1.	Rose : one bloom	
2.	Roses : three blooms in one vase	
3.	Roses : six blooms in one container, two or more cultivars	
4.	Roses, cluster-flowered, one stem, one vase	Cluster flowered roses include floribunda, rambler, polyantha, cluster-flowered climbers etc.
5.	Roses, cluster flowered, three stems, one vase	
6.	Roses, old fashioned type, three stems, one vase	These can be 'David Austin' varieties or traditional such as Rosa Galica, Mundi, Moss etc.
7.	Roses, one bowl six or more stems	Not a vase. Roses should be arranged in holder/wire/oasis within traditional 'rose bowl'
8.	Sweet Peas, two vases, six stems in each	Sweet pea foliage allowed
9.	Sweet Peas, vase of six mixed stems	Sweet pea foliage allowed
10.	Clematis, 3 stems 1 vase, 1 or more cultivars	
11.	Hardy Herbaceous Flowers, one vase, three kinds, 5 stems	Seasonal examples include: achillea, aconitums, anthemis, astrantias, campanulas, crocosmia, gaura, hardy geraniums, helenium (sunflower family), red hot pokers, nepeta, phlox, etc. Space should not exceed 18" square
12.	Hardy Dianthus(pinks) six stems one or more kinds, one vase	
13.	Annuals, three kinds, 5 stems, one vase	
14.	Flowering shrubs, three stems in bloom one or more kinds	Seasonal examples include: weigela, mock orange, spirea, elderflower
15.	Hosta leaves, six, one or more varieties in a vase	
16.	Pansies or violas six blooms one or more kinds shown on a board/card	Card to rest on water container
17.	Fuchsias six blooms, one or more kinds shown on a board/card	Card to rest on water container
18.	Ornamental foliage plant one pot	NOT a grass
19.	Flowering plant one pot in flower	
20.	Pelargonium, regal, ivy leaved, zonal or scented in flower, one pot	

21.	Ornamental grass in a pot (maximum size 9 inches)	
22.	Annual or Biennial flowers one or more kinds, one vase.	Overall table space not to exceed 15 x 15"
23.	Penstemon – 3 stems 1 or more kinds, one vase	
24.	Single cactus or succulent in a pot	
25.	Cacti, succulent or alpine garden 3 or more varieties.	Container not to exceed 46 x 31cms or 42cms round
26.	3 Delphinium stems, 1 or more kinds, one vase	
28.	Phlox 3 stems, 1 or more kinds, one vase	
29.	Dahlias 3 stems, 1 or more kinds, one vase	
30.	Sunflower 1 stem
