## **BEFORE THE SHOW**

1. Ensure that you have entered the intended number of Classes and that the Class ref. numbers are correct
2. Check that you have filled in the Entry Form with your name and contact details
3. Ensure that you have enclosed the correct fee in cash or cheque

*EXHIBITORS FEES 25p per entry*

## **ON SHOW DAY**

1. Check that your Entry card(s) correctly describe the Classes you intend to enter
2. Ensure each exhibit is placed in the correct area designated for that Class
3. Give yourself ample time to set up multiple exhibits

*NB Exhibitors must vacate the hall by 10am when judging will commence*

# SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

## **ENTRY FORMS & ENTRY FEES**

Only the entry form provided, or photocopies of it, will be accepted.

Entry Forms will be received at any of the addresses given, up to 8pm on the Wednesday prior to the Show. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

## **SHOW EXHIBITS**

In Divisions A-E exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 2 months prior to the show date.

All exhibits must comply with size, dimension & number of items as stipulated in the Schedule.

Staging of exhibits can only take place during the times stated in the Schedule (See Show Programme on page 6)

No exhibits are to be removed from the Show until the Awards Ceremony has finished.

## **SHOW EXHIBITORS**

Any attempts to deceive the Judges will result in the forfeiting of any prizes.

Only one exhibit per exhibitor may be entered in any one Class.

Only one entry allowed in the same Class from crops / subjects that have been jointly raised on a shared plot.

Individuals who raise their own crops / subjects on a shared plot may each enter in any one Class.

All Exhibits must be staged and the Hall vacated by 10am sharp on the Saturday morning of the Show.

## **THE CONDUCT OF SHOW OFFICIALS AND JUDGES**

Show Officials, whilst taking all reasonable care of exhibits, shall not be responsible for any damage that may occur.

Judges reserve the right to withhold prizes in any Class where entries are insufficient or not of adequate quality.

While Judging is in progress no persons other than Show Officials and Stewards are permitted in the Hall.

**The decisions made by the Judges are final.**

## HINTS & TIPS FOR VEGETABLE & FLOWER SHOWING

1. Root vegetables should be washed but not scrubbed

5. A good proportion of flowers should be open

## HINTS & TIPS FOR VEGETABLE SHOWING

1. Vegetables should be washed not scrubbed.
2. To dress onions: Do not overskin. Trim roots at basal point and bend over neck and tie with raffia or natural string
3. Potatoes: Varieties with coloured 'eyes' should be in Class B16 unless a salad variety
4. Exhibits should be the same variety within each class of near equal size and arranged attractively on a plate or on the table
5. Marrows/squashes should be max size 35cms long or 16cms diameter if round

2. Stalks should remain attached
3. Where “any number” is stated, there should be enough to make a pleasing display, according to size

## RECIPE : CLASS JO1

# EGG CUSTARD TARTS (MAKES 9)

### INGREDIENTS FOR PATE SUCREE

6oz (175g) plain flour  
pinch of salt  
3oz (75g) icing sugar  
3oz (75g) butter  
2 egg yolks  
about 1tbs (15ml) water  
1 egg white

### METHOD

Sift the flour and salt into a bowl, or on a flat, cool surface. Stir in the sugar. Make a well in the centre and add the butter, cut into small pieces, and the egg yolks. Blend together using the fingertips, then add the water to form a soft dough. Handle as little as possible. Wrap in greaseproof paper or cling film and chill for several hours before using, preferably overnight.

Set the oven at 200°C/ Gas Mark 6

Roll out the pastry then bake blind having lined the tins with greaseproof paper and baking beans and bake for 5 minutes. Remove the lining and baking beans. Brush the pastry bases with egg white and cook for a further 5 minutes. Remove and cool slightly.

Reduce oven temperature to 170°C / Gas Mark 3

### INGREDIENTS FOR FILLING

2 eggs  
1oz (25g) caster sugar  
½ pt (300ml) milk  
1-2 drops of vanilla essence  
1tsp (5ml) ground nutmeg

### METHOD

Beat the eggs and sugar together.

Heat the milk until just below boiling point and stir in. Add the vanilla essence.

Strain the egg custard filling into the pastry cases, sprinkle with nutmeg and bake for 25-30 minutes until the filling is set and golden.

Remove and cool. Remove the tarts from the tins and allow to cool thoroughly on a wire rack.
