PARISH COUNCIL

As mentioned in the previous edition of the News, a defibrillator was purchased by PC and was installed on the front of the Village Hall by Hanna's Field Charity. Although the machine is very simple to use and gives you instructions when in use, there will be some training organised during the autumn so please let me know if you would like to attend that training. The trainer will be one of our local Community First Responders.



Should you have an emergency that requires the use of the defibrillator, the call handler answering your emergency 999 call will give you the access code.

The housing development of 92 units at the Morelands Industrial site, mentioned in the last EH News, continues to get closer to fruition. Recently the condition requiring archaeological work has been discharged and the reserved matters, layout, landscaping and appearance, have been approved by City Council Planning.

You will see mention of the Hill Farm planning application, 21/00555/ FUL, for a solar farm, which received planning permission from the Chelmsford City Planning Committee, in the report from City Cllr. Richard Poulter. This PC, along with West Hanningfield PC, is jointly investigating the possibility of a judicial review as certain aspects of the Committee meeting were unsatisfactory. This has involved the services of a solicitor, so not without expense. At the time of writing legal advice was awaited, so it is not possible to say, at the moment, what action will be taken. The third application for a local solar farm by the Southend Road has gone to appeal following refusal by Chelmsford City Council, so there will be no news on that one for some time.

Another matter mentioned in the previous News was the possibility of a vacancy on PC. This did come to pass, due to the resignation of Peter Applegate. Peter had been a parish councillor since 1995, and several times had been Chairman and Vice Chairman, so has been a beneficial contributor to the life of this parish. PC thanks Peter for his years of service and wishes him well in all his future endeavours. Following the legally required publicity for a casual vacancy, the empty seat on the Council was filled by the co-option of Lincoln Roberts. Lincoln is a long time resident of the village, and lives in Back Lane.

This year's Play in the Park sessions were very well attended with about 70 children participating. It would be helpful to know if the extras we had this year, assault course and circus skills, were well received, as PC has to pay extra for them. If you stayed at the sessions with your children, please let me know your thoughts.

In September 2019, PC took the first step in the creation of a Neighbourhood Plan, by designating the area it would cover, which was the whole parish. Then the pandemic came along and the impossibility of public and committee meetings put the project on hold. PC would now like to get it moving again. One of the benefits of having a NP is that a higher proportion of the Community Infrastructure Levy is passed to

the community, when there is local development. As we have a fairly large development coming our way the amount of CIL will be significant. This is all leading to a request for anyone interested in moving the Neighbourhood Plan forward to get in touch. One of the rules for NPs is that they should be community, not council, led, so although PC can participate, fund and support, it must not lead the process. There is an explanation of how to create a NP on the website of the Rural Community Council of Essex, and there are a couple of completed NPs of local parishes on the Chelmsford City Council website. Both can be found easily via Google.

Hedges and dog poo are the two subjects about which PC receives the most complaints. So now Autumn is beginning, here is the annual reminder to inspect and cut back any overgrown hedges you might own. If you have a hedge which is adjacent to a pavement, please check that there is enough width of pavement for a buggy with a child beside it to walk without stepping into the road or being scratched by twigs. If there is, imagine how much growth there is going to be in the Spring, and prune back accordingly. There are hedges around the village where dropped leaf litter has been allowed to accumulate at the base, so that the width of the pavement is hidden and new plants are growing in the resultant compost, so don't just cut back the shrubbery, please remove the build-up of earth at the base as well. Hedges are a wonderful wildlife habit, so it is good that we have them, but they do require regular maintenance and thought!

PC Meetings continue on the fourth Thursday of each month at 8pm in the first floor meeting room at the Village Hall. Please use the door facing the overflow car park, as the internal door to the main corridor is usually locked. If you would like to address the Council with a question or statement, there is a time near the beginning of each meeting, called Public Question Time, when you may do so. If you have a matter you would like PC to consider a a meeting please send it to me in writing a week beforehand, so that it can be included in the Agenda. Please don't put a question on Facebook, as there is so much there it could be missed.

CITY COUNCILLOR

It was very disappointing that the City Council Planning Committee decided to approve the application for a solar farm on land west of Hill Farm in Pan Lane. There were three main issues. First the proximity of this site to two other sites in the immediate vicinity. Second the impact on the landscape and thirdly the loss of 68.2 hectares of fertile farmland. The land yields 6.7 tons per hectare which equates to 457 tons per year. Not a lot perhaps on a national scale but sufficient to produce over 700,000 large loaves of bread per year. It was particularly galling that the vote in favour of the solar farm was 6-5. The application for the largest of the three solar farms had already been refused but this has been appealed and will be the subject of a public inquiry which will probably be heard early next year.

In May 2020 the City Council adopted a new local plan covering the period to 2036. This is due to be reviewed every five years, making the first review due in 2025. This will include the provision for an additional 7,966 new homes for the period to 2041. The City Council have issued a public consultation document containing five different approaches for identifying sites. Four of these allocate homes to existing settlements. One of these specifically mentions East Hanningfield. The fifth site is entirely new and proposes a large new settlement at Hammonds Farm east of the A12 and north of the A414 i.e. close to the park and Ride site but on the Danbury side of the A12. The consultation documents are available to view at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/planningpolicyconsult. The consultation lasts until 6th October.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR

The Ukraine situation shows no signs of being resolved. We have seen more than 1400 Ukrainians welcomed into our county and 1081 sponsors have generously supported the Homes for Ukraine scheme. I have had a few requests on the slow payment of the thank you payment. All of these have been settled but if you know of a problem on this please let me know.

