



An initial meeting has been held on the **Community-led Planning** topic. A field officer from the Rural Community Council of Essex introduced the subject and explained what parish planning entails and a planning officer from Chelmsford Borough Council went into more detail about Village Design Statements. It was well attended with those present expressing interest in getting a project underway, and at the time of writing we are waiting for the field officer to come back to help set up an official parish planning group complete with a constitution, a committee and a bank account. If you would like to be involved please get in touch. Representatives from village groups as well as interested individuals will be welcome.

PC Meetings continue on the **fourth Thursday** of the month, although there will be exceptions later in the year when the August and November Meetings will be on the third Thursday and the December Meeting on the second Thursday. These dates are all on the Village Diary on the website and on PC's noticeboards.

Meetings are open to the public, and time is set aside for public participation shortly after each meeting opens, so that you can comment on an item on the Agenda or bring an issue to the Council's attention. If you have an issue that would require a decision from the Council please send it to me in writing, email is acceptable, at least a week before the Meeting so that it can be included in the Agenda. Councillors are keen to hear from anyone who has a comment on a local planning application, particularly from neighbours of the property concerned, as this helps the Council form its response to the planning authority, so please let the Council know your reaction: a copy of your response to the Borough Council would be helpful.

Crime in the village is still on the increase, so please report anything suspicious either to myself on 07968112179 or to the Police direct on 07711147171 or in an emergency dial 999.

Bicycles were recently stolen from unlocked sheds and garages in The Tye

and the village hall was broken into and further damage caused. Also bicycles were stolen from a **locked** garage in Highfields Mead. Where possible, when cars are parked on driveways, we suggest parking them as close to garage doors as may be possible.

Whilst professional thieves were probably involved with the thefts, the wanton vandalism was no doubt caused by bored teenagers out of control. It's a pity that some parents are quite happy to allow their children to roam the streets mindlessly at night, but this is a national problem.

Other crimes are not reported and without such information the Police are blind and detection impossible. Also one incident could be linked to another, so please inform the Police about any incidents or anything suspicious as quickly as possible.

Please also watch out for bogus callers and distraction burglaries. A distraction burglary is where somebody purports to be a representative of the Council, Police or a service provider and attempts to gain access. Meantime an accomplice might attempt to enter by your back door.



**ALL SAINTS' -** News from the parish church

All Saints' church has many faithful servants. Not least among them is the treasurer. Unfortunately, Richard Huke, who has held this position for several years, has indicated that he will not be able to stand for re-election at this year's annual meeting. Richard has been most efficient and immensely supportive. Indeed, in recent months he has led the church on to a much sounder footing than it has felt for years through his energetic work for the TRIO campaign – The Responsibility Is Ours. We are very grateful for Richard's contribution to the life of our church. Thank you, Richard.



Just over eight years ago I came to East Hanningfield as priest-in-charge. Cynics might say 'We haven't noticed'! It hasn't been easy for either parishioners or me not having a priest actually living in the village. But that's the way of the world today. The Church of England can no longer afford the luxury of a priest in every parish. In a sense I have been very fortunate to have responsibility for only two parishes. Goodness knows how I would have coped with three or more, as some of my colleagues are expected to do.

The time has come for me to hang up my stole. I shall be retiring in May and my last Service at All Saints will be on Sunday 4th. During the past eight years I have endeavoured to serve the parish as best I could. I could have done better, of course. I am aware of that. But I wish the parish well for the future, and will continue to pray for it.

Meanwhile, I hope and trust that many who live in the village will do all they can to support the worship and work of its parish church. Kate, our Reader, is unable to commit herself here any longer because she has to concentrate on her training for ordination. We thank her for her work here and wish her well in her vocation. However, we are indeed fortunate to have Revd Ann Kosla able to help for a few hours each week and with one Sunday Service per month. Ann is a midwife, and therefore her time in the parish will be limited. But we welcome her and have already benefitted from her enthusiasm and kindness.

We are entering a period of change at All Saints. With change comes opportunity. I trust that, with God's help, and with your prayers, the future of this parish church will be bright and joyful

Keith R Plaister (Priest-in-charge)

Following Keith's announcement of his intention to retire from full time ministry in May, members of the PCC met with the Bishop of Bradwell, Laurie Green on 30 January to discuss the vacancy and beyond. As a result of Keith's retirement the Bishop has asked the Rural Dean to look at the current distribution of clergy within the Deanery and to recommend any changes that might be necessary. The PCC has been asked to contribute to this process and will be meeting with the Rural Dean shortly.

It is expected that there will be quite a long period before a new clergy appointment can be made for East Hanningfield, but during this time (known as "The Interregnum") it is planned to maintain the same or similar pattern of services. In addition to help from Ann, the PCC is busy booking a number of other clergy to take our services. Certainly there will always be a Sunday service at 11.15 am at All Saints, the Church on The Tye, to which you will be warmly welcome! Watch this space!

So much for the future, but for the present we thank Keith for his considerable contribution to All Saints' Church and the life of the Parish over the past eight years. We wish Keith and Heike everything that they would wish for themselves and, with God's help, a long and happy retirement.

### PARISH COUNCIL

Thank you to everyone who turned out to help with the Village Tidy-up on 3<sup>rd</sup>. May. Despite it being the bank holiday weekend enough volunteers came along to make a real difference to the appearance and cleanliness of the village. Yet again they were rewarded with beautiful weather. I hope they all remembered to slap on the sun block before they came.

I am receiving copies of a fortnightly magazine that includes details of all housing association properties available to rent in Chelmsford Borough and beyond. It's called Home Option Freesheet. Please call at 2 Clinton Close if you would like a copy. There is an associated website at <a href="https://www.homeoption.org">www.homeoption.org</a>.

