



#### First the waiting and then the reward!

I do not know how patient you are, but December for most Christians is a time of waiting in eager anticipation for the 25th of December when we celebrate the birth of Jesus into the world as 'Emmanuel' – which literally means 'God is with us'. We call that special time of waiting "Advent" which means the arrival (or anticipated arrival) of someone or something special, but most of us probably associate it with Advent Calendars, with which we count down to that all important day and enjoy perhaps, one of the sweets or chocolates hidden behind each of the windows which mark the twenty-four days leading up to Christmas. I have always found it strange however, that our Advent Calendars contain such calorific delights, as the origins of Advent lie in the 'fast' – or period of self-denial which Christians used to observe in December to prepare themselves spiritually, mentally, and physically for the arrival of Emmanuel – God made manifest in the person whose birth in Bethlehem we celebrate at Christmas.

Advent, or in other words, the whole of December was a time of delayed gratification when like Lent which precedes Easter, people gave something up so that they could appreciate more the feast of our Lord's birth when it finally came. Today however, there is very little difference between Christmas and Advent, as the pressure to buy more and more begins earlier each year, and the pubs and restaurants start to fill up with revellers and work-parties from late November onwards. It has, in many respects, ceased to be a time of prayer and fasting, and has become instead, a forerunner of the holiday marked by lavish spending and early celebrations to such an extent that many of us are tired of our Christmas trees long before Twelfth Night; and we find ourselves desperately searching the empty shelves for a box of Roses on Christmas Eve to replace the one we bought back in October which has long since been eaten.

The anticipation of Christmas is of course an exciting time, and it is not surprising that we try to spread the joy earlier and earlier when the nights are drawing in, the news on our television sets becomes ever more distressing, and we feel powerless to do anything about it. Christmas offers us a temporary escape from the rigours and realities of daily life, and genuinely makes us feel happier, but when the tree-lights are packed away and the discarded wrapping paper bulges from our recycling bins, a surfeit of Christmas escapism can make the harsh realities of January, and our burgeoning credit card bills much harder to bear.

There is however, another way to experience the true joy of the season, and that joy can be found in the one for whom people of faith watch and wait in quiet hope and eager expectation throughout the dark days of December until that day when we celebrate the true Joy which came into the world, bearing the light and life of Christ in a world which sometimes I feel, needs him more now than ever. 

RE: Consultation to make a significant change to a characteristic at Great Horwood Church of England School

Following discussion, trustees of the Oxford Diocesan Bucks Schools Trust (ODBST) as the admission authority for the school, and the local governing body (LGB) are consulting to make a significant change to an open academy characteristic at Great Horwood Church of England School. In line with the DFE guidance 'Making significant changes to an open academy' October 2024 we are proposing to lower the age range for our nursery pupils from three years old to two years old.

#### Consultation

The trustees from ODBST and governors at Great Horwood School are consulting with the following stakeholders:

- Buckinghamshire Council
- The Trustees for Great Horwood School
- Oxford Diocese Board of Education
- Parents of the children who attend Great Horwood Church of England School

- Primary, secondary and special schools in the area
- Parents and other people in the local area

This consultation will run for 4 weeks from Monday 18 November 2024 until Monday 16 December 2024.

#### Breaking News From Nook Park

Hot off the press today (15th November) we had an email from Bucks Council saying that Joe Burns Manager Bob Tester has been refused the Fit and Proper Person Status. This was after Joe Burns was refused by both Bucks Council and the First Tier Property Tribunal. So, this causes a problem for Joe Burns as we understand it is a criminal offence to run a park without someone with this status. If they appeal again well that will be yet another tribunal.

#### Did you Know!

The big topic around the country now is the 10% commission that goes to the Site Owner when a Park Home is sold. What this means is that when a park home is sold 10% of the purchase price goes straight into park owners bank account for doing nothing. When you think that some park homes can be sold up to as much as £500k well that would be £50,000 straight to park owner, in our case Joe Burns. You can't get a mortgage to buy these homes as they must be your main address and yes, we pay council tax, our pitch fees plus all our normal bills. This then is your hard-earned cash and less inheritance for your family. Now that's where it hurts.

I'll go more into park homes in the next Focus.

It just leaves me to say have a Wonderful Christmas and Happy New Year from us all on Nook Park.