The Essex Forest Initiative is now in its third year towards the target of planting 75k trees in both urban and rural areas. It is making excellent progress but if you are interested in planting trees on your land then email: tom.moat@essex.gov.uk who may well be able to help.

There has been universal condemnation of National Grid's plan to install a pylon route from Norwich to Tilbury via Norfolk, Suffolk, and North Essex. A recent consultation has been acknowledged by National Grid and they have now employed a company to carry out a walkover survey to assess the landscape, ecology, and any heritage issues. There is only one answer to this issue and that is to go offshore undersea cable as they have done elsewhere in the country. All 13 MPs have registered their concerns to the Minister for Energy requesting a fair deal for East Anglia. As I understand it there is to be a further consultation next year, this time statutory one. We must keep a close eye on National Grid's plans and any proposed changes to the route!

Well, it has certainly been a scorcher of a Summer, we were especially very lucky for the Village Fete which was another resounding success with a great profit, the proceeds of which will be an enormous boost to both HFC and All Saints Church. *Please see full details of the day in the separate Fete Report by Mel Mavers.*

After a number of months of delays, finally the new double glazed entrance doors were fitted to the Hall Entrance at the end of July, together with an additional window and new double-glazed units for the Sports Hall, which has improved the natural light immensely, and we hope that our regular users have noticed the difference. We also hope that this will help with insulation from heat loss, something we all have to be aware of with the increased costs of our utilities in the future! Following on from the new entrance doors we have now also completed a redecoration of the entrance foyer.

We have also carried out some remedial work with the car park and path tarmac areas, extending these around the new entrance area for easier access without the mud in the winter months.

In the Play Area we have replaced the Baby Swings, and after comments about birds perching on the tops and leaving their inevitable mark!! we have now fitted suitable deterrents above them.

EAST HANNINGFIELD NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Local Crime Round Up: Since the last News these are the crime incidents NhW have been made aware of:

ISO shipping container broken into at a property in Bicknacre Road sometime on evening Friday 17 June. Container padlock cut off, and between £3.5 and £4.5K of equipment stolen.

Mercedes GLE SUV Diesel estate stolen from a driveway in Clinton Close on night of Sunday 12 June sometime around 1am (caught on a Ring doorbell CCTV but quality not good enough for police to identify thieves).

Keyless car theft (aka Relay Theft/Relay Crime) is on the up with many manufacturers providing keyless entry. It is where the signal from a key for the so-called "Keyless entry" car is captured by a criminal standing outside the victim's house using a specialist device. If the key is close enough the device picks up and relays the signal to the car, allowing someone to enter it and start the engine by pressing the start button. Prevention: Keep your car key at home in a "screened" box/tin/bag so that the signal can't be 'grabbed' from outside the house and used to open your car – and don't forget to do the same with any spare key set!

Village Hall break-in on night of Sunday 27 February: Police decided the CCTV imagery for one of the people involved with the (that someone in village thought they recognised) was not good enough to allow a positive ID for a prosecution.

And some good news – a resident reports that two people caught on CCTV overnight trying car doors/garages in Highfield Mead back in December 2020 have been identified and are being prosecuted for attempted burglary (we don't know why it's taken so long!).

A reminder there are a number of ways of reporting crime depending on circumstances - these are:

- 999 (if you see something suspicious or a crime in progress).

Cyber Crime: Fraud and cyber crime scams and "phishing" attempts continue to plague all our lives, whether its on-line, unsolicited phone calls or through mobile phone text messages. These are some of current scams to watch out for:

Fake emails posing as McAfee and Norton Antivirus informing people that their subscription is at an end and

needs renewing are currently circulating. The emails ask you to click through on links in order to 'renew the subscription'.

Fake text messages claiming that a parcel delivery has failed, asking recipients to click the link to 'book a new date' or 'reschedule a delivery' via two sites that have nothing to do with the Post Office.

(watch out also for similar ones with DPD and Hermes company branding).

Fake emails and texts: The government's cost of living scheme announced in May offers £650 to millions of low-income households, with the first instalment of the money transferred from 14 July 2022 and the second payment in the autumn. The Department for Work and Pensions has issued a warning about scams regarding cost of living payments as well as energy and council tax rebates. Some have a fake phone number to make a claim for the payment.

Cold calls: People have also reported receiving calls offering the £150 energy council tax rebate. The scammer then asks for your bank details to process the payment. Local Government Association has said that councils will not call you asking for your bank details. The energy rebate will be processed automatically for those who pay their council tax via direct debit. Anyone who doesn't pay via direct debit should await a letter from their local council with instructions on how to claim the energy rebate.

Computer remote access scams: These are on the increase - don't get into any form of communication where you are asked to hand over control of your computer (or smartphone) to someone else. Action Fraud say more than £50M was lost last year to scammers using computer "remote access tools" to take money from unsuspecting people.

You can talk to a Scams Action adviser at Citizens Advice Bureau by calling <u>0808 250 5050</u>, Weekdays (9am -5pm) or report it on their website.

NhW Organisation & Email Alerts: About 130 residents receive emailed local crime alerts - contact NhW email address below if you would like to receive these. The EH NhW core team members meet approximately quarterly by zoom or face to face. Lastly, we have a property marking kit available to loan out for anyone interested.

Community Speed Watch: (CSW) volunteers operate under the EH NhW umbrella and is part of the overall police strategy to deter speeding, the main cause of road accidents/fatalities. East Hanningfield Volunteers do periodic speed checks on the main roads through the Village. The details of vehicles exceeding the speed limit are logged and forwarding to the police. CSW speed checks are sometimes accompanied by Traffic Police officers (who will stop drivers who are exceeding the speed limit during a speed watch).
