#### PARISH COUNCIL

If you have been following PC on Facebook, the website or the noticeboards you will already know that 5 Parish Councillors were elected unopposed. By the time this News reaches you, both of the remaining seats will have been filled by co-option. The local council sector, which includes town, parish and community councils, comes in for some criticism because unopposed elections, where there is no poll, do not give the electorate the opportunity to choose who their representatives will be. There is a counter argument that a dissatisfied electorate would have found some candidates to fight for the seats, and avoiding a poll saves the parish a considerable sum. In this case the difference between a contested and non contested election was expected to be about £1,000.

Your Parish Councillors for the next four years are Peter Applegate, Les Draper, Paul Garner, Martyn Gard, Jim Howe, Steve Kibble and Karen Saynor. City Councillors Matt Flack and Richard Poulter were re-elected, and Richard has asked me to convey his thanks to all of you who voted for him. Our Member of Parliament John Whittingdale was also re-elected. You can find all their contact details on the PC noticeboards and o the website.

Those of you who are concerned by speeding traffic will be interested to know that the Community Speedwatch Team is looking for new recruits. Training will be given to new volunteers, so there is no need to worry that you wouldn't know what to do. Please get in touch if you would like to get involved.

The transfer of the Catherine Close play area from the City Council to PC moves forward very slowly. What was thought initially to be a straightforward process has been strewn with complications that have each caused a delay, but it is still progressing, if at a snail's pace. In the meantime, the grass is now being mown by PC's contractor to make sure that it is kept manageable in preparation for the transfer. Also, PC sent me on a RoSPA course so that I can carry out the regular inspections between the annual RoSPA visits. Many of us are getting increasingly frustrated by the deterioration of the broadband provision in the village. At times it is like a return to the bad old dial-up days. With this in mind, and the current position of an unknown date for installation of fibre optic cable, if at all, PC has invited a speaker from County Broadband to the PC Meeting on 25th. June to talk about an alternative way of receiving broadband. If you are interested you could come along to hear what he has to say, at 7.30pm before the main business of the Meeting gets underway, or you could have a look at the company's website at www.countybroadband.co.uk.

The parish's long standing public transport representative, John Al-



lenby has decided to withdraw from the role, and Parish Council's thanks go to him for his dedication to this matter on the behalf of residents. If anyone would like to take over as Transport Rep, please let me know. It would probably best suit someone who is a regular bus user, and who is

available to attend the occasional day-time meeting in Chelmsford.

There was a vote of thanks for Tony Lees at the Annual Parish Assembly, for all he had done for the parish during his time as a Parish Councillor. PC wishes him and Joyce all the best for the future.

The dates for the two planning appeals regarding proposed gypsy sites have been set. The public inquiry into the appeal against refusal of planning permission for 2 gypsy pitches with hard standing and day rooms (14/01041/FUL) and against the enforcement notice 14/00179/ENFB, May Farm, East Hanningfield Road, Sandon, will take place at Civic Centre on 10th. June, at 10am. The informal hearing into the appeal against refusal of planning permission for 5 gypsy pitches with hard standing & day rooms at land adjacent to the pumping station in Old Church Road (14/00989/FUL) will take place at Civic Centre on 17th. June. Both will be open to the public to witness the proceedings. Representatives from PC and the Ac-

tion Group with City Cllr. Poulter recently attended a meeting with planning officers in order to find out how the City Council would be approaching the East Hanningfield appeal, and are confident that all those at the meeting now understand each others' position.

PC has published its Annual Report for the year 2014-15, which contains the Receipts and Payments Account for the year, and you can find it on PC's website. Scroll down on the left hand side and you will find it under *PUBLICATIONS*. A paper copy should be hanging on the noticeboard inside the entrance lobby of the Village Hall. Please get in touch if you would like a copy and neither of the above are possible for you.

Thanks to everyone, new faces and regulars, who participated in the Village Tidy. There was a trailer load of rubbish to take away afterwards, so it was worth the effort. Unfortunately, some parts of the playing field were littered again by the next day.

There was really good attendance at the Play in the Park sessions during the school Easter break. Three more sessions are scheduled for the Summer holiday. Please see the Diary for dates & times. These activities are suitable for children aged 0-5 years if accompanied by an adult carer and for 6-11 year olds who can stay unaccompanied, but must know their carer's telephone number and have a prearranged secret word for safety reasons. These sessions will go ahead whatever the weather as both of the halls in the Village Hall have been booked, so there is no need to stay at home if it is raining.

