Easter eggs, Easter chicks, Easter flowers, new born lambs in our surrounding fields...... It's hard to imagine Easter happening at any time of the year except spring. For Christians all around the world, Easter is celebrated in ways that remind them of springtime, and of new life, as Jesus rose from the dead. It is this "new life" that Christians celebrate on Easter Sunday – but what has it got to do with Easter eggs?

Even before the time of Jesus, people used to give each other eggs as a springtime gift, as a sign that new life was returning to the world after the cold, dead days of winter. In those days they didn't give chocolate eggs but real ones. For Christians however, the gift of an egg has an extra special meaning. From the outside, an egg looks dead – like a stone, but inside, it contains a new life. So the shell can be likened to the tomb of Jesus; and, when this breaks, it is comparable with the opening of the tomb and the beginning of new life.

On behalf of St. James' church, you are warmly invited to join us as we travel through Holy Week, which starts with our Palm Sunday procession around the village. Monday evening we remember Jesus's journey to his death with our "Stations of the Cross" service. Our reflective pilgrimage through Holy Week ends on Easter Day – a very special celebration where, as Christians we remember how, by rising from the dead, Jesus showed that there was a new life after death – for everyone.

Chocolate eggs can be found in St. James' on Easter Day! But if you can't join us please remember to come and see the beautiful floral displays in church, which have been arranged using lilies purchased in memory of loved ones departed.



Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Result

The result of the Neighbourhood Plan referendum held on the 5th of March was 447 voted Yes to the plan and 44 voted No: a **result of 91% in favour with 9%** against and a turnout of 60.2%.

This result means that Aylesbury Vale District Council will use the Neighbourhood Development Plan to help it decide planning applications in Great Horwood.

Rural Crime

Are you aware that the British Horse Society has a dedicated reporting page for accidents? It is the only place where statistics are gathered on the following

incidents – bird scarers, chinese lanterns, cycling, dog attacks, equine transport, fireworks, gates, low flying aircraft, road accidents/near misses, slippery road surfaces and wind farms.

If you have ever had a problem with any of the above, please consider reporting it. You can find the page by following the link to www.bhs.org.uk/safety-and-accidents/report-an-incident. The more incidents that are reported, the better chance we have of improving the situation.

Internet Safety

Action Fraud is the UK's national reporting centre for fraud and financially motivated cyber crime, and is run by the City of London Police, working alongside the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau. The specialist team uses information from all of the fraud and cyber crime cases reported to them to create alerts about new types of crime or those which are increasing in severity.

Issues commonly seen are:

- People who call to tell you that there is a problem with your bank card and that they need to collect it from you to fix the problem
- Fraud committed by people selling event/entertainment tickets, weight-loss/teeth whitening drugs, or vehicles online
- Fraud committed by people who cold-call thousands of people in the UK in order to sell them an investment in shares or precious metals, or who want them to invest their pension
- People pretending to be someone they are not in order to persuade your business to send money to a new bank account to pay for an invoice
- The activities of cyber-criminals who want to infect your computer or smartphone in order to steal your banking details or "lock" important files to prevent you from using or viewing them
- Fraudsters who persuade people to pay a fee in advance of receiving a loan, which never appears

All of these can be avoided by following the simple prevention advice which you will be able to find on the Action Fraud website.

Neighbourhood Plan

The referendum took place in the village hall on Thursday 5th March and there was a steady stream of voters throughout the whole day with the last one casting their vote at 9.55pm. Soon after the polling station closed 9 scrutineers from the parish were allowed in to witness the count and we were very impressed with the careful and professional way that the count was conducted with every ballot paper being checked three times during the process.

When the count was completed we learnt that out of 815 residents registered to vote 491 had actually done so with 87 voting by postal vote. There were no spoiled papers and 447 voted Yes to the plan and 44 voted No. This gave a result of 91% in favour with only 9% against and a turnout of 60.2% which proved to be the highest turnout percentage of any of the 60 neighbourhood referenda that have so far taken place in the whole of England. I was able to thank the Returning Officer and the Polling Station staff for a job well done.

Planning Matters

An application has been made to build 1855 homes on the South side of the A421 and to the East of Whaddon Road and extending South to the currently disused railway line. (15/00314/AOP). Since the last edition we have examined the traffic impact assessment and have agreed to ask AVDC that the area covered by the assessment should be extended to cover Great Horwood and surrounding villages.

A defibrillator for the village

As I am sure many of you will have noted the defibrillator has now been installed on the front wall of the village hall and we are going to have a demonstration of it at the Annual Parish Meeting to be held on Monday 13th April.

Footpaths

Robert Deuchar reported that "All the Parish's footpaths and its bridleway have been inspected and pruned between 22nd February and 4th March. There is a new metal pedestrian gate (replacing a stile) on FP5 where it leaves Singleborough Lane just north of the bridge over the stream."

Devolved Services from BCC

County Councillor John Chilver told us at our meeting of the progress with the devolving of the grass cutting from the County Council to the parishes and gave a list of other services that are available for parishes to take over from the County.

Proposed closure of Winslow Police Office

At our meeting we recognised the importance of having a local police presence and agreed to support Winslow Town Council in its bid to keep the office open by paying for the costs of the office rent and other running costs. We also agreed to make a contribution of up to $\pounds1000$ if this is necessary.

Annual Parish Meeting

This will take place on Monday 13th April from 7.30pm in the village hall and all residents are urged to attend.

We already have confirmation of attendance from the head mistress and chair of governors of Great Horwood School, our County Councillor and an officer from the county and a representative from Thames Valley Police. We also have a number of village organisations that have already promised to attend including St James PCC, the W.I., the Youth Club, the village hall, the Rainbows and we are still hoping more will respond positively to our invitation. This will, of course, be the final Annual Parish Meeting of the current Parish Council and so if you are planning to stand as a candidate for the Parish Council in May then this is an ideal opportunity to see what goes on in the village and to meet a wide range of people representing different groups within the parish.

Parish Council Elections

These will be held on 7th May at the same time and place as the general election and the election for members of Aylesbury Vale District Council and I am hoping that we can get a full complement of Councillors (maybe even have a vote) for the important work that needs to be done in the next 4 years.

This will include working with the landowners and AVDC in ensuring satisfactory progress on the developments as agreed in our Neighbourhood Plan. Also, as valuable services currently provided by the County and District continue to reduce because financial support from Central Government is cut further, we will need to find alternative ways of providing those services that we think are important for our community.

You will need to submit your nomination paper by 9th April if you wish to stand as a candidate.




