Easter is on its way.

For the church Easter is a bitter-sweet experience. Yes, Easter Sunday is our greatest day. It is the day of triumph of faith, hope and, love over despair and, hatred. It is in many ways the day that bad religion and bad politics are exposed as the real losers, for we should never forget that Jesus was placed on the cross by a toxic combination of religion and politics gone badly wrong. Sadly, we still inhabit a world where bad religion and bad politics seem, from time to time, to hold the upper hand.

If Easter Sunday is the day of triumph then Maundy Thursday into Good Friday is the day of horror. However, we must learn from these two days. On Maundy Thursday the Church remembers the Last Supper. The Last Supper is an extraordinary event. Jesus, knowing his destiny, chooses to show his apostles a new way of exercising power and authority. Through the act of washing their feet and feeding them with bread and wine, Jesus reveals that true leadership must always be exercised from below. Grace, mercy, compassion, hospitality, the pursuit of justice, love, and forgiveness know no depths. Jesus who could have been the ultimate high-flyer chooses to exercise what is to become known as servant-leadership. Whatever our own religious and political views it is worth reflecting on the thought that real leadership exercised from below and, has little truck with any notions of personal esteem or gain.

Good Friday is the Church's bleakest day. It is a day when Christians are forced to look at what sin does; sin destroys and kills. It did in Jesus day, it does in ours. Sin and evil are real and they manifest themselves in the abuse of power which always leads to hatred and injustice. Sin and evil are frequently the consequences of unacknowledged fear.

Easter Saturday is in many ways a forgotten day. Yet, it invites us to enter imaginatively into a space where the world becomes godless, or if you prefer, devoid of all goodness. This is not a comfortable space to inhabit. But why not give it a go?

But, returning to Easter Sunday what we now know, and cling onto in faith, is simply this: evil does not and, cannot, have the last word.

So, my Easter message is simply this: let us commit ourselves as church and as a community, without fear, to the notion of servant-leadership.

Please do come and join us for our Easter services and help celebrate and re-commit ourselves to working for the triumph of good over evil. All, yes all, are welcome.

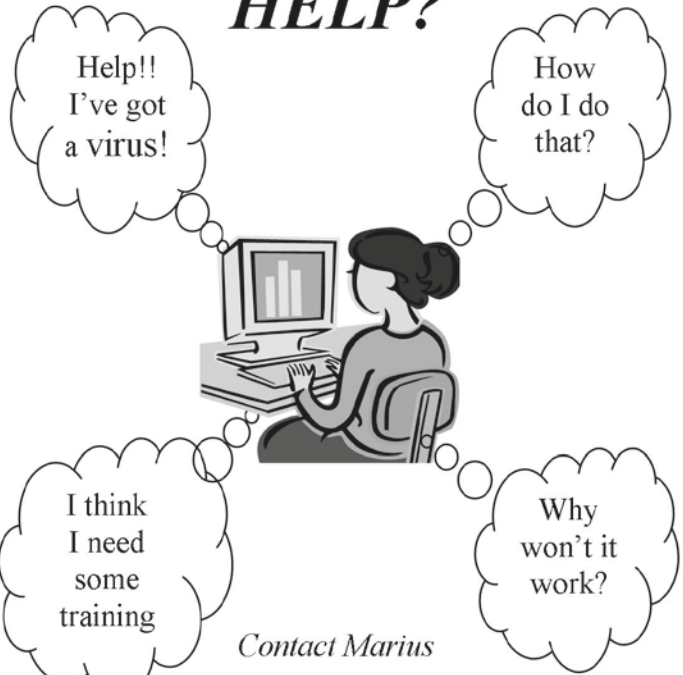

Message from PCSO Wendy Taylor

Local Priorities

Thefts from Vehicles and Burglary Non-Dwelling

You said:

Thefts from vehicles and burglary non-dwellings are occurring again.

We did:

We raised awareness of crime prevention ideas to protect yourselves against such crime. A major operation was put in place comprising evidence/intel gathering, patrolling at material times mainly in the early hours of the morning and following leads. Several arrests were made, stolen equipment seized, some of which has been returned to their rightful owners. Some could not because there were no identifying marks, such as a postcode, to prove who owned the items.

Penalty increase for offence of using a mobile while driving

With effect from 1 March 2017 penalty points for the offence under section 41D(b) of the Road Traffic Act 1988 of contravening or failing to comply with a construction and use requirement as to the use of hand-held mobile telephones, or other hand-held interactive communication devices, while driving will increase from 3 penalty points to 6 penalty points (Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988 (Penalty Points) (Amendment) Order 2017).

The Government will raise public awareness of the changes to penalties through advertising campaigns and TVP and Hampshire Constabulary will be taking part in a national 'using a mobile phone while driving' enforcement campaign from Wednesday 1-7 March to coincide with the legislative changes. Throughout this campaign, anybody caught driving while using their handheld phone will be issued a fixed penalty notice/ reported for summons. There will be no educational alternative during this period. We will want to send a



clear message to motorists that driving while using a mobile phone is dangerous and unacceptable.