Please note that PC Meeting in July will be earlier in the month than usual, on Thursday, 16th. Agenda are posted on the website and noticeboards three clear days before each Meeting, and Minutes are posted on the website once verified by signature. Meetings are open to the public to attend and listen and there is a Public Question Time for residents to raise issues of local concern, and of course, to ask questions.

#### PARISH COUNCIL ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO

A visit to the Record Office to search the Parish Council Minutes for any reference to the soldiers who were stationed in East Hanningfield at the beginning of the first world war proved fruitless, but some other snippets of information were found which will be relayed to you as they reach their centenary.

A public meeting had been held in the Schools (sic) on Saturday, 27th. June, 1914 "to protest about the establishment of the proposed Leper Home at Bicknacre". Correspondence ensued. Then at the PC Meeting on 14th. December, several letters from County Members of Parliament were read by the Clerk, replying to the resolutions re the Lepers' Home, which had been passed at the meeting on 27th.June. Also read was a letter from the LG Board stating that they were of the opinion that "no danger to the public health need arise from an Institution of this kind if it is administered under satisfactory conditions". No further mention was made of it, but it was established and continued many years.

Also at that Meeting "some discussion arose as to the condition of the public footpath leading to the Old Church, and it was left to the Chairman to draw the attention of the District Council Surveyor to the matter". Well, footpaths do get muddy in December.

At the Annual Assembly on 25th. March, 1915, Cllr. J. Rayner introduced the question of the establishment of a telephone exchange in the village. At the request of the meeting he agreed to approach the postal authorities and report to the next meeting of the Parish Council. At which, on 12th. April he reported a letter from the District Surveyor to the GPO promising the matter should receive attention as early as possible.

#### HANNA'S FIELD CHARITY



#### Chairman's report to the 2015 AGM

I am pleased to report on another successful year for the Charity. We have considered the priorities for developing and maintaining the facilities at the Village Hall & Playing Fields and concluded that our main effort must be directed towards replacing the roof which is leaking. I am pleased that we have been successful with our grant application to CIF who will provide £15,000 towards the cost which is expected to be £25-30,000.

There are other projects which we would like to undertake and they are all

dependent on our successful application for grants to fund each one. These projects include:

Replacing the hall roof which is 25 years old and leaking Extending the main car park with a "green" overflow car park Extending the entrance lobby and village shop Rebuilding the mountain bike mounds Ploughing, levelling and reseeding the football pitches Resurfacing the sports courts Extending the sports wall Completing a trim trail around the field to include skate board ramps Creating a Community Suite above the small hall Installing CCTV

This year we have completed, with the Preschool, the installation of an electrically operated sun blind above the children's play area. We have finished the refurbishment of the small hall with the replacement of the dividing doors. We have undertaken maintenance on the car park and ditches which appears to have resolved the flooding problem at the Scarles Croft end of the Chase. The trees around the car park have been inspected and where necessary trimmed, having first obtained the necessary permission from the Chelmsford City Council Trees Officer. We have installed a large sign on the hall so no one can reasonably ask "Is this East Hanningfield Village Hall?" in the future.

The Village Fete, a joint venture with All Saints Church, was once again successful, organised by the few for the benefit of the many. However, the current organisers have been running out of steam. We have reviewed the future viability of the Fete and decided to join forces with the Village School Parents' Association. The fete has traditionally been held in September each year. This date is not the best date for the school and we have therefore moved the new Fete to June this year. In consequence we have moved the Annual Art Exhibition to September where it will continue as a major fund raising event exhibiting works from many local artists.

We have continued running quarterly Saturday Book Sale & Coffee Mornings in the upstairs committee room. These regular events have proved to be popular and successful and we have added more shelving and storage in the loft area to expand the number of books we are able to store and display.

It is good that the Village Shop and Post Office remains in the vil-

lage. If we are to retain the Post Office and Shop in the village it is essential that we all use the facility and support Ash.

The work load of the Charity has once again been borne by very few for the benefit of the many villagers and organisations who use the facilities at the village hall and sports field. No officers or committee members receive any remuneration for their hard work; they are all volunteers and all should be thanked for their efforts on behalf of the village.