In the last edition I mentioned that the manned refuse vehicle Saturday Service was under review. It has now been replaced by Recycling Saturdays. Only recyclable items will be accepted. These are listed as plastic bottles only; glass jars and bottles, food and drink cans and tins; paper; cardboard, textiles, furniture; fridges/freezers, TVs and computer screens. Bagged waste and garden waste will not be accepted but can still be taken to the civic amenity sites at Boreham and South Woodham. The first **Recycling Saturday** at the Village Hall car park will be on 21st. June 7.45-8.45am, so you will need to get up early for that one. The following visits will be on 4th. October and 15th. November. For more information go to www.chelmsford.gov.uk/recycling.

Several activities have been organised for the school summer holiday. **Play in the Park** on **Wednesday**, **6**<sup>th</sup>. **August** is for children up to the age of 11 years. Children under five must be accompanied and supervised by an adult carer, with no more than four under 5s per carer. The morning session runs from 10.30 to 12.30 and the afternoon session from 1.45 to 3.45.

The return of the **Mobile Skateboard Park**has been arranged for **Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup>**. **August** from 11am until 3pm. Boards
and safety gear will be provided, but you
are welcome to bring your own. There will also

#### FRONT COVER

This photograph of the Three Horseshoes was taken during the time that it was in the ownership of Russells Brewery. Russells was based at Gravesend in Kent and bought out the Writtle Brewery, the previous owner, with all its properties in 1902. Russells was taken over by Trumans in 1930.

Although the building has not changed much, its surroundings have. The outhouse with the hole in the roof and the kennels have gone, and there was no car park when this photograph was taken. As the outhouse is not shown on the 1922 OS map, which you can see on the website under **Study Resources**, the photograph was probably taken before that year.

### PARISH COUNCIL

You will see elsewhere in this News that the community-led planning project is well underway with a team working towards producing a Parish Plan. The early discussions and consultation exercises have produced some interesting issues, and one of which was that there ought to be a village directory of local businesses on the website. The thinking behind this was that if residents could source services locally we'd be taking a step towards a sustainable community by reducing road transport and supporting local business. So, if you run a local business that you would like to have included in a website directory please send me the name of the business, what it does, where it is and contact details. If your business has a website, include a link.

If you have been to the website recently you will have seen on the homepage the photograph of the team of volunteers who rebuilt the footbridge on St. Peter's Way between Hanna's Field and the Buttercup field. If you would like to take part in a similar project such as bridge and stile building, post and way-marker installation or path clearance, opportunities are being planned. There will be another opportunity for volunteering for work in the fresh air during the Autumn as PC hopes to take advantage of the

County Council's offer of free native trees for planting in public places. So If you would like to help with tree planting please contact me.

At the time of writing there is still a vacant seat on the Parish Council, but it looks as though it will be filled shortly. The new councillor's details will be posted on the website and contact details will be updated on the noticeboards once this has hap-

pened, so keep an eye open.

Community Speedwatch has been carrying out regular speed

checks in various parts of the village. It is surprising that some drivers continue to break the speed limit even though the Speedwatch signs are displayed and the volunteers are conspicuous in their fluorescent jackets. In addition to recording excessive speed, recent sessions have been used to take details of drivers using mobile phones and drivers and passengers not wearing seatbelts.

I have been asked to remind drivers that parking on verges and footpaths means that people in wheelchairs or parents pushing buggies have to go out into the road if they cannot squeeze past. Clearly this is dangerous, especially so if you have children walking beside the buggy. The Highway Code says "You MUST NOT park partially or wholly on the pavement in London, and should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs".

On a happier note, plans are underway to organise another village dance in the Autumn. Details will go on the website and noticeboards, so keep a watch because numbers of tickets will be





### **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

#### An Aide-Memoire

How safe is your house from burglary or other theft? It is worth taking stock of what you can do and what is available to you to make it more secure (security can never be absolute). At this time of the year it is worth thinking of the sim-



ple immediate actions we should take, while also considering longer term action –

### 1. Holidays and other absences -

Lock doors and shut windows; - that sounds trite, but is worth checking.

Leave house exterior tidy and cut lawn, - so that the place looks lived in.

Lock outhouses containing garden tools, and do not leave ladders around.

Do not leave valuables lying around, silver, jewellery etc. Also, best not left in main bedroom or desk/study.

Make home look lived in. Use timing devises to switch lights, radio or television on and off.

Leave curtains as one might expect to see them; net curtains? shut in summer?

Cancel deliveries, and make arrangements that ensure mail does not collect behind the letterbox.

Befriend your neighbour and ask them to hold a house key. Be careful who you appraise of your absences – careless talk costs....

When travelling by car, always lock, and always keep valuables out of sight.

### 2. Longer term considerations –

Review door locks – 5 lever mortise locks on outer doors, plus chain and spy glass.

Fit window locks (keep keys handy in case of fire).

Fit double glazing; apart from insulating properties, they are very unattractive to a potential burdlar

Fit burglar alarm. Best linked to security centre, but any alarm will make house less attractive to a burglar.

Be properly insured. Insurance companies will usually make a concession on contents insurance if the house is alarmed, and the system maintained annually.

Mark valuables with postcode using marker pen or die stamp, as appropriate. EH Neighbourhood Watch has marking equipment available.

Mark such items as bicycles and valuable garden equipment. Photograph and keep record of such marked valuables, with ruler alongside to show size. This is useful for both recovery and potential insurance claim.

Make sure outhouses have decent locks; do not keep ladders outside.

Security lights; these can alert neighbours to unplanned activity, - but they can also help a potential burglar see what he is doing. - A mixed blessing!

#### 3. Afterthought -

Neighbourhood Watch is only as good as the people who can give it time. While the organisation may be able to help you directly, please also consider what you can do to strengthen it. If you can give it time, contact Geoff Dickman (geoff.dickman@benlineagencies.com).



## **EAST HANNINGFIELD PARISH PLAN**

### We have a cunning Parish Plan

Possibly the opening line of a modern day Baldric to describe the government's policy for rural development through the use of Parish Plans. So what is this all about and how does it affect you?

