At this time of Easter we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ

Very soon we will be entering Holy Week. Within the Benefice (Winslow with Great Horwood, Singleborough and Addington) a Pilgrimage is offered with an event each day of the week (see programme on page 3). We begin this spiritual Pilgrimage with Palm Sunday and end with Easter Day.



I do encourage you to come and join in this adventure even if you are not someone that normally goes to church. It can be a very liberating experience that cannot really be described but needs to be travelled. This liberation is symbolised in the Easter story by the lifting of the stone from the tomb of darkness and the promise of new life. We are reminded that spiritual light seeks out light, and spiritual darkness seeks darkness. The spirit of Easter tells us that Jesus Christ is the light of the world and 'that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it'. (John 1:1) When we remind ourselves of this we remember that it is always best to build on all that is good and beautiful in our relationships, both personal and within the community, so that discussions can be open and honest and we can support each other in ways that are positive and good.





Parish of Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan – HELP NEEDED

We are about to enter a new era for planning, as the Government has decided to place much greater importance on decision-making at a local level. Consequently, local communities will now be able to come together to shape the future of their area. Our local household and business consultation in October 2011 was very pleasing not only because of the above-average 65% response rate but also because it gave the Parish Council a much greater understanding of local opinion concerning possible future development. As a result, we were able to respond to AVDC and present them with our "community view".

The next stage, which is crucial, is to produce a Great Horwood Neighbourhood Plan which will flesh out the detail and be the legal document that will influence planning for our parish. It will cover a shared vision for our neighbourhood to say what the community will be like to live and work in, within 15-20 years' time, with attendant objectives detailing what we want to achieve in order to help realise the vision. Then most importantly, it will specify where new homes or other forms of development should be built, will identify and protect our cherished local green spaces and will influence what new buildings should look like. We will, however, not be permitted to develop a Plan that is in conflict with the forthcoming Vale of Aylesbury Plan or the developing National Planning Policy Framework.

Our Plan will need to be realistic and everyone in the local community along with various organisations will be consulted along the way and given the opportunity to comment where they feel it is appropriate. It must be stressed that the Parish Council and the Neighbourhood Plan Team will be working on your behalf. At the end, the Plan will have to be submitted to the AVDC planning authorities who will check it and submit it for independent examination. Once approved, possibly with suggested amendments, it will then be put to a local referendum and will require more than 50% of returned votes in favour in order to be adopted.

To achieve all this, we require some enthusiastic volunteers with a broad range of ages, skills and experience who care about the future shape and character of our parish to join our Neighbourhood Plan Team. We may require some people to carry out short term tasks, but all will help the villages' future. All ages can help as the young now will be the adults in 20 to 30 years and they may want a say in the way forward. Also, anyone with professional expertise in this area or who think they may have a skill that could be needed eg. document design; just let us know where you may be willing to assist. 




Diamond Way - Charity walk

Items from the Neighbourhood Policing Newsletter:

Clear Car Campaign Message :-'DISPLAY, YOU WILL PAY'

Despite all the recent publicity regarding thefts from vehicles the Neighbourhood team are still attending incidents where valuables have been left on passenger seats of vehicles, resulting in the theft of these items. Please do not leave items on display in your vehicle and always ensure that you lock the vehicle and leave it secure. Do not leave anything in temptations way.

Distraction burglaries: Please be on your guard and look out for any elderly or vulnerable residents in your area. Make sure they do not allow access to any unknown or unexpected callers to their property. Always check the identity of anyone asking for access to your property by using a phone number you have obtained from your own records (not one they have given you). If any doubt remains do not allow them in and call the Police immediately.

Countryside Crime: The team is also organising an event to promote Dogwatch. This will occur at the **Winslow Centre on 28th of April**.

In response to a lot of enquires about marking saddlery and tack, the Neighbourhood team will be organising an event to do this.

Broadband developments — YOUR HELP REQUESTED

As some of you may know, the Winslow telephone exchange has recently been upgraded to deliver faster broadband speeds. By moving from the old 20CN network to 21CN some subscribers could be receiving speeds of 8Mbps or faster (this is a different exercise from the fibre to the cabinet promised to those lucky souls in Nash and Whaddon). What's not clear is how great an improvement we will get out here, several miles from downtown Winslow, and I would like to compile some information with your cooperation.

