
HOLY WEEK IS THE CHURCH'S GREATEST WEEK





Great Horwood and Singleborough History 'Singleborough in the News' from the GH website

A search of early newspapers yields all sorts of little snippets of local history that would otherwise be forgotten. Here are a few Singleborough residents who hit the 19th -century papers:

One evening in January 1827, William Bastock was riding home to Singleborough from Great Horwood when his horse slipped, throwing William into a deep ditch and landing on top of him. William lay trapped under the full weight of his horse for two hours before his cries for help were heard but he and his horse were both rescued without significant injury.

On 8 June 1839, the Northampton Mercury reported that there were then three people living under the same roof in Singleborough whose combined ages totalled 280 years. One was the landlady and the others a married couple, her tenants. This was at a time when average life-expectancy in England was under 45 years.

In August 1839, Singleborough farmer, Thomas Mills visited The Plough pub in Winslow reportedly carrying £20 (approx. £1,200 today) in his purse. Two respectably dressed men, claiming to be 'gentlemen on a spree', engaged him in conversation, plied him with alcohol, offered to lease a farm to him and then gave him £10 for himself or charitable purposes. As he put the money into his purse, the men expressed concern that he didn't wrap it securely. Thomas allowed them to wrap all his money in

brown paper and put it back into his purse for him. The men invited Thomas to dinner at The Bell but, when he arrived, he discovered that no one matching their description was staying there. Only then did he check his purse. All his money was gone.

Thomas Mills was a victim of crime again in July 1844 when one of his horses was stolen. He started a hue and cry to spread news of the theft from town to town until the horse and the thief were discovered a fortnight later in Salisbury. George Smith of Great Horwood was found guilty of the crime and sentenced to 10 years' transportation. Hearing his sentence, Smith addressed the judge, "Thank you sir; I have been there before, and shall be glad to get out of the country."

On 10th August 1852 Samuel Ridgway and William Harrup were ploughing on the farm of Thomas Jones in Singleborough when lightning struck. The 'team of three horses were by the electric fluid struck to the ground'. Ploughman, Samuel Ridgway, was knocked down and severely shaken and driver, William Harrup, escaped unharmed but the horses lay cold and motionless, as if dead, for about 15 minutes. Astonishingly, the horses then revived and the men were able to lead them back to the homestead - slowly because the horses were weak and trembling and kept falling over.

WELCOME TO THE NEW CLERK

The Parish Council would like to offer a warm welcome to James McCafferty who will be taking over as the new Parish Clerk. Many of you will already know him and his musical and singing talents as part of the singing duo "Cantlos". James can be reached on the usual email address (clerk@greathorwoodpc.org.uk). Further contact details will be published in the May edition of Focus. His official handover date is 31st May but he will be very involved before this date.

GOODBYE TO JANE

Jane Holland has resigned from the Parish Council. The PC thanks her for all her hard work and enthusiasm especially with the litter pick and Horwode Pece. She will continue as a member of the Horwode Pece Management Committee.

LITTLE HORWOOD ROAD CLOSURE

Permission is being sought for a road closure on Little Horwood Road (between Weston Road and The Close) for sewage connection works. The requested dates are between 8th and 26th April and, if approved, that section of the road will be completely closed for the whole period. This will particularly affect Townsend Cottages and The Close in terms of access into the village and residents will have to take a diversion via the Nash Rd roundabout.

EARLY REMINDER HORWOOD FEAST

The Horwood Feast dates for 2019 have been approved. The fair will arrive on Saturday 4th August and leave on Tuesday 7th August, and will be open for business on Sunday 5th and Monday 6th August. A GH Silver Band concert and hog roast is planned on the Sunday. Residents' views both positive and negative were carefully considered before approving these dates, together with representations from the Feast organisers for making the Feast viable.

PLANNING

I have been contacted by residents about local planning rumours. The only response I can give is to refer residents to the planning report that is attached to all Parish Council Minutes. These can be found on the Parish Council website under "Minutes of Meetings". There is currently a substantial list as resolution of applications can be slow, especially for larger projects such as new developments. GHPC are "consultees" on all applications affecting the village but the final decision is made by AVDC. The system is –

AVDC advises new applications. These are passed to the planning committee (Cllrs Caroline Cousin, Jackie Goss, John Gilbey and Angela Mayne). Their comments are then passed back to AVDC.

HONEY BEE SWARMS

Our native honey bees are under extreme stress and their

chances of survival in the wild are 20%. It is 60% if the swarm is collected and housed in a hive by a beekeeper. Whilst the chances of seeing one locally are probably slim, the PC is informed annually of the hotline number which is: MBBKA Swarm Hotline, 07770370132 or Brian Bush, Mid Bucks Beekeepers and BBKA Swarm Officer, BBKA British Bee Keepers Association website http://www.bbka.org.uk

POT HOLES IN THE HIGH STREET

Repairs to pot holes in the High Street do not last as long as anybody would like. They have again been reported to Bucks County Council Transport for Bucks but if residents would like to add their weight to the request then the easiest way is to do this is by going to the website www. fixmystreet.com. It is as easy as filling in the simple online form. Photos are also a good idea.

STREET LIGHTS

A quick reminder – Great Horwood street lights were purchased by the Parish Council with a long term loan. All requests for repairs should, therefore be directed to the Clerk. Neither AVDC nor Bucks County Council have any responsibility for them. Thank you.