### The Background to Parish Plans

The Government's Rural White Paper provided local communities a fantastic opportunity to shape their local community. It stated that Parish Plans should "identify key facilities and services, set out the problems that need to be tackled and demonstrate how distinctive character and features can be preserved". They should set out a vision for the community in the future and identify the action needed to tackle issues of concern in addition to including everything that is relevant to the people who live and work in the community, from employment needs to playgrounds. The Parish Plan should consult everyone and give them a chance to say what they think about the social, economic and environmental issues affecting them and how they'd like to see their community improved during the next 5, 10 or even 15 years. The whole community has to be involved, not just those who come along to Parish Council meetings.

### Why Do a Parish Plan?

#### Parish Plans;

- enable communities to engage meaningfully with the local planning process

With the support of the Parish Council and Rural Community Council of Essex we have held 2 public meetings from which we now have a Steering Group with elected officers and a formal constitution. In addition to the public meetings we have also manned an exhibit at the village art show. The events are to ask people who live or work in the village what they value, like, dislike or would like changed in the Parish. The response has been excellent and we have over 150 comments so far! We are intending to repeat this exercise a number of times, including working with organisations such as the school, to allow as many people as possible to feed into this initial process. From the replies we will write a questionnaire which will be distributed to all households in the Parish and from the replies the plan will be written.

However that is some time off as we need to find funding for initially the questionnaire and then the final plan. Work is in hand to achieve this in addition to setting up a dedicated internet site to support the project.


from the north, so the Highway Authority would not support a junction arrangement which could cause potential confusion on the highway. Sadly, the fear is that the result of this will be as PC and our Borough Councillors warned: increased traffic through East Hanningfield village.

At the time of writing PC is waiting to hear from the County Council about highway safety measures that PC proposed for the village. The proposals are being prioritised by ECC using a points system, and will be judged against projects put forward by other parish councils. If our projects get more points than the others funding will be allocated. Results were expected towards the end of October, so had they been on time they would have been announced in this edition. PC identified six areas of major concern. For pedestrians there was lack of footway on the Common and from Willis Farm to the Old Forge; the inadequacy of the footway beside the Horseshoes garden; and the erosion of the verges beside Abbeyfields and at the southern village-gateway. For traffic there was the problem of overtaking on the bend where Old Church Road meets the Tye. Clearly these are not the only problem areas in the parish, but PC was told to limit its proposals in order to have any chance of success.

Please note that the PC Meeting in December will be early in the month on the 11th, and will be attended by our County Councillor Lord Hanningfield. In January Meetings will return to the **fourth** Thursday of the month. They take place in the first floor meeting room at the Village Hall, usually at 8pm. The Agenda is posted on the noticeboards and on the website at least three days before, and copies are provided for members of the public who come along. PC hopes to see you there.


I cannot think of a better representation of God's work than to bring all these together as 'Community' so much more strong in unity than the sum of their individual parts.

Too many homes have side gates unlocked, or no gates at all, and some homes have sheds in their back gardens, also without locks or unlocked. One of the above burglaries involved entry by the back door. It's making it too easy for the criminal element within our society to have a field day, especially in view of the recession.

The Police have also drawn to my attention the number of homes in total darkness after dark. Okay after midnight, but not early evening just as it gets dark and later before midnight. It's too obvious that the occupants are not at home. Similarly some people close their curtains when they go on holiday, so what does this say to a potential burglar?

The choice is largely your own especially as the Police can't be everywhere 24/7, so if you see anything suspicious please notify the Police direct by calling 999 in an emergency, or 0300-333-4444 when your report is not urgent. Your NHW team would also appreciate your advice of any incident, even when only remotely suspicious.

## **EAST HANNINGFIELD PRE-SCHOOL**



However what question to ask in the first place is the current conundrum for the Parish Plan committee. As has been outlined previously the initial work of the group has been canvassing the views of as many people as possible associated with the village. We have asked what is special, what the problems are and what can be improved within the village and parish. We are extremely grateful to all those who replied via the questionnaires at the various events. The table below lists in frequency order the most common answers.

Some of the issues raised are not appropriate for the parish plan but clearly need addressing as they have been raised by so many

of you. The Parish Council is aware of these and I am sure will look at what can be achieved, remember we are independent from Parish Council but are happy to act as a conduit in these matters. What the committee has spent the last two meetings on is taking the relevant issues and using these to build the questionnaire for circulation to all in the Parish later this year. This work is now almost complete and we will run a small trial to ensure the questions work, produce data that we can use and is understandable. We are anxious to also include as many young people in the survey and are therefore writing a questionnaire specifically for them. We will also be working with the village school to consider the requirements of the youngest children.

So have we chosen the right question to ask to get a 'pertinent answer'? Watch this space!

## A MESSAGE FROM REVEREND PAM





We have already had one small grant this year, which is going towards a play microphone, so that the children can record their voices on the computer & play them back to hear how they sound to others.

A big thank you to the Hanningfield Wives, who recently donated the last of the money raised from their calendar to the pre-school. This will make a big difference to the school in such financially hard times.

Although the register is filling up, we do still have some places available at the pre-school. We take children from age 2 to under 5, with 3 year olds being funded by the government from the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday.



# PARISH PLANNING—Out of the mouths of babes!

As part of the commitment to involve as many parts of the community as possible in the Parish Plan I had the great pleasure of spending an afternoon at the village school. Following an invitation through the Governors I was made welcome by the Head Mrs Linda Findlay and met with representatives from each class through the school council. Each class had previously been invited to consider what they value in the village and what they would like to be changed. I was excited by their enthusiasm and the fact that their thoughts are not that different from the adults on many matters. I was heartened by the value they placed on the countryside surrounding the village and their concern for the wildlife. They appreciate what has been done with the opening of the post office / shop, the new equipment in the play area and availability of Hanna's Field with the football, tennis pitches etc.

There were multiple requests for additional equipment in the play area with quite specific requests i.e. Monkey Bars, Hamster Wheel and return of the old wooden climbing frame!

