## EAST HANNINGFIELD

### DEATH OF MR. C. WOOLFORD

The death took place on Sunday at "Wynzone", Maldon Road, Danbury, of Mr. Charles Woolford, who lived at East Hanningfield, where he was greatly respected for 33 years. Mr. Woolford, who was in his 77<sup>th</sup>. Year, was born at Steeple Barton, Oxfordshire. As a young man he was whipper-in to the Heythrop Hounds, and later to the Herefordshire Hounds. He came to Essex in 1887 as coachman to Capt. H.F. and Mrs. Kemble, and was with them for nearly forty years. He left East Hanningfield in 1920. A keen cricketer, he was formerly a round-arm bowler, and for many years was vice-captain of Hanningfield Cricket Club. He played until he was 55. During the war he was a special constable. To the end he maintained his interest in hunting and was often a keen spectator. He leaves a widow, four sons (the eldest of whom is in Canada), and a daughter. The funeral will be at East Hanningfield Parish Church to-day (Saturday) at 2.30.