Rural Crime

During February a lot of events took place in the Aylesbury Vale Local Policing Area (LPA) where Neighbourhood teams marked property and gave crime prevention advice. PCSO Wendy Taylor was asked to do as much tack marking as she could. She gathered so much that her Rural Crime Prevention month is turning into a Rural Crime Prevention 3 months. 50 saddles, 10 bridles, laptops, iPads, bikes, gardening equipment have been marked during this time.

Finally, the event to Cesar mark tractors, quads, Land Rover Defenders, etc in conjunction with Datatag will occur on 17 March at Creslow Manor. PCSO Wendy Taylor will have the tack marking kit with her that day too so if you have gardening equipment, chainsaws, hedge cutters, electrical machines such as drills, staplers, saws, jigsaws and, of course, saddlery and tack that needs to be marked, come and join in the fun. Farmers, who have already Cesar marked their tractors, have already saved the amount it cost in their insurance premiums in the first year after marking it. Bear this in mind, please.

TV Licences

The BCC's TV Licensing Department are aware that there are a substantial number of older residents in the Vale who are eligible for a free TV licence but who have not applied yet and would like to publicise that concessions are available.

There are currently 6,309 individuals over the age of 75 years old in Aylesbury Vale who qualify for free TV Licensing.

If you are over 75 years old, you are entitled to a free TV Licence to cover your household. Although it is free, you do still need to apply for the licence.

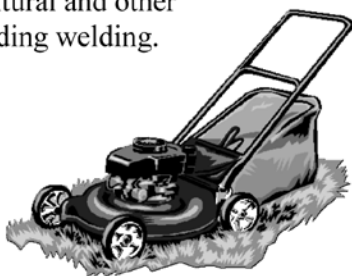

Charity work in Uganda

As some of you know, I'm heading out to Uganda with Mark and 21 others in October, each paying to ship a total of just over 1 ton of aid to a local community. I became involved through a trekking friend, who passed through there 2 years ago, and has built strong bonds with them, establishing a child education sponsorship program, and helping to raise funds and collect aid.

Nkuringo is a small community, perched high up in Gorilla in the Mist country overlooking the volcanoes of the Congo and the jungles of Rwanda. People are very poor, but determined to build a better life, and full of joy. The children do not automatically go to school - although education, even a basic one, is their passport to a better life in which they can make choices; hence the establishment of the school sponsorship programme. He or she gets to attend school, we can write to the child and four times a year, the school sends letters back from the children and a school report. You form quite close ties with the child and his or her community.

Mark and I have just taken the decision to sponsor 3 children's education; Alice is an 8 year old orphan who was abandoned, Ivan is 6, only has his mum and Matayo is 7. Both boys had to leave school after a short time as they couldn't afford to stay and Alice has never been. £110 per year for education, food and board! The children we sponsor come not only from the local village but also the Batwa Pygmy reservation and the Nkuringo HIV group (with the latter, the children who attend are confirmed negative. They board at the school thus giving them a tremendous gift of a future with hope).

A medical centre has just been completed and the school is undergoing expansion, including the dorms and kitchen to accommodate those children who live too far away. Given the issues in getting water on a 6 mile hike down in to the valley and back up, much is also being done for water storage and filtration.

So, why am I telling you? I'm looking to collect the following -

Children's and babies clothing and flat shoes (old school uniforms, PE kit, trainers, light weight fleeces and jackets, underwear, jumpers, socks, skirts, dresses, trousers), baby teethers, rattles

Men and women's clothing, shoes and underwear.

Medical items - everything from examination gloves, dressings, tooth brushes onwards

Educational - wall posters, maps (think reading, writing and arithmetic) but also encyclopaedias (small!), dictionaries etc, pens, crayons

Holdalls, such as the Sports Direct ones - I'll need lots of these to take all the bounty over. Do you have any you no longer need? Do you know any contacts who might be able to source any? They need to be secure and rugged enough to withstand a flight and over

land transport.

If you could spread the word to just a handful of others, or tap in to contacts, then I can fill my 86kg very easily!

The school needs a further £4500 to complete it (£10 a chair, £20 a desk, bunk beds, dorms), they need hens (£10) water tanks (£650), school uniforms (£12 each, made by the village women) and goats £30. Anything unsuitable to take, I'll sell so nothing will go to waste.

A newsletter has been produced every month for sponsors, and the community alike, to keep us all informed or the progress the other side is making. If you'd like to see a copy, you'd be very welcome!

Claydon House reopens for 2017

The National Trust at Claydon will be opening its doors to the public for the start of the 2017 season on Saturday 11 March.

