

PARISH COUNCIL

Thank you to those, who at the Village Fete, registered their interest in participating in a Village Design group. Unfortunately, there were not enough of you to make a viable group, so PC is still looking for a few more people who would like to take part. Please get in touch if you are interested.

The dance to celebrate the Village Hall's 25th. Anniversary, mentioned in the last News, was a success although we could have squeezed a few more in easily. The band proved to be entertaining with a varied repertoire.

If you voted in the County Council by-election you probably already know that our new County Councillor is Ian Grundy. You can contact him in writing at cllr.ian.grundy@essex.gov.uk or at Glenwood, 5 Thornton Place, Stock CM4 9NQ.

For one of the Play in the Park sessions during August, PC booked a cycling coach to attend, the intention being that the children would have some fun riding their bikes under supervision. It turned out to be a very wet day, so the coach decided to have a session indoors showing the children how to maintain their bikes. This turned out to be a lucky turn of events, because some of the bikes were in a dangerous condition. It seems that some bikes nowadays are bought in kit form and have to be put together, and it is possible to put them together incorrectly. As we are coming up to Christmas when children often receive a new bike, it is a good time to warn parents that bikes that come "flat packed" must be built exactly according to the instructions and not by guesswork, because your child's life could depend upon it.

I am often asked what is happening about the Fairlawns and Three Horseshoes sites, as they seem to have been under development for such a long time. The developer at Fairlawns recently made an application to renew the planning permission for 3 detached houses and 2 double garages granted in 2008 but then withdrew

it because the existing permission lasts until 2013. We are likely to see something happening at this site soon. Development of the site will result in a "planning obligation" for PC of about £3,000 to spend on the Village Hall or playing fields. A further £6,000 will go to the County Council to spend on "ongoing traffic calming initiatives in East Hanningfield". At the Horseshoes permission was granted in August to remove the decking in order to create extra parking provision and to build a single storey extension on the back, and you will probably have noticed that the decking has already gone.

At the time of writing it looks as though PC will soon achieve a full set of 7 councillors again, there having been a vacancy since the election in May. Watch this space for more news on this.

Parish Council Meetings are public meetings, which means anyone is permitted to attend. This PC takes this further and invites residents to attend and bring to the Council's notice matters of local concern. This can be done by speaking during Public Question Time, or by writing to me a letter for inclusion on the next Agenda. The Agenda is published three clear days before each Meeting and can be found on the noticeboards at the Bicknacre Road junction, beside the post-box on the Tye and in the window of the Village Hall entrance lobby. It is also published on the website, where you can also find Minutes, Annual Reports and Audited Accounts going back to 2005/6. There are also copies of East Hanningfield News going back to Autumn 2004, plus the first five editions starting with Summer 1974.

Meetings generally take place on the **FOURTH** Thursday of each month, except December, and begin at 8pm. You can find them in the first floor Meeting room at the Village Hall. Please use the side entrance door, because the connecting door to the main Hall will be locked.


The bus leaves from the stop at the Windmill Tavern, takes Bicknacre Road, arrives at All Saints' Church at the top of Maldon High Street at 9.45am, then down Market Hill to Tesco supermarket, arriving at Morrisons store before 10am.

The bus leaves Morrisons on its return journey at 11.45am, picks up at Tesco 5 minutes later, then back up the hill to the White Horse in the High Street at 11.55am, providing plenty of time to do whatever has to be done. There are, of course, comfortable refreshment facilities in both supermarkets. We arrive back in East Hanningfield soon after 12.30pm. The service is provided primarily for shoppers so the driver is willing to stop, if safe to do so, at points along the route, either to pick up or drop off.

This Christmas we will be preparing two Christmas dinners as not all our family can come on the same day. Both lots of family are anticipating a Christmas dinner as part of our celebrations together so on Boxing Day we will be pretending it's Christmas day again. What we expect of Christmas celebrations differ but most of us have an ideal of how it should be.

Our traditional Christmas is now made up from many sources -for example, from Dickens' stories, from recipes from the East, from decorations borrowed from other lands. We combine it all together and mix it with festive hospitality and perhaps family and friend reunions. In all of this it is easy to miss out on the quiet beauty and wonder of that first Christmas and the meaning it still has for us.

