049/2019 Chairman's report and any update since last meeting

Update on the BDC Planning meeting on 19th. March 2019

The Chairman, Cllr T. Clayton, reported that at the BDC planning meeting on 19th. March he informed the BDC planning committee that on the 28th July 2015 the Parish Council lodged a letter of objection to this proposed development and all the points made are still very relevant, such as sustainability, a flawed Traffic Management assessment, overdevelopment of Long Melford and surrounding areas, lack of scope to expand the Doctors Surgery where there is already a six week wait for an appointment and many other reasons why this planning application must be rejected.

We also said that there were many anomalies and incorrect statements and I would like to expand on a few points.

The proposed scheme would deliver a range of social benefits including further increasing the supply of market housing and the planning officer suggests that this should carry significant weight. The reality is that the local area is being overwhelmed with new housing already and does not need any further development.

The developer states that the site is currently being operated as an industrial site and if their request for change of use is rejected it could mean that it would continue to operate on a much larger scale thereby increasing further the number of movements to and from the site. The truth is, that the only reason there are tenants on the site is because they have been offered units at 75% less than true market rent due to the poor condition of the buildings.

The applicant states that the access road to the A1092 Known as Cranfield Lane can only be used during the redevelopment period and cannot be made a permanent access due to various covenants. Has the committee seen these covenants, have they received written confirmation from the land owner that what the Developer states is correct? The answer to this must be No because I have spoken to the owner of the land over which this access road runs and he assures me that he has not been approached by anyone and he further assures me that as far as he knows there are no covenants in existence. As this access to the A1092 is such a contentious issue surely the committee must ask the applicant for proof to back up his statements and not just take his word for it.

We are told that very few vehicles leaving the estate will turn right and that the protected lane will not much suffer increased traffic. Are we to expect that anyone travelling to Cavendish, Clare, Haverhill etc. will travel the extra 4 miles via Rodbridge rather than take the shortest route? Are we also to expect that anyone wanting to travel to Long Melford or indeed Bury St Edmunds will not use the shortest route down Liston Lane? Of course not. Drivers will always take the shortest route. The Developers assumptions on traffic routing are laughable and should not be taken seriously. The current closure at the bridge at Rodbridge has given the residents of Liston Last week and I am sure you will all agree that the verges have been devastated by the increased traffic and the "Quiet Lane" which is Liston Lane has been turned into a hazardous assault course for those pedestrians prepared to take their life in their hands. These are just some of the reasons why this development should not be allowed to proceed, there are many, many more which I am sure you are all aware of.