If you are listening to or reading this report have you considered joining the Committee? We would welcome new members to assist in the future development of the Charity.


However, when you come, please chat to me about what you like about church, and what you would like to see included. I will be a ready listener!

#### AND YOUR NEW CHURCHWARDEN

STOP PRESS - East Hanningfield is at the cutting edge! On 21st April we were delighted to welcome the Bishop of Bradwell John Wraw who came to All Saints' to commission Christine Horton as our Licensed Lay Minister.

During the service, Bishop John said "when I came to the Diocese of Chelmsford from Wiltshire three years ago, I can honestly say that I didn't imagine I would find myself standing here in the village of East Hanningfield stating that you, at All Saints, are at the cutting edge!" He continued "this is the way of the future and you are the first to have a Licensed Lay Minister appointed to look after your Parish. The wider church across the whole country will be looking on to see how you manage!"

We feel very fortunate to have Christine as our new Minister and also Reverend Lee Batson from Boreham as the overall Priest-in-Charge. These are long term appointments. We fully intend to do our best to be worthy of the Bishop's belief in us and to help All Saints play its rightful role in the life of the village. You are sure of a warm welcome if you would like to come along on a Sunday morning and see for yourself. Already Christine has been busy meeting many people in the village and visiting the various organisations. She has taken note of the various comments made in reply to the questionnaire I sent out a few months back and we are trying hard to incorporate them into the new service format. For example saying the traditional version of the Lord's Prayer and Creed & having hymns we know and love. The Morning Service lasts a maximum of an hour and is usually followed by a cup of tea/coffee and the chance to chat.

Do the words MESSY CHURCH mean anything to you?! It was started in a parish near Portsmouth in 2004 and now can be found all over the world, so we felt it is time that East Hanningfield had the experience too!

What is it? ... An opportunity for adults and children to enjoy a fun different version of church. It uses hands-on activities to explore Bible stories, to reflect a God of creativity and to give people a chance to play together. What it isn't ... it is not a creche nor just a craft club for youngsters only. It is not just for families, all are welcome, no upper or lower age limit, but initially it is intended for primary school age.

Dates for your diary: 26th. July, 30th. August and 20th. September. Where and when? 3pm - 4.30 pm in the Village Hall. The last 20-30 minutes we will move to the church for the children to finish with some reflective questions and short prayers, followed by light refreshments (juice, tea/coffee, cake and biscuits).

Meetings are sometimes attended by our local PCSO, Linda Samways. Most roads in the village are presented by a resident on the team, although Abbeyfields isn't.

**ECM and NhW Emails:** Police information and crime alerts are now available through the new Essex Police Electronic Community Messaging service. EH NhW filter for relevant local information to forward to East Hanningfield recipients that have requested to be on the distribution. The EH NhW email point of contact has changed from a name to a generic address which is <u>NHWEastHanning</u>-field@outlook.com. If you wish to be added to the distribution let me know or email this address. There over 80 people in the village who currently receive local crime information in this way, the e-mailed NhW information is "blind" copied to recipients so you won't see other recipients on email (and they won't see you). Alternatively you can log onto the ECM website and set up to receive Essex Police messages direct, if you prefer, using the link below: (http://www.essex.police.uk/contact\_us/community\_messaging.aspx).

**Police Street Meets:** Essex Police Chief Constable Stephen Kavanagh started a new concept called "Street Meet" in November 2014. These are intended to be informal meetings of up to an hour long providing a chance for members of the public to speak to the local area officer about community policing issues you may have or for crime prevention advice. The EH Street Meets have started and have so far been at the Post Office, attended by PCSO Samways. 

The UK is the seventh richest country in the world, yet at the same time, millions of families across the UK are living below the breadline. Oxfam and Church Action on Poverty have calculated that 20,247,042 meals were given to people in food poverty in 2013/14 by the three main food aid providers.

We have also seen a huge rise of Food Banks in our nation. Since 2010 the number of food banks has risen from 66 to 421, while around 900,000 people received free food parcels last year.

There appears to be a growth of families who have fallen on hard times, through different circumstances I'm sure, but need our help.

Jesus puts into words a wonderful perspective when considering what our response should be to those who are in need.

In Matthew's gospel (25:34-40) he says, "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, <u>http://biblehub.com/matthew/25-36.htm/</u> needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'
