The church was packed which reflected the love and affection for Monica felt by the community of Great Horwood. She was an active member of St James and was Church Warden and on the PCC for many years. She particularly focused on the children of the village. At one time, she ran the Sunday School and organised breakfasts of sausage or bacon rolls before the children's Come and Praise services. She also started up and enthusiastically ran the Village Youth Club for over seven years.

As Church Warden, she organised the annual village fete for some years before relinquishing this role to David Brazier. She continued to help at every fete especially with the WI tombola.

She was an active member of the WI and secretary for several years. At all church fund raising events, she produced beautifully decorated hampers for raffle prizes.

In the last year when she became so poorly, she was surprised at the number of constant visitors she had from the village and said how lucky she was. This showed how much so many of us really cared for her. We all have our special memories of Monica and will greatly miss her friendship.

Our thoughts and prayers continue to be with John and all the family.



ADVENT, CHRISTMAS AND EPIPHANY

Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany – Feasts to Savour!

It is a great privilege to write to you once again now that December is upon us, and celebrate the fact that we are entering that most special time of the year – Advent (which begins with our Advent Carol Service at 6pm in St Laurence Church on Sunday the 30th of November, and continues with a service of nine lessons and carols at St Mary's Addington at 5pm on Sunday the 7th of December, repeated the following week at St James' Great Horwood at 5pm on Sunday the 14th of December). Do come along to one of the services if you would like to get into the Christmas spirit early - Christmas only beginning officially in the Church calendar on the eve of the 25th of December and lasting until 'Twelfth Night' on January the 5th - the day before 'Epiphany' when we celebrate the coming of the Magi to visit the newborn infant Jesus in Bethlehem

Epiphany means 'revelation' or 'realisation' and celebrates the first occasion when Jesus was revealed to non-Jewish believers when the somewhat mystical and enigmatic 'wisemen' came bearing gifts at the end of their long journey from the east, heralding 'good news' not just for those living in the Roman province of Syria Palaestina, as the area was then known, but to all nations, races, and peoples around the world.

I find it sad that we rush through Christmas so quickly, probably because we start celebrating it so early. One of my sisters-in-law is so tired of her Christmas decorations by the big day itself (having put them up mid-November!) that she often takes hers down on Boxing Day! But for me, Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany are three very different seasons which should be savoured and enjoyed to the very last moment. Advent – our period of watchful waiting and spiritual preparation for the coming of the Christ child is like a fine hors d'oeuvres, a bite-size taste of what is to come, something to whet our appetite and fill us with expectation for the 'main course' which arrives on Christmas Eve with the delivery of that precious child, 'Emmanuel' – God with Us – who would grow up to bring liberation, salvation and redemption to all those weighed down by the guilt of sin, and more than that, to put in train a sequence of events – not yet complete, which will see everything in creation restored to the same state it was in on that metaphorical 'day' when God looked at all that God had created, and declared that it was 'good'.

The twelve days of Christmas encompass special festivals which commemorate the events of Jesus' early days on earth, including the massacre of the Holy Innocents on the 28th December, when we remember those innocent children massacred by Herod the Great's soldiers in a vain attempt to rid himself of the newborn king of which the Magi spoke; Jesus' circumcision, in fulfilment of Old Testament Law; and the feast on which we remember the Holy Family (Mary, Joseph and Jesus) as they flee from Bethlehem into Egypt where they live as refugees in a foreign land until Herod's death, when it is safe to return home again.

Epiphanytide sees us remembering the few events we know about in Jesus' early life, including his presentation in the Jerusalem temple on the 2nd of February, exactly 40 days after Christmas, where Jesus is once again recognised as the 'Messiah' (or Saviour of the world) by the prophets Anna and Simeon, when Mary and Joseph visit Jerusalem to give thanks for his delivery and perform the purification rites for Mary after his birth. This provides the denouement to our Christmas and Epiphany story which we again savour as one might savour a fine desert or cheeseboard at the end of a meal. The feast, which we often call Candlemas, is one of my favourites, and I love the simple but dignified service in which we reaffirm our baptismal vows at the font and turn our faces to that next most important feast – Easter, which falls very early again next year, when we turn from Christ's early days to the events leading up to his death and resurrection.

The traditional seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, invite us to take our time, to relish and meditate upon the true meaning and consequences of God's coming down to earth in human form, and explore what that means for us and for the wider world – not as something to be hurried and forgotten about as our thoughts turn towards the New Year, and resolutions which many of us rarely keep, but as a series of events which point to something far more significant, not just the beginning of a new year, but to the beginning of new lives, refreshed and restored in the knowledge that the one we celebrate as a child in a manger is the same person who stretched out his hands on the cross so that we might know him and love him not just at Christmas, but forever! May your Christmas be filled with love, peace and joy, and may you know the presence of the Christ-child at your side long after your decorations have been taken down.

Winslow & District Community Bus Needs Volunteer Drivers

The Winslow & District Community Bus relies on volunteer drivers to run all our services, excursions and hires. Volunteer drivers needed now. If you have a D1 licence and some free time, please consider helping your local Community Bus.

Our Scheduled routes are

Aylesbury Market Bus - runs every Friday and Saturday morning

From Winslow, through Gt Horwood, Nash, Whaddon, Mursley and Swanbourne, arriving in Aylesbury Bus Station and parking in our reserved bay.