However all was not positive and there was unhappiness at the non-availability of organised sports (football, cricket, angling and horse riding), coaching and scouts/guides in the village. I was particularly saddened by the fact that none of the children knew the village had a cricket pitch let alone a team! No wonder village cricket teams are struggling for players. Some of the children are pursuing these interests but only by having to travel outside the local area?

Finally the one sad comment for me was that two groups asked if we could ensure the police catch the robbers who come when they are asleed.

Overall the children were a credit to the school and their parents and I welcome the opportunity of doing something further with them in the future.

The questionnaire is now finished and a field testing exercise completed. We are intending to print and distribute the completed questionnaire in the coming months.

# Hanna's Field Charity Chairman's report to the 2009 AGM

The last year has been a successful year for the Charity. We were rewarded in our bid to the Communities Initiative Fund with

a grant of £6,000 which enabled us to install a proper staircase to give safe access to the upstairs storage area and convert the old former changing room to provide a dedicated secure storage area for the East Hanningfield Short Mat Bowls Club. We have not given up looking for funding for our ambitious project to build a community suite above the small hall but it is proving to be hard to raise the required funds.

The work load of the Charity has been borne by very few for the gain of the many villagers and organisations who use the facilities at the village hall and sports field. No officers receive any remuneration for their hard work; they are all volunteers and all should be thanked for their efforts on behalf of the village. I would like to thank Paul Garner, who has recently left the committee, for all his hard work on behalf of the Charity, particularly in providing drawings and proposals to support our numerous grant applications.

I am also very grateful to Dawn & Terry Mills who maintain the Hall and organise the bookings. The Essex Probation Service continued their work with us which enabled the Charity to maintain the Hall and grounds for the benefit of all villagers.

It is good that the Village Shop and Post Office continue to survive If we are to retain the Post Office in the village it is essential that we all use the facility.

The Annual Art Show continued as a major fund raising event exhibiting works from over 80 artists and raising over £1,300. This years Art Show will be on the Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July 2009.

The Village Fete, a joint venture with All Saints Church, was very successful raising over £3,500 under the new Chairmanship of

Jackie Feehan and also providing a fun event for all the villagers. It was good that the event was also supported by several of our local businesses. This year's fete will be on Saturday September 12<sup>th</sup> 2009.

The Charity also jointly organised with the Parish Council a Village Barn Dance which was a well attended and fun event dancing to Lyckerty Splyt.

The Charity have used some of the funds raised this year to reequip the upstairs meeting room with new furniture which will provide a more comfortable environment and hopefully encourage greater use of the facility. We are obtaining estimates for the main hall floor to be resurfaced and hope to replace the floor in the coming year.

The cooperation between the Charity and the Parish Council has been enhanced with regular liaison meetings which have brought about a number of detailed improvements and suggestions

If you are reading this report have you considered joining the committee? We would welcome new members to assist in the future development of the Charity.


### **EAST HANNINGFIELD WI**



We look forward to welcoming back existing pupils and our new children on Monday, 7<sup>th</sup> September.



Every year, millions of innocent people lose money to scams that come by post or phone such as fake lottery and prize draw wins, bogus psychic predictions and 'miracle' health cures. Avoid becoming a victim by following some simple tips.

Never reply straight away to an offer. Speak to a relative, friend, neighbour or carer before you do anything.

Never send money to anyone who says you've won the lottery or a big prize— you'll never see your promised winnings.

Never give your bank account details or other personal information to people you don't know.

Never ring a 090 number unless you're certain how much the call will cost and know what you are likely to receive.

Never send money off in response to psychic mailings. Identical letters predicting good or bad luck are sent to thousands of people.

If you suspect a scam, before sending any money call **Consumer Direct** for clear, practical advice on **08454 04 05 06**.

Millenium crime—There were three, night time car key crimes on 24 July in neighbouring parishes. In all cases unknown suspects gained entry to a secure property by forcing a door. The cost of the damaged varied between £100 and £1,000. In all cases they stole various items and a set of car keys. They then used the car keys to steal and drive away in a silver Nissan Navara, a BMW Series 3, and a BMW 520D. The estimated total value of the stolen items varied between £11,000 and the low five figures. This type of crime, known as Millennium burglary, is an ongoing problem in the Town and surrounding area. Always keep your keys (car and house keys) somewhere safe and out of sight. Take your house and car keys upstairs when you go to bed.

Dc Guy Pearcy said: "In a significant number of night-time burglaries, criminals gain entry to the property through an insecure uPVC door. The all too common scenario is that members of the public retire to bed with a shut front door and the handle pulled up which engages the five or so extra locks along the sides and top and bottom of the door. However, unless the key is then used to lock the door, engaging these extra locks into place, then the door is NOT fully secure. Unfortunately, this simple act of not locking the door from inside can leave your property vulnerable to criminals."


### PARISH COUNCIL

If you would like to get involved with the Parish Paths Team please contact Peter Applegate on 400773. The Team is going to be erecting fingerposts, strimming weeds, repairing bridges and generally improving our parish footpath network as a leisure resource and as a means for pedestrians to get from A to B.

The Borough Council is currently consulting on five of its Local Development Framework (planning policy) documents. The document of the most direct interest to residents of East Hanningfield is called *Site Allocations*. It covers such topics as the industrial area, the protected lane, a site for affordable housing and the defined settlement boundary (village envelope). There are no specific sites allocated for gypsy/travellers but there is a "call for sites", which is a request for proposals for sites. The five documents will be available to view at an exhibition in the Village Hall on Monday 7th. December from 2.30-4pm. Borough Council planning officers will be present to answer questions. You can also find the documents on the Borough Council's website www.chelmsford.gov.uk by clicking on *Local Development Framework*.

The Parish Council, working with Martyn Gard, has been consulting the residents who use the access to the Gard site with a view to improving safety for pedestrians using the Tye footpath. If you are walking from the direction of the Church you cannot see vehicles coming from Gards and their drivers can't see you until you are crossing the access. PC and Martyn Gard hope to improve visibility and slow down vehicles leaving the site. In the meantime, please be aware of the danger. When delivering the letters to the residents, I was crossing the access when a Parcel Force van appeared coming towards me at great speed and it was only my fleet of foot that saved me, as the driver had no chance of breaking in that short distance to miss me. I don't think he even tried!