Nestled in the Buckinghamshire countryside, a small ride from Winslow in Middle Claydon lays a Georgian house of plain exterior with an extraordinary interior of grand rococo carvings, paintings and richly decorated rooms created to impress and dazzle wealthy neighbours and outdo political rivals of Ralph Verney in the eighteenth century. Occupied by the same family for more than 550 years, Claydon House is a testament to their fascinating fluctuating fortunes from their close involvement in the English Civil War and family connection with Florence Nightingale.

The house will be open every Saturday - Wednesday 11am-5pm until Sunday 5 November, with a wealth of events and activities throughout the year. From outdoor theatre to book art and teddy bear's picnics, there's something for everyone to enjoy. For 2017, the well-loved bookshop has received a mini-makeover, making it a lovely warm place to browse second-hand books or pick up gifts.

Through the winter there has also been great activity in Claydon's privately owned gardens; a classic example of an English country house garden. Inside the walled kitchen garden a new vegetable garden has been constructed, which will grow a selection of seasonal vegetables for Claydon Estate's Phoenix tearooms. Three thousand spring bulbs have been planted in a part of the garden accessible for the first time to visitors, ready to greet them with an array of elegant spring colour.

In the old stable courtyard alongside the house, change is afoot as the old buildings are being renovated and converted into shops, galleries and business units. The courtyard is already home to a picture framer's shop and gallery, a sculptor, painter, ceramic artist, florist and a holiday cottage. Soon to open is the new Claydon Gallery, which will be run by local artists exhibiting and selling their work in these stunning surroundings.

Harking back to the days of the Courtyard's use as a stable yard, an added attraction for 2017 will be the display of Claydon's restored horse drawn fire engine.



This original engine was used by estate staff to attend fires in the local community and on the estate in the years before national fire services.

At our February meeting we welcomed Rt Hon Milly Soames the High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire.

Milly admitted she hadn't spoken to a W.I group before so we were her 1st and as her role finishes in April, we may be her last!

There has been a High Sheriff for at least 1000 years, since the shires of England were established.

For 980 of those years the role was a male one but since the 1990's women have been invited to become High Sheriff's

Milly's role is quite a complicated one, it is very time consuming, but so rewarding, she visits people from all walks of life from inmates at 3 of the counties prisons, raising awareness of many voluntary workers, to lunches with Royalty and local dignitaries.

The following week we went to Greatmoor Energy from Waste facility, near Woodham.

Electricity is produced to fuel 36,000 homes across Buckinghamshire and to sell back to the local Grid.

We were told that a Calvert land fill is still accepting some waste but is due to close fairly soon.

After donning protective clothing we were given a tour, looking through a hatch at the burning materials within.

The ash produced is still going into land fill, but they are hoping that it can be used for road surfaces in the future.

We ended our tour and were awarded with a plaque and a lego figure as we were the 1000th persons to visit the centre.

Mick Jones M.B.E came to our W.I meeting.

Mick started by showing us the rare plant and insect varieties found at the BBOWT reserve.

He gave us all a fascinating talk on how the Rothschild family once owned Dancer's End and in the 1940's was made into a nature reserve in memory of Charles Rothschild who was the founder of nature conservation.

The badger was praised for it's digging abilities, as fossils of sponges and creatures from another time have been

discovered .

After his talk, Mick judged the competition entitled 'A display of seasonal objects '

The meeting closed at 9.35pm

Chairman's Monthly Report : Last Meeting – Monday 13 March 2017



Great Horwood
Parish Council

The Parish Council met on 13 March. At the beginning a grant presentation was made to the School for new seating in the nature area at the School.

Each meeting includes a section for public participation when parishioners have the opportunity to raise issues of concern. On this occasion a group of School parents raised the issue of traffic in School Lane. With an increase in the number of children from outside the village attending the School, more children are, inevitably, being brought to School by car. There is very little parking available whether on the Green, in the High Street or in School Lane. More cars in School Lane are making it dangerous for those walking to School. Although the Parish Council itself has no powers to resolve the matter we intend to explore with Bucks County Council whether there are any steps that can be taken to improve the situation – including for residents of School Lane.

The Parish Council considered a number of regular 'housekeeping' matters relating to roadworks, footpaths, Horwode Pece and the Spring/Summer replanting of the village planters which mark the various entrances to the village. Those involved with the recent Litter Pick were thanked. Preliminary consideration was given to refurbishment of the Green, including new planting and replacement benches. Detailed proposals, including the

repair of the Village Sign which came down in Storm Doris, will be considered in the coming months. Concern was expressed about the lengthy delays in relation to some planning applications. It was agreed to ask our District Councillor, Sir Beville Stanier, to raise the issue with AVDC.

May I remind you that the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Thursday 18 May when there will be an opportunity to see what many of the organisations in the village do. We are grateful to the WI for offering to provide refreshments on that occasion.