Winslow Market Service 54abc - runs every Wednesday morning

Picking up in the surrounding villages and then into Winslow, (Swanbourne, Mursley, Great Horwood, Whaddon, Nash and The Claydons).

Buckingham Bus Service - runs on the first Tuesday of the month

Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages. 1 hour in town then 1 hour in Tesco, or 2 hours in Tesco.

Westcroft Shopping – runs on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month

Picking up in Winslow and surrounding villages.

All of our scheduled routes start at around 9.00am and finish around 1.30pm. We pay out-of-pocket expenses.

We also run our own outings visiting all kinds of places, including garden centres, stately homes, shopping centres and countryside drives. The use of the bus is also available to local non-profit groups

We offer certificated training to MiDAS standard

MiDAS is the Minibus Driver Awareness Scheme and is administered by the Community Transport Association. The scheme provides a nationally recognised standard for the assessment and training of minibus drivers and has been designed to enhance minibus driving standards and promote the safer operation of minibuses.

WDCB provide free training to "MiDAS" standards for all our drivers. A certificate is awarded after successful completion of the course, which is valid for four years and is recognised UK-wide. Candidates must be aged over 21 and have category 'D1' on their licence. The course is usually completed in a day, the time being divided between classroom and practical work. The latter comprises coaching and assessment of driving skills plus a briefing on the use of the minibus wheelchair lift.

SEEDLINGS NURSERY

Bright Beginnings at Seedlings: New Nursery Opens Its Doors in Great Horwood

There was a buzz of excitement in Great Horwood on Friday 24th October as the village came together to celebrate the official opening of Seedlings Nursery and Pre-School. The ribbon was cut by local MP Callum Anderson, who praised the project as "a shining example of community dedication and passion for early years education."

The celebration, which included tea and cake shared with families, staff, and supporters, marked the culmination of years of hard work and vision. Seedlings is based in the beautifully restored Victorian school building, which has been lovingly transformed to create a bright and inspiring space for young children.



The building, dating back to 1861, has been part of Great Horwood's educational history for more than a century. Its renovation — an ongoing project since before the COVID-19 pandemic — has breathed new life into the site, ensuring it continues to serve the community for generations to come.

Seedlings is one of the few school-based nurseries in the area offering year-round childcare for children aged 2 to 4 years old. The nursery follows a natural curiosity approach to learning, making full use of the school's facilities, including a large woodland area, school field, adventure trim trail, and hall. Children also enjoy regular activities such as Jabadeo, walks to the village park, and visits to St James Church.

Parents have already shared glowing feedback about the new nursery.

One parent, Abigail Collins, said: "I think that the new Seedlings building and staff are wonderful. My child enjoys his days at pre-school and always has stories to tell. He's happy to go in and happy when being picked up — this says a lot! Thank you for your hard work."

Another parent commented: "My child has only been coming to Seedlings since September 2025 but she settled straight in and looks forward to spending the day there. All the staff are great and caring. It is lovely to see how much effort has been put in by Mrs Shaw and the team to set up a wonderful setting for the children."

Parent Lucy Janes added that Seedlings offers "a lovely indoor and outdoor space with a variety of toys and activities."

Meanwhile, Alex and Kim Whitelum shared: "Seedlings is providing the perfect environment for my son to transition from nursery to school. The setting is fantastic. We are particularly pleased that the children can use other spaces within the school such as forest school, the hall and St James Church. My child is thriving at Seedlings, which is down to the fantastic staff and environment."





Parent Georgina Oliveira also praised the caring team, saying: "I feel the staff really care for my daughter — she's happy to see them and they're always kind and nurturing towards her. The environment is brilliant, so much for them to do! I was worried to move my daughter from her old setting, but it has been entirely positive."

The opening of Seedlings Nursery and Pre-School marks a proud moment for Great Horwood — a true celebration of community, heritage, and the promise of bright beginnings.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF BUCKINGHAM HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING CENTRE

The Parish Council have been informed that the above recycling centre will be closed from 1st December 2025 for up to 14 weeks to allow for essential drainage works to be carried out. The site is due to re-open again before the end of March 2026, subject to no weather-related delays.

The planned construction works taking place require the site to be empty. This means removing all containers and some infrastructure from the site. The below-ground works include installing new drainage pipes and equipment, tanks, manholes and a new connection to the public foul sewer in Balmer Cut. The tarmac and concrete road surfaces will need time to harden before they are suitable for vehicles and containers to be returned, and the site can then be prepared for reopening.

To support residents during the closure, the council is arranging some additional measures:

- Additional sacks for waste Local residents will be able to pick up branded sacks from public buildings to fill with additional waste if needed. The bags can be placed alongside bins left out on collection days for crews to pick up.
- Real Christmas tree disposal Drop-off points will be advertised to residents where they can take their real Christmas tree for collection by crews.

During the temporary closure, residents can visit any alternative Buckinghamshire Council HRCs, with the closest being Aylesbury, located in Rabans Close, HP19 8RS (closed on Wednesday and Thursday each week) or Aston Clinton, College Road North, HP22 5EZ (open 7 days a week).

Please note that the Aylesbury Recycling Centre will be temporarily closed for essential works from 12 January 2026. The next closest alternative site will be Aston Clinton.

Details of which days Buckinghamshire's HRCs are open, what materials can be taken there, and live webcam feeds of the sites (helping visitors to avoid busy times) can be viewed online by visiting the household recycling centre webpages.