An issue that was identified several times in the written notes in the



Parish Plan questionnaire was the problem of trees and hedges overgrowing footpaths. And as this is the season for hedging (and ditching) this is an opportunity for me to remind everyone whose property has a path alongside to walk along it to check whether a stray bramble scratches passersby, or people pushing buggies will have to step in the road to avoid the over or under growth.

Also, I've received a request to ask that you check the paths to the side or front of your property for leaves. Most of them will have fallen by now and they are starting to rot down into a slippery mess. A few minutes sweeping could prevent a nasty accident.

Another request is to ask drivers not to drive across or park on the grass verges. There are residents who look after the verges beside their properties and it is very disappointing for them to find tyre tracks and muddy bare patches due to inconsiderate and illegal parking. Some parking on bends is blocking sight lines and creating causing dangerous road conditions.



# **EMERGENCY PLANNING - what does it mean?**

In recent years there has been a number of incidents throughout the country including severe flooding, major fire and severe weather conditions which meant that local authorities had to provide shelter, food and sometimes accommodation for members of the communities affected. Help has been relatively easy to provide because the local authorities had emergency plans in place. Chelmsford Borough Council is leading the way in preparing for dealing with emergencies and continues to develop strategies that will help communities in the event of a crisis.

The introduction of the Civil Contingencies Act 2004 has meant some fundamental changes in the way that Local Authorities deal with Emergency Planning issues. The Act has moved the emphasis of civil protection from being one of just planning and responding to emergencies towards resilience planning arrangements (which also includes response arrangements) and in doing so has placed new emergency planning duties on Local Authorities.

To ensure the most efficient deployment of resources, there is a working arrangement with Maldon District Council to provide a Joint Emergency Planning Unit. As part of our strategy we have produced guides to Business Continuity Planning and Developing a Community Safety Plan and advice leaflets all of which can be viewed on our website www.chelmsfordemergency.info

Effective planning relies heavily on volunteers from the Council's staff and the community to man predesignated Rest Centres within each community. We intend to continue to harness the enthusiasm and local knowledge of volunteers within Parishes by developing a Community Safety Plan to help each community help themselves.

We are encouraging Parish Councils to take the lead in this in line with Chelmsford Borough Council's strategy to continue to provide advice, guidance and training.

What another busy year.




As we close on another

The main issues for the parish are protection of Back Lane, change in the village boundary to include the school and village hall and proposed 15 dwellings between Old Church Road and Back Lane. Crime Update: Over the past year, houses on The Tye, The Common, Old Church Road, Highfields Mead, Bicknacre Road, and our Post Office received unwelcome visits, highlighting the need for care and vigilance. If you know something about these contact Chelmsford police or call Crime stoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. Houses with expensive cars continue to be burgled for the car keys across the county. If your pride and joy is left on the drive overnight or when you are away, think about your house and key security.

Information Card: With this Newsletter you should find enclosed, a card NhW with Police & NhW contact details. Keep it handy for reference—maybe with those cards for the refuse collection days?

Website: The village NhW website has been updated - just "google" the words "east hanningfield neighbourhood watch" and it should find us on the Parish Council's web site.

Winter Reminder: By making houses look occupied, homes are less likely to be targeted. Burglary, on the whole, is an opportunist crime so keep side gates locked, accessible windows closed, no tools/ladder or "hidden" spare key left out. If you are away, don't leave milk or parcels on the doorstep, or newspapers/mail visible in porch. Always leave house lit after dark, draw the curtains, leave a radio playing. Install outdoor lights with movement/light sensors. Neighbourhood Watch Marking Kit, Window Stickers & Advice Leaflets are all still available from NhW team.

**E-mailed NhW Crime Alerts:** Some people in the village already receive NhW local crime updates via email. To receive them just email: geoff.dickman@benlineagencies.com and get on distribution. 





I shall take this opportunity to remind hedge owners that there is still time before bird nesting begins to cut your hedges back.

Another matter raised, although not in great numbers, was a call for more allotments. I have been looking at garden sharing schemes that have been set up in various communities around the country, and think it is a scheme that might work here. The idea is that people who want to grow vegetables, or flowers, for their own personal or family use do so in gardens belonging to people who have more ground than they can manage. Usually the rent is paid in a proportion of the vegetables harvested. As there isn't a horticultural group in the village that could run such a scheme, it would be necessary for a new group or club to set itself up. If you are interested in participating in a garden sharing club, please email or phone me and I will pass on your details to everyone else who gets in touch, so that you can get a group started. I can also pass on a standard tenancy agreement, so that you could make a start.

The Questionnaire results also showed that some residents were unaware that we have visits from the **mobile library**, so I thought I should tell you the times here. The library visits fortnightly on a Thursday. The forthcoming dates are 11th. & 25th. March, and 8th. & 22nd. April. It parks in the Village Hall car park 2.50-3.30pm and in Ashley Green 3.35 - 4pm. The times and dates are posted in the Village Diary on PC's website. As the visit to the Village Hall car park coincides with the end of the School day,

please consider whether it is really necessary for you to drive to the Village Hall, Post Office, School or playing field on library afternoons.

At the Meeting in November PC set its Precept for the financial year 2010/11. The Precept is the amount of money that the Borough Council must collect on behalf of PC from residents of the parish through the Council Tax. The amount precepted was £29,874 which was £415.50 less than the previous year.





## **BOROUGH COUNCILLOR'S MESSAGE**

You may well have seen the scaffolding around the Civic Centre and heard about the work being done to try to bring a very old building up to date and to provide facilities commensurate with this century. ### FROM REVEREND PAM

At last the winter is coming to an end and the bulbs are beginning to push their way through the earth and head towards the sun. There's a certain relief in seeing this happen and having the assurance, yet again, that new life and summer days are on their way. Perhaps this is not unlike the sense of relief after the birth of a child when you know that the baby has finally come into the world safe and sound. A feeling of thankfulness can follow automatically at a time like this and it is not unusual to want to express this in some way.

