all concerned. The Centre also organized a story telling event that took place in the room opposite the café during the


school holidays and it was nice to see the room all decorated for Halloween.











Many of the regular visitors to the Park will have noticed the large machines working mainly in Plantation Wood and opposite the Stephenson Dipping Pond. The contractors were on site tidying up after the damage caused by the storms earlier in the year. It is frightening looking back that Jan '22 brought devastation from Storms Malik, Arwen and Corrie then Storms Eunice and Dudley in February. The impact over the



north east was pretty unprecedented. The main impact was on pines and spruce which still had so much leaf. The clearance has helped reopen areas and make the woodland safer, however, not everything can be reached and these will be left creating new habitat. The 'chipper' was a real beast and could chip trees up to 90cm dia!! The chippings were transported to Cramlington then on to the Midlands to be turned into biofuels.