HORWOOD CHERRIES

The Grainge family grow cherries on the Little Horwood Road and provide produce to local Farm Shops and Farmer's Markets. They hope to have a slightly larger yield in 2019 and have permission to place a small hand cart on The Green during the growing season. Cherries will be ready to sell towards the end of June for about five weeks. Mrs Grainge plans a small 'hand cart' type stand to put the cherries on (something aesthetically pleasing) and an honesty box that people place their money into. These would be removed daily and not left out overnight.

FOOTPATH GATES

GHPC is providing grants for three new kissing gates on the local footpath network. It is always difficult to describe exactly where gates will be in a few words but one (on footpath 2 - The North Bucks Way) will replace a rotting stile. The other two will be on footpath 5 and help to tidy up the look of the area by removing an unnecessary stile and burying some electric fence cabling. Two of the stiles will be built by the Ramblers Association with a BOGGOFF offer – buy one gate, get one free. Sincere thanks go to Mr Robert Deuchar for helping the PC to identify problem stiles. Robert is currently walking all the village footpaths to check for problems – what a star!

RECYCLING CENTRE CHARGES

The Yonder Slade recycling centre will, in common with all sites in Buckinghamshire, start to introduce charges for non-household waste from 1st April 2019. A list of charges will be placed on the GHPC website and on the noticeboard in the High St. Further details can also be found on the Bucks CC website www.buckscc.gov.uk/HRC

NASH ROAD MVAS

A new fixing (called a ground screw) has been dug in place on Nash Road. This has enabled the Mobile Vehicle Activated April 2019 Page 9

Sign (MVAS) to be placed there to monitor traffic in the 40 mph zone. Thanks go to Mick Wood for his help in making this possible. Mick is doing a brilliant job supervising the MVAS and monitoring traffic on behalf of Great Horwood with his safety officer, wife Gill. His statistics show that of 17,217 counts, approximately two thirds of vehicles were driving at or below 40mph and the other third at between 40 and 55 mph. This was lower than Mick was expecting and means that Winslow Road remain the village's most problematic in terms of speeding. If anyone would like a copy of the statistics, please contact the Clerk.

WORTHY CAUSES

The application form for the 2019 round of Worthy Causes grants will be available from May. They can be obtained from the Parish Clerk. Early access to grant forms will ensure that applicants have plenty of time to consider their requests before the deadline of 31st October 2019. Please note that, this year, no applications will be considered if they arrive after the deadline. Up to £3000 will be available for distribution to local groups.

The drivers are all volunteers who will not be claiming any expenses and so you are only asked to make a voluntary contribution to our running costs.



Over the last few weeks we have seen further damage down the Rec. This takes two forms; the first is a large section of the teenage surround deliberately kicked off and the second is damage to the cross beams of the shelter and some of the seats and benches caused by an animal gnawing at the wood. A man with a large dog, possibly a Rottweiler, was seen down the Rec. The dog was not on a lead and was seen gnawing at the shelter woodwork. The man was using his mobile phone and ignoring what the dog was doing. With regards to the deliberate vandalism of the log surround around the Teenage area, this is difficult to repair. In kicking off the log surround, three of the posts that fix them into the ground have been damaged and need to be removed and replaced with new posts. As a temporary measure we have removed the damaged log surround timbers.

We will be carrying out our Spring Working Party (date to be confirmed) where we hope to be addressing the option to replace the woodchip in the Toddler Area with Recycled tyre rubber chippings. We have been offered help from the Scouts which should work towards their Community badge. A ROYAL VISIT TO

GREAT HORWOOD





Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Cornwall, who has been a patron of Medical Detection Dogs since 2014, visited the Great Horwood charity in February, to open the new Training Centre.

Her Royal Highness met a number of Medical Detection Dogs' clients, puppy socialisers, other volunteers and people who have helped the charity fund the new building along with members of staff.

There was a guard of honour made up of a number of MDD dogs and the Duchess was presented with the scissors to cut the ribbon by Tala, one of the dogs in training and nephew of Daisy who detected the cancer of Dr Claire Guest, the charity's Chief Executive.

Behavioural psychologist Dr Guest and former orthopaedic surgeon Dr John Church, who co-founded Medical Detection Dogs in 2008, were convinced from the start that dogs could be trained to detect the odour of human cancer and other diseases.

The charity, entirely supported by donations from the public and benefactors, now trains specialist dogs to detect the odour of many human diseases, including cancer, Parkinson's disease and malaria, and collaborates with other researchers, NHS Trusts and Universities internationally to advance the early diagnosis of disease.

It also provides life-saving medical alert assistance dogs to people with complex health problems such as Type 1 diabetes, PoTS and Addison's disease across the UK.

The new Training Centre, at Greenway Business Park, has been purpose-built to provide space for the Puppy Socialising department which makes sure the charity has enough dogs to train as future assistance dogs and bio detection dogs.

It also includes space for a Medical Alert Assistance Dog team who support applicants for medical alert assistance dogs through the process of matching them with a dog and the instructors who train those dogs to save the lives of clients.

As a charity with a no kennel policy, the building also includes a number of versatile training and presentation spaces which help with potential applicant awareness days and training for the dogs and the volunteers who care for them.

Dr Claire Guest, Chief Executive and co-founder of Medical Detection Dogs, said:

"We are incredibly grateful to the Duchess of Cornwall, a committed patron and supporter of our work, for coming to open our new Training and Research centre. It is unbelievable to think that just over ten years on from our foundation, and as the benefactors of immense generosity from countless people, we are able to improve our outreach by conducting more research, training more dogs and saving more lives."