In the church we offer two kinds of services for such an occasion. One is a thanksgiving for a child. This is when you want to celebrate the birth of a child and give public thanks in the house of God for the baby or child. Friends and family are invited, and sponsoring friends can be chosen who will promise to support parents in bringing up the child. During this service the parents make no promises but simply express their thanks in public in the words of the service. The other kind of service is a christening (or baptism). In this service the parents make promises that they will bring up the child in the family of the church. This implies parents want to become part of the church. Godparents are chosen who will promise to support the parents in the spiritual care and upbringing of their child. A baptism service may follow after a thanksgiving at a later date when parents feel they are ready to make the promises.

We are pleased to offer either kind of service in All Saints' church. It you are thinking of a christening, I would be delighted to discuss it with you and give you some information to think about in order to help you decide. On the first Sunday of each month we hold an All Age service (10.00am) and we have a growing number of young children who come. This is a good service to come to to get the feel of starting your child on the exciting journey of faith in Jesus Christ.

### **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

Crime Update: NhW is not aware of any reported crimes in East Hanningfield since the last Newsletter but we know there have been burglaries in surrounding villages highlighting the ongoing need for care and vigilance. Many of these burglaries continue to be purely for the purpose of stealing car keys, especially expensive cars.

There has been a spate of electrical cabling (power, telecomm and railway signalling) thefts in Essex. Companies like EDF and BT always work from vans with a company logo so if you see any other type of van in suspicious circumstances call Essex Police on 0300 333 4444. If you have information on any crime you can call Crime stoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Recent Scams & Bogus Callers: A number were reported over this period:

Person phoning, claiming falsely to be a police officer investigating credit card fraud, and then attended the address to collect banks cards and numbers.

Bogus calls from a group claiming to be Barclaycard. Never give anyone any person bank or card details over the phone - call them back on the tel no on your statement to confirm it's a genuine enquiry.

People received a card from Parcel Delivery Service (PDS) claiming they have tried to deliver a parcel. The card gives a 0906 (Premium rate) number to arrange delivery - there is no parcel and you will be charged £15.00 for the call.

Persons claiming to be phoning from Sky TV ask if you have experienced any problems. They then ask if you pay by monthly subscription and ask for your bank details to clarify who you are. Sky would not make any such request, so be warned.

Which? Computing say consumers across the country have been called by a bogus Microsoft internet service provider saying there's a virus on the person's PC and then asking the person for remote access to fix the problem (and gain access to bank

details). To add insult to injury, they are also asked to give their credit card details in order to pay a fee for the repair).

Winter Reminder: Houses that look occupied are less likely to be targeted. Always leave house lit after dark, draw the curtains, leave a radio playing. Install outdoor lights with movement/light sensors.



It looks like a giant handset for a computer game. It stands on the ground and has large buttons that you have to hit or kick. Playing it tests reaction times and involves running and stretching and using lots of energy. It looks like fun, so keep an eye out for the posters and the entry in the Village Diary on the website. You can see it for yourself at http://www.playneos.com/. It will be at the Village Hall car park from 10am to 3pm on Friday, 6th. August.

In order to continue to comply with its Quality Status, amongst many things, PC has to publish an Annual Report by the end of June for the year just passed. Council years run from the Annual Meeting in May. The Annual Report for 2009-2010 was presented to the Annual Assembly on 19th. May. You can read it online at PC's website, on the noticeboard in the Village Hall lobby or request a paper copy from me. It contains a report by the Chairman, Peter Applegate, of the year's activities and the Council's receipts and payments account for the financial year 2009/10.

The website continues to grow and contains a great deal of local information which could be useful for school homework or local history research in the *Publications* section under *Study Resources*. In addition the *Village Diary* contains dates and times for local events, and this year the pictures are old photographs of the village

with their modern equivalents.

Forthcoming Parish Council Meetings will be on the following Thursday evenings, 24th. June, 22nd.July and 12th. August. They will begin at 8pm unless a guest speaker is invited to attend. Local residents are welcome to attend, as these are public meetings, and may address the Council about local concerns during Public Question Time which takes place shortly after the opening of each meeting. If you have a matter which will require a decision by the Council please send it to me in writing to arrive a week before the meeting date. This will allow it to be included in the Agenda for the meeting. The Agenda can be viewed on the PC's noticeboards, which are situated on the Tye opposite the Windmill, at the Bicknacre Road junction and inside the Village Hall entrance, and can be downloaded from the website. Minutes are also on the website.



Criminal damage / vandalism to our village hall and surrounding area in March. Is there no end to such wanton and mindless stupidity?

Burglary to a house on The Tye during April and an attempted burglary elsewhere in our village also in April.

Millennium burglary (this week someone broke into a house in Bicknacre overnight and stole the keys for a Mercedes E320).

Thefts of catalytic converters from vehicles parked outside private houses and large retail parks in Chelmsford district. The Police recommend having your catalytic converters etched with the vehicle registration number – watch this space for further information.

Thefts from shoppers in car parks in our district.

The advice as always is if you see or hear of anything remotely suspicious call Essex Police asap on their non-emergency number 0300 333 4444. And if you have information on any crime you can call Crime Stoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. But, if you see or hear of anything that could be serious, such as gunshot sounds (though not necessarily caused by a gun) then dial 999 immediately. Let the Police decide whether something is really serious or not.

geoff.dickman@benlineagencies.com to get on the distribution. More and more people in the village receive these to stay aware of what's happening in our district and receive security information.

Holiday Reminder: Houses that look occupied are less likely to be targeted. Always leave your house lit after dark, and if possible, leave a radio playing. Install outdoor lights with movement light sensors. But don't leave your curtains drawn during daylight hours.