You won't see any difference until your internet service provider (ISP) makes appropriate provision. Some have done so already, others are planning to do so in the near future, some might not bother. I would like to get a picture of who is getting what performance from their broadband around the village. I will compile this information by ISP and by geography and report

This is how you can help — it shouldn't take you more than a couple of minutes:

- 1 Go to http://www.mybroadbandspeed.co.uk and measure the speed you're getting now (be sure that there are no downloads or other activity on the line when you do the test).
- 2 Email the results to me, johnswhitehead@mac.com , using "Great Horwood speed test" as the subject. Please include a note of your ISP and your address and postcode (I will only use the postcode on the resulting Google map, so your anonymity will be protected).

The results should help anyone stuck with the lower speeds to badger their ISP for improvements, or to switch.

CHAIRMAN'S MONTHLY REPORT LAST MEETING - MONDAY 12TH MARCH 2012

Planning Matters

The application for the erection of a dwelling house with detached garage on Land at School End (11/02449/APP) has been refused by AVDC.

A member of the McAllister family and a planning consultant attended the meeting and during the public participation period advised the Council that they are proposing to submit plans for a development on the land at the rear of The Paddocks, 12 High Street. The proposal is likely to be for the building of 4 or 5 dwellings with access on to the High Street. They would like to present their plans to residents of the village through a public meeting. The Council agreed that this was the best way to ensure that all interested villagers had the opportunity to view the proposed plans and to comment on them. The meeting is expected to take place in the village hall on one Saturday morning during June.

Neighbourhood Plan

In October 2011 the Council made an application to the Government for funding to produce a Neighbourhood Plan. We have recently been informed that our application was successful and that we have been awarded a grant of £20,000 to produce such a plan. We now urgently need additional volunteers to join a team which will work together over the next 2 years to put together this plan. See separate article in this edition of FOCUS by Councillor John Scholtens.

New Homes Bonus

It was agreed that the Council will respond to the invitation from AVDC and express the view that a fair distribution of the funds received from the Government under the New Homes Bonus scheme would be 20% to the County Council, 40% to the District Council and 40% to the Parish Council. This would ensure that when additional dwellings are constructed in the parish that funds become available to improve the local infrastructure

Annual Parish Meeting

This will take place at 7.30pm on Monday 2nd April.

Topics covered will include a report on the Council's activities over the last 12 months, updates on plans for the Diamond Jubilee celebrations, the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan and progress with the Book for the Village. The headmaster from Great Horwood school will also be attending to provide an update on activities in the school.

Dog Bins

Two further dog bins have been ordered for the village. One will be installed in Nash Road and the other in Singleborough.

Distribution of Focus

The April edition of Focus will be mailed out to 21 businesses in the parish who do not currently receive a copy. This distribution will be on a trial basis and each business will later receive a note asking if they wish to continue to receive the magazine each month.

Footpaths Report

Robert Deuchar provided the following written report to the Council:

"I have heard from Bucks CC that a metal pedestrian gate is to be installed where Footpath (FP)8/1 meets the A421 road, opposite the Thornton Turn in Singleborough. This will be popular with dog walkers as the FP makes a triangle with the bridleway and the Singleborough road but there are still four stiles between that point

and the centre of Singleborough on FP8/1. These pedestrian gates cost £250 each and Bucks CC says that it will pay the installation costs so perhaps some gates could be sponsored by local residents if the landowners give their consent."

Cllr. Bennett-Coles agreed to sponsor one of the gates and so there is still an opportunity for 3 more sponsors to come forward.

Second Bus Shelter to be installed

The final selection of the contractor to install the additional shelter in Little Horwood Road adjacent to the bus stop close to Townsend Cottages was made at the meeting.

Allotments

It was agreed that the Council would pursue the idea of installing water on the 2 allotment plots in the village by arranging the necessary surveys with Anglian Water.

Diamond Jubilee

Fliers are being distributed to all households in the village, which include a ticket application form for the afternoon and evening events.




