All Saints financially viable once more. Those who couldn't attend received a pamphlet setting out the same details.

The response to TRIO and our note in the previous edition of the East Hanningfield News has been most gratifying. Some have responded by seeking further explanation, some have offered general support and some have offered specific support in the form of donations or have pledged longer term regular giving – at the time of writing 22 pledge sheets have been received. This means that the target of new giving per month identified by TRIO has almost been achieved!

TO ALL WHO HAVE RESPONDED AND SHOWN THAT THEY CARE –A VERY LARGE AND SINCERE THANK YOU.