## FROM THE CHURCHWARDENS

The Waiting Game—How are you at waiting? Are you one of those people whose blood pressure rises when you are in a long line at the checkout counter of ASDA? And it gets worse — after an already long wait, the person at the front of the line needs a price check on an unmarked item. I have to confess that the issue of waiting is one of those areas of my living where God has richly blessed me with an opportunity for much growth!

None more so than our recent team visit to Kenya. After the most amazing time spent working at a kids home, we arrived at Nairobi Airport to find flight BA064 to Heathrow - CANCELLED. Little did we know then, that the 'volcanic ash cloud' would eventually delay our flight for a further TEN days.

Yet – waiting is a central part of life. When you think about it, we spend a huge chunk of our lives waiting.—Waiting to hear if you got the job.—Waiting for the doctor to call.—Waiting for your teenager to come home with the car.—Waiting for true love to come into your life.

But there is a more insidious kind of waiting. A waiting that almost escapes our attention in spite of the fact that it eats away at the meaning of our lives. What are we ultimately waiting for?

At Bethel, we recently did a series of Bible studies that was about exactly this. 'Don't Waste Your Life'. To recognise the plans and purposes that God has for us, if only we seek Him and submit to His ways.

The Psalmist puts it like this:

This was to address cars and coaches going down Old Church Road in error, turning in driveways, blocking the road etc in addition to people being lost (It would however remove the sport of sitting outside The Windmill in the summer and redirecting lost drivers!).

The reason I mention this is that roads, speeding and pavements were matters of high importance at the public meetings. All the issues were debated and where appropriate actions suggested – many however are the gift of other agencies (funding permitting). The importance of the plan is to act as reference for these agencies.

We are now drawing all this together and the committee are writing the first draft.






## **COVER PHOTOGRAPHS**

The top photograph, which was taken over 100 years ago, is of the old church which burned down in December 1883. In the early part of the nineteenth century it had fallen into disrepair and after years of fundraising it was closed for a year for repairs, opening on 14th. April 1843. The nave contained wall paintings dating from about 1300 depicting Adam digging and Eve spinning, St. Katherine holding a wheel and a book, and Cain and Abel. Following the fire, the chancel which retained its roof was used as a mortuary chapel.

The lower photograph shows the present church about 100 years ago. The foundation stone of the new church was laid in July 1884 and construction was completed in June 1885, which is why during the Summer there were celebrations to mark its 125th. Anniversary.

The photograph is detail taken from a postcard sent from the front in April 1915, but was probably taken before the war began.

### PARISH COUNCIL

Those of you with concessionary bus passes will probably have noticed that they run out at the end of March. This is because from April administration of the bus passes will transfer from the Borough Council to Egga County County



from the Borough Council to Essex County Council. In preparation for this change, the County Council is consulting users on what they consider to be the most important aspects of the bus pass provision. At this time of serious cost cutting you can be sure that any aspect of the provision that is not shown to be highly valued will be in danger of cancellation. At the moment these passes can be used from 9am until midnight on weekdays and all day on Saturday and Sunday, but the national requirement is that they should be usable from 9.30am until 11pm on weekdays and at all times at weekends and bank holidays. There is therefore scope for a reduction of the time they can be used.

The consultation period lasts until 30th. September so you still have time to tell the County Council what provision is important to you. Consultation forms have been available in the Post Office since July and should also be available in libraries and Council offices. You can complete the form online at www.essex.gov.uk/buspass/ or telephone 08457 430 430 to request a copy. The Parish Council is concerned that anyone who presently catches the 9.24 to attend doctors' appointments at Great Baddow would have to wait until the 11.18 to use the bus pass, should Essex return to the 9.30 start.

Still on the subject of buses, there is to be a new **Service 5** on **Thursdays**. It will leave the Windmill stop at 9am and travel through Bicknacre, Danbury, Woodham Walter and Beeliegh and arrive at the Maldon Tesco store at 9.49 and the Maldon Morrisons at 9.55. The return trip will leave Morrisons at 11.45, Tesco at 11.50 and arrive back at East Hanningfield at 12.38. During the first part of the journey, between East Hanningfield and Bicknacre

it will be a "Hail and Ride" service. Service 5 runs from 2nd September. Please note that to accomplish this new provision, the number Service 3 08:54 to Chelmsford on a Thursday has been withdrawn.

Responses to the Parish Plan Questionnaire seemed to indicate that there was local interest in increased provision of allotments. Our neighbouring parish, Sandon has identified a plot of land beside the Southend Road at Howe Green as a possible allotment site, but has had so little interest that, at the moment, they are unable to proceed with the proposal.



If you are looking for an allotment and would like one at Howe Green, please contact the Clerk to Sandon Parish Council by email at <a href="mailto:sandonparishclerk@btopenworld.com">sandonparishclerk@btopenworld.com</a> or on 01245 227734, as soon as possible, because the proposal is going to be shelved if too few registrations of interest are received.

Still on the subject of the Parish Plan, editing is progressing and the finished document is expected to go to print in mid September. Although still very much a draft document, it looks as though it is going to be a 24 page A4 booklet for the Plan with a separate loose leaf, updateable action plan as an insertion. It is intended that every household and business should receive a copy, and there will be a large print version available to those who need it. It will also be accessible on the Parish Plan website www.essexinfo.net/easthanningfield-parishplan/ where there is a "Listen" facility that will read the text to you. This facility is also available on the Parish Council's website.

Another activity requested in the responses to the Parish Plan Questionnaire was more village dances, so some of you will be pleased to learn that there is going to be a charity barn dance at the Village Hall on Saturday18 September to raise funds for Chelmsford Mencap's adult events. The barn dance starts at

7:30pm with music and a caller provided by George and the Trombones. There will be a fish and chip supper, or alternative by previous arrangement. Guests can bring their own drinks. Price: Adults £14, Children £10. For tickets please contact Vanessa Hellier Tel: 0797 657 8868.



