Great Horwood Parish Council

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 5th April 2011 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, Great Horwood.

1. Chairman's Report

Cllr John Gilbey, Chairman of the Parish Council, opened the meeting by welcoming so many residents from Great Horwood and Singleborough. Approximately 40 people attended.

Cllr Gilbey introduced the current seven councillors on the Parish Council and explained that a new Parish Council would be elected on 5th May. However, as only six nominations have been received the new Councillors will automatically be elected and will attend their first meeting on May 9th 2011.

Cllr Gilbey also highlighted a number of projects the Parish Council had carried out over the past year including the development of Willow Road allotments, the planting of the tree on The Green, organisation of the litter pick and helping to set up the pub lunch club. Donations had also been made to a number of village organisations including the Silver Band, the Football Club, the Village Hall and Focus.

Possible future projects of the Parish Council include replacing the bus shelter in Little Horwood Road, installing salt or grit bins, adding a second notice board, setting up a Parish Youth Council and establishing a footpath from Little Horwood Road to Horwode Pece.

2. D Jack Smith Annual Charitable Awards

D Jack Smith is an American lawyer who holds the title Lord of the Manor. Each year he has donated \$5000 to village organisations for 'fun' projects which benefit the village. This year the sterling equivalent of the donation was £3015. Five applications were received and the final awards were as follows:
