Now let's turn to jobs to do in the allotment and garden this month – the nights are drawing out so we can spend more time in the garden.

- 1. Tidy up the garden and sort out the plants that suffered in the ferocious frosts making sure that they have survived before digging them up
- 2. Tidy borders, removing dead growth and persistent weeds.
- 3. Plant lily bulbs in deep pots of gritty compost for summer flowers.
- 5.Dig over your plot and add plenty of well-rotted organic material.
- 6. Start sowing early veg crops indoors
- 7. Plant shallots and garlic outside.
- 8. Chit early potatoes in a warm, bright spot.
- 9. Force rhubarb and chicory

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

GRAPE CHEESE WHIPS

A delicious cool dessert of low-fat cheese and honey, topped with sugar-coated grapes as decoration Serves 4

INGREDIENTS

150g/5oz black or green seedless grapes
plus tiny bunches
2 egg whites
15ml/1 tbsp caster sugar
finely grated rind and juice of ½
lemon
225g/8oz low-fat soft cheese
45ml/3 tbsp clear honey
30ml/2 tbsp brandy (optional)

METHOD

Brush the tiny bunch of grapes lightly with egg white and sprinkle with sugar to coat.

Leave to dry

In a bowl, mix together the lemon rind and juice, cheese, honey and brandy if using. Chop the remaining grapes and stir them into the mixture.

Whisk the remaining egg whites in a grease-free bowl until stiff enough to hold soft peaks. Fold the egg whites into the grape mixture then spoon into four serving glasses.

Top with the sugar-frosted grapes and serve chilled.
