## VOLUNTEERING

The Friends and North Tyneside Volunteers have kept busy through the month. The Friends have been working in the Wildlife Garden in the Centre Grounds and tidying up the planters and flower beds at the entrance. In the 'Backyard Allotment' the gardeners have painted the shed, continued to



nurture the veg and fruit and created some lovely signs. Out in the wider Park, a group has started work replacing the walkway around the dipping pond in Plantation Wood near the Hares Hips

(Owls Eyes). Many of the boards are old and the decision has been taken to replace them all. This will take a few weeks but hopefully

survive for many years to come. The pond is still open and if you are lucky you will see some of the fish and other creepy crawlies that lurk in the rushes like the Great Diving Beetle pictured here.















A group from Accenture volunteered in the Park on the 15th. Some of them painted the hide at Swallow Pond whilst others carried out a lit-

terpick. Thanks so much to Accenture for choosing our Park to help out.

Some of the goodies are now coming from the 'Backyard Allotment' and placed outside the café entrance for visitors to take. A small donation is

welcomed. During the month, three of the Friends helped with a Citizens Sci-

ence Genepools Project. This is a partnership between a number of organisations including the Natural History Museum. The Project is aimed at investi-

gating the fascinating life that dwells in ponds in urban areas, using novel DNA sequencing methods. Analysis of the data will help find how we

can enhance biodiversity in ponds, for the benefit of both people and wildlife.

Finally, the Friends monthly litter pick

took place on the 26th. A band of volunteer litter pickers again helped us keep the Park tidy. Thanks again to all those that gave up their time to help. **The next Litterpick will be Monday 31st July**, meet at the Centre Café at 10.30am. All equipment will be provided

but bring your own gloves if you can. Don't forget, the Volunteers meet every Thursday morn-

ing in the Centre Grounds—everyone welcome.