The Village Fete may seem a distant memory to many of us now, but this is our first opportunity to thank publicly the Committee and all those who worked so hard to ensure its success. We are most grateful for All Saints' share of the £3,424 which was raised, which helps us with our responsibility for maintaining the 127 year old building in a good state of repair.

Church heating was mentioned as a problem area in the Autumn News. A repair was effected which we trust will see us through the winter, but the Church Council have decided that, in view of the age and fragility of the 127 year old system, they must act responsibly and begin to plan for its replacement. Consultations with the Church architect are now taking place, and not least to see how best to integrate this with the project for installing toilet and kitchen facilities which we long to have available.

Community Service Teams have once again been a great help in maintaining the grounds around the church building for which we thank them. They have, alas, suffered from cut-backs during the past season and have been unable to make the usual number of visits. As we go to press they are due to make their last visit of the year, and we know they will do their best to leave the churchyard looking good for the winter as in the past.

Carol Singing round the village is being planned for the evening of Saturday 17th December, commencing at 5.00 pm at the Village Hall. All Saints' and Bethel will be combining as last year for another joyous and melodious evening together. All are welcome to join us. Look out for notices about our route. Bring a torch.

What will be your lasting impression of the year 2011? As a nation we experienced a real sense of community during the Royal wedding. Yet it wasn't always happy times. Our fragile economy still continues and it appears that it will be a fair few years before we see any meaningful recovery.

But I think it was the August riots that took place across England that left us all with a range of emotions. Anger? Outrage? Despair? Particularly when we see how young some of the people were that got involved with looting and wanton vandalism.

The aftermath brought about a lot of finger pointing. The politicians blaming disenfranchised youngsters. Young people blaming the politicians. Etc, etc.

But whilst there is a lot of bad press towards the youth culture of today, it was heartening to hear the stories which three of the young people from Bethel Church brought back from their time spent in Latvia.

Mary-Anna, Shaun and Megan were part of a team that helped at a Christian youth event called 'One Way Camp' - just outside of the capital, Riga. The aim of the camp is evangelism and discipling and there are many opportunities to present the Christian Gospel message. The large meeting hall is transformed into 'God Zone' for the morning and evening sessions. In the morning there is a worship time plus a teaching session. In the evening there is a full programme of testimonies, singing, worship, quizzes, drama and dance.....and a lot of high jinx as this YouTube link will show you.

These same three young people were also part of a bigger Bethel youth team that worked so hard in Kenya – restoring an orphanage and playing with young children, many of whom have HIV/AIDS. Seeing these young people roll up their sleeves and get stuck in certainly makes you think that there are some great kids in this

country, and closer to home, East Hanningfield.

Who knows what 2012 will bring. We have the much anticipated Olympic Games to look forward to - and who knows, a Brit may even win Wimbledon.

But let's pray that as a nation, we will be able to restore some national pride and experience a time of peace and reconciliation.

As we approach Christmas, it is a time to consider a message of hope at a time of uncertainty. Please come and join us to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Also, look out for us as we team up with All Saints Church to sing carols around the village on Saturday 17 December.

Local Crime update:

Recognising reputable traders: There have been regular warnings from NhW about bogus callers, but how do we recognise reputable traders? You can find out on the East Hanningfield NhW website. The indicators of how to recognise a reputable trader are: they present a valid personal identification and identify who they represent—they make it clear from the outset if they are selling something—they provide written information on cooling off periods and cancellation rights—they do not use pressure to sell goods or services- they do not expect an on-the-spot decision—they leave as soon as they are asked to do so. Lights On! With the dark evenings, it's time to think about not leaving "tell tale" signs that your home is empty and vulnerable. The art of illusion is to make it look as though someone is home. Provide that first impression to the opportunist burglar that this house is occupied! For the illusion use table lamps on timers (don't use energy saving bulbs with digital timers: it shortens the life of the bulb) or use a "dusk till dawn" sensor (bulbs are available with a built in sensor), a radio on a talking programme, it all helps. You can even buy a device now called "Fake TV" that mimics the light from a TV. And as we approach Christmas, NhW will again receive police reports of burglaries where the family presents, often conveniently left on display around the Christmas tree, have been stolen. Please keep them safe and out of sight.

How to Report Incidents or Suspicious Activity to the Police. Call 999 if a crime is in progress or a vehicle or person is acting suspiciously (you won't be wasting Police time). For non urgent incidents dial the new short code 101 (this replaces the old Essex Police 0300 333 44444 number). You can give information anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.