PC continues to have site meetings with County Council Highways officers to discuss local highways problems. This can be a frustrating exercise as actions agreed last year are still awaiting funding. Nevertheless, new projects have recently been added to the list and are being investigated for viability. In particular, a reduction in the 40mph speed limit in Old Church Road to 30mph is to be considered by the Traffic Management Team at County Hall when they conduct their review of speed limits. A reduction of the speed limit along the Tye will also be considered.

Since the general election there have been many policy outline announcements coming from central government which might affect PC, and in most cases the consequences cannot be ascertained until the details are published, but some proposals such as the requirement for a parish poll for increasing the council tax, the publication of individual expenditure items over £500 and the annual audit by private auditors rather than the Audit Commission look as though they are going to cause increases in expenditure, so developments are being monitored with interest.

PC Meetings for the next quarter will continue on the fourth Thursday of the month, at 8pm in the first floor meeting room at the Village Hall. If you come along to listen or participate in Public Question Time, please use the side entrance, as the connecting door with the rest of the Hall will be locked.

### PARISH COUNCIL

Over the weekend of 13th/14th. November, the majority of households received their copy of the **East Hanningfield Parish Plan 2010.** If you didn't get one please contact the steering group secretary Malcolm Thomas on 400797 or <a href="mailto:mc.thomas@talk21.com">mc.thomas@talk21.com</a>. A large print version is available. Now that the Parish Plan is complete the next task could be the production of a village design statement if there are enough interested residents to undertake the project. If you would like to see what a VDS looks like there are currently ten on the Borough Council's website and a further three, Sandon, Great Baddow & Danbury, there as part of the Local Development Framework consultation. See www.chelmsford.gov.uk. Please let me have your contact details if you are interested in getting an East Hanningfield VDS underway.

One of the actions identified by the Youth element of the Parish Plan was that local young people would like information about activities for them on the parish website. The Local Contacts page on the website has links to several organisations providing activities for young, and older, residents.

Another action identified in the Plan was to continue to assist residents to recycle more easily, and Tetrapaks were given as an example. PC has been trying to get a Tetrapak recycling bin for the village, but it is proving difficult. PC has not given up on this idea and efforts will continue. In the meantime if you happen to go to Danbury or Asda at South Woodham you can recycle your paks there, admittedly not very conveniently. On the other hand you can cut them in half and use them for growing cuttings or seeds!

The four year term of office of the present Parish Council comes to an end in May, when all seven seats are up for election. The election is scheduled for Thursday 5th. May. If there are seven or fewer candidates there will not be a poll, ie. voting at the polling station, and the election will be declared uncontested, which

means the candidates will take their seats at the appropriate time. The election timetable has been published already, and the Notice of Election will be published on 28th. March and nominations should then be submitted to the Returning Officer at Chelmsford Borough Council by 5th. April. I shall remind you about these dates in the next News.



This advance notice gives those who might consider standing for a place on the Parish Council the opportunity to find out what the Parish Council and its councillors do. You could read Minutes of Meetings on the website. You could talk to the present Councillors, and you can find their contact details on the website and the Parish Council noticeboards

Apart from this month's Meeting which has been brought forward to 9th. December to avoid the holiday period and the run-up to Christmas, PC Meetings continue on the **fourth Thursday** of each month, at 8pm in the first floor meeting room at the Village Hall. The Agenda for each meeting is posted on the PC noticeboards and the website three days before, and printed copies are available at meetings. All PC Meetings are open to the public, and the meeting room is warm and the chairs comfortable, so you don't need to worry about sitting on a hard seat in the cold!

Members of the public are now better able to follow what is being discussed at PC meetings because plans and documents being considered are displayed on an overhead screen. You might not be aware of it but the Village Hall has internet access, so it is possible to find information from County and Borough Council websites should the need arise during a Meeting, and satellite views have proved very useful when discussing planning issues as the photographic detail of the parish is very good.

The PC Budget for the 2011/12 financial year was due to be set at the November Meeting. If you would like to see the Budget and find out the level of Parish Council Tax for next year it will be included in the published Minutes of the meeting for 25th. November. At the time of writing it looked as though there would be no increase on last year's figure. If you are wondering what PC does with the money, PC contracts for the mowing of the village green and playing fields, contributes towards maintenance of the churchyard and litter picking around the Village Hall and playing field, pays for groundswork at various points around the village and supports Hanna's Field Charity in its projects and Preschool as well.


to start a PSP club for my friends at Sandon School.



## **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

We've noticed that some houses are in darkness in the evenings and some have their curtains drawn during daylight, indicating possibly that nobody is at home. These are both invitations for the opportunist burglar to pay you a visit! Would anybody put up a sign saying "we're out, please come inside and help

If you have a side gate, ensure that it is locked at night or when you are out because burglars prefer to gain access via a back door or window where they are less likely to be observed. Cars should always be locked with valuables out of sight. House and car keys should not be left visible from outside, as burglars break in quite easily then drive off, with your valuables, using your car.

Apologies for these constant reminders, but clearly some residents are not listening and criminals are still active in our village. For example jewellery and £30 cash were stolen from a resident. Garden ornaments have been taken on several occasions from front gardens. One resident had a strange call from somebody purporting to be from BT. Others have had suspicious e-mails claiming to be Inland Revenue offering a tax refund and asking for bank details. If you get one of these forward it to <a href="mailto:phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk">phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk</a>. HMRC do not send e-mails that:- notify customers of eligibility to a repayment or, request personal information or payment.

And of course there was the East Hanningfield cannabis factory!

Please call the Police if you see anything even remotely suspicious. Let the Police decide whether or not the incident is serious or not. And please also let me know so we can alert our team. Our team consists of 20 street co-ordinators, although we could do with a few more. Another 30 residents receive Police crime reports and

advice about home security precautions. If you would like to be added to our list please let me know.

Please note that PCSO Graeme Gordon has left the area in order to become a Police Constable and has been replaced by PCSO Spencer Bond. 
If you are interested in taking part in the running of the sessions, please let Rose or me know; we are always grateful for a helping hand, and it means that we can share the workload.






