PARISH COUNCIL



This year's **Village Tidy-up** is scheduled for Saturday, **3rd. May**. Volunteers are asked to meet at the Village Hall car park at **9am**. Gloves, sacks and litter-pickers will be provided. In recent years we have had perfect weather so it

has been a pleasure to have an excuse to be out in the spring sunshine. Why not join us?

The last **Manned Refuse Vehicle** visit to the Village Hall car park was on 16th. February. Chelmsford Borough Council is currently reviewing the service so details of what is to happen in the financial year starting on 1st. April are awaited. Please keep an eye on the PC's website and noticeboards for further information. In the meantime you can take your bulky items of household refuse to the civic amenity site at South Woodham, which from March to September will be open every day from 8am until 5pm.



Planning ahead, a **Summer Play** Activity Day has been booked for Wednesday **6**th. **August**. This will be for children aged up to 11 years, and will take place at the Village Hall. Sports activities for children aged 6-14 years have been booked for two days in the Easter

holidays and one day during the Whitsun half term holiday. Confirmation of the dates is awaited. Children at the local schools will receive notice of the dates nearer the time, and of course they will be posted on the website as soon as they are known.



An initial meeting has been held on the **Community-led Planning** topic. A field officer from the Rural Community
Council of Essex introduced the subject and explained what
parish planning entails and a planning officer from Chelmsford
Borough Council went into more detail about Village Design
Statements. It was well attended with those present expressing
interest in getting a project underway, and at the time of writing
we are waiting for the field officer to come back to help set up
an official parish planning group complete with a constitution, a
committee and a bank account. If you would like to be involved
please get in touch. Representatives from village groups as well
as interested individuals will be welcome.

PC Meetings continue on the **fourth Thursday** of the month, although there will be exceptions later in the year when the August and November Meetings will be on the third Thursday and the December Meeting on the second Thursday. These dates are all on the Village Diary on the website and on PC's noticeboards.

Meetings are open to the public, and time is set aside for public participation shortly after each meeting opens, so that you can comment on an item on the Agenda or bring an issue to the Council's attention. If you have an issue that would require a decision from the Council please send it to me in writing, email is acceptable, at least a week before the Meeting so that it can be included in the Agenda. Councillors are keen to hear from anyone who has a comment on a local planning application, particularly from neighbours of the property concerned, as this helps the Council form its response to the planning authority, so please let the Council know your reaction: a copy of your response to the Borough Council would be helpful.

HBOUP AT CHA

Crime in the village is still on the increase, so please report anything suspicious either to myself on **07968112179** or to the Police direct on **07711147171** or in an emergency dial 999.

Bicycles were recently stolen from unlocked sheds and garages in The Tye

and the village hall was broken into and further damage caused. Also bicycles were stolen from a **locked** garage in Highfields Mead. Where possible, when cars are parked on driveways, we suggest parking them as close to garage doors as may be possible.

Whilst professional thieves were probably involved with the thefts, the wanton vandalism was no doubt caused by bored teenagers out of control. It's a pity that some parents are quite happy to allow their children to roam the streets mindlessly at night, but this is a national problem.

Other crimes are not reported and without such information the Police are blind and detection impossible. Also one incident could be linked to another, so please inform the Police about any incidents or anything suspicious as quickly as possible.

Please also watch out for bogus callers and distraction burglaries. A distraction burglary is where somebody purports to be a representative of the Council, Police or a service provider and attempts to gain access. Meantime an accomplice might attempt to enter by your back door.


EAST HANNINGFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL




VILLAGE FETE 2008



ALL SAINTS' - News from the parish church

All Saints' church has many faithful servants. Not least among them is the treasurer. Unfortunately, Richard Huke, who has held this position for several years, has indicated that he will not be able to stand for re-election at this year's annual meeting. Richard has been most efficient and immensely supportive. Indeed, in recent months he has led the church on to a much sounder footing than it has felt for years through his energetic work for the TRIO campaign – The Responsibility Is Ours. We are very grateful for Richard's contribution to the life of our church. Thank you, Richard.



Just over eight years ago I came to East Hanningfield as priest-in-charge. Cynics might say 'We haven't noticed'! It hasn't been easy for either parishioners or me not having a priest actually living in the village. But that's the way of the world today. The Church of England can no longer afford the luxury of a priest in every parish. In a sense I have been very fortunate to have responsibility for only two parishes. Goodness knows how I would have coped with three or more, as some of my colleagues are expected to do.

The time has come for me to hang up my stole. I shall be retiring in May and my last Service at All Saints will be on Sunday 4th. During the past eight years I have endeavoured to serve the parish as best I could. I could have done better, of course. I am aware of that. But I wish the parish well for the future, and will continue to pray for it.

Meanwhile, I hope and trust that many who live in the village will do all they can to support the worship and work of its parish church. Kate, our Reader, is unable to commit herself here any longer because she has to concentrate on her training for ordination. We thank her for her work here and wish her well in her vocation. However, we are indeed fortunate to have Revd Ann Kosla able to help for a few hours each week and with one Sunday Service per month. Ann is a midwife, and therefore her time in the parish will be limited. But we welcome her and have already benefitted from her enthusiasm and kindness.

We are entering a period of change at All Saints. With change comes opportunity. I trust that, with God's help, and with your prayers, the future of this parish church will be bright and joyful.

Keith R Plaister (Priest-in-charge)

Following Keith's announcement of his intention to retire from full time ministry in May, members of the PCC met with the Bishop of Bradwell, Laurie Green on 30 January to discuss the vacancy and beyond. As a result of Keith's retirement the Bishop has asked the Rural Dean to look at the current distribution of clergy within the Deanery and to recommend any changes that might be necessary. The PCC has been asked to contribute to this process and will be meeting with the Rural Dean shortly.

It is expected that there will be quite a long period before a new clergy appointment can be made for East Hanningfield, but during this time (known as "The Interregnum") it is planned to maintain the same or similar pattern of services. In addition to help from Ann, the PCC is busy booking a number of other clergy to take our services. Certainly there will always be a Sunday service at 11.15 am at All Saints, the Church on The Tye, to which you will be warmly welcome! Watch this space!






