TAYLOR WIMPEY PLANNING APPLICATION TO BUILD 42 HOMES off WESTON ROAD

SOME POSITIVE NEWS...

Thanks to extensive lobbying by your Parish Council, numerous residents and local MP John Bercow, the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, Greg Clarke, has decided to 'call in' this planning application. What that means is that the approval to it given by AVDC is now void and Greg Clarke will make the decision on the application.

One of the reasons he has called it in is because of the application's inconsistency with the Neighbourhood Plan; which was endorsed by 91% of residents who voted.

AVDC Approval - how was this granted?

Given that this application drives a coach and horses through the Neighbourhood Plan, by what process did AVDC approve it? At the AVDC Strategic Management

Committee on the 23rd of September, 4 committee members voted in favour the application with 4 against, and it was only approved by the chairman using his casting vote.

Great Horwood's AVDC council member Sir Beville Stanier sits on that committee, but wasn't present at the meeting because of a long standing private engagement. Unfortunately he is not able to vote by proxy, and an independent substitute is sent in his place. His substitute, Mrs Jenny Bloom, voted to approve the application. Cllr Stanier did write a letter to the committee in advance of the meeting explaining his objections to the application and requesting that it be refused.

Had Great Horwood's elected representative attended the meeting, the outcome would almost certainly have been different. The application by Taylor Wimpey would have likely been rejected and we would not now be in this period of uncertainty where we await the decision by The Secretary of State.

Given the critical importance to the village of this application, if there was only one meeting in his entire tenure that Beville Stanier should have moved heaven and earth to attend, this was surely it. I was surprised by his non-attendance and have done further investigations to find out whether Mr Stanier ensured that he did all in his power to represent his constituents in this matter.

After answering some initial questions, Mr Stanier refused to correspond with me when I challenged him on a number of points. But we did subsequently speak and the following facts emerged:

- Mr Stanier states that with hindsight, now knowing the outcome, he <u>would</u> have attended the meeting. But as no one can know outcomes of meetings beforehand it is surely the duty of elected representatives to attend all meetings in which their constituency is affected? If he could have attended with the benefit of hindsight, presumably he could have attended without it?
- In his letter to the planning committee Mr Stanier said that had he been able to attend he would stand down from the committee for this item in order to give his views as the local member for Great Horwood. In other words, he would in effect, abstain. Within the committee process, a member can chose to vote or to stand down for any agenda item. He must stand down when he has publicly declared his intention or has predetermined how he will vote. In other words, if he has already made up his mind and won't be persuaded during the committee process, then he should declare that and stand down. But if he is to vote, he has to have an open mind, be prepared to listen to all arguments during the meeting, and then vote having considered the arguments. It's a grey area and only Beville Stanier and his conscience can know whether standing down would have been the right thing to do. But had he been at the meeting and even stood down rather than vote, then it is likely that no substitute would have been appointed and the application would have been refused.
- Since the application was approved Mr Stanier has done nothing to get it overturned or called in by The Secretary of State. His view, and I quote is: "The decision taken was entirely democratic and as such there is no means of overturning it". This contrasts sharply with the Parish Council and many residents, including myself, who wrote to both John Bercow and The Secretary of State asking that he intervene and the decision be reversed.

Sir Beville Stanier has been the Great Horwood representative on AVDC for many years and was re-elected last May with a large majority. He was elected to represent, be the voice of, and stand up for, the people of Great Horwood. I for one feel that he has let us down very badly on this issue.

Thefts from vehicles and outbuildings

Theft from vehicles is still occurring as is theft from outbuildings and we can only reiterate the need to secure vehicles and buildings to prevent the opportunist taking your possessions. We have now changed the clocks for the winter which means houses are in darkness for longer, so think about using timer switches on lamps, leave a radio on, don't leave valuables in full view of a front window, ensure side gates are locked and that patio/French doors are locked properly.

Rural Crime

Calling everyone who owns a quad bike or ATV – thefts of these is on the increase. Nationally, 782 thefts were reported to the police last year. Thames Valley Police are again working with Datatag, through the Cesar scheme, to offer farmers and landowners a heavily discounted price to protect their machines. The normal recommended price is £120 + VAT, the discounted price is £50 + VAT per machine. At this stage Datatag is looking for expressions of interest so when we know demand we can book the appropriate people to fit it. 
Hand and Lock have been producers of the Worlds Finest Embroidery since 1767. They are the leading supplier of all types of embroidery.

In 1995 Buckinghamshire County Council established a Community Woodland in the parish of Thornborough at Coombs. The 176 acres has become a well-kept secret to some and a delightful surprise for others!

In 2012 Thornborough Parish Council (PC) was asked to take over management of the woodlands due to funding cuts at Bucks CC. The PC has been managing the area for the past year and responsibility is shortly to transfer to a newly formed charity – The Thornborough and Coombs Woodlands Enterprise Trust.

As with anything to do with local government it has all taken longer than we envisaged – but we are nearly there!

Thornborough and Coombs Woodlands Enterprise Trust is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, Association Model [Charity registration Number 1163451]. The sub-committee members from the PC have transitioned into the inaugural board and have taken responsibility for maintaining the site.

This year the woodlands have been maintained by a small very busy team of volunteers and we are very proud that the whole area has looked so good in our first year.

Do you know what is there? The woodlands include a fruit orchard with unusual apple, pear and quince varieties, a stone quarry with archaeology dating back 170 million years, flora, and fauna to delight and walks suitable for young and old legs.

There is a car park in the woodland or a lovely walk in from the medieval bridge on the A421. There is also a footpath from Pilch Lane and paths from neighbouring villages.

Chairman's Monthly Report Last Meeting – Monday 9th November 2015

Introduction

The fallout from the earlier decision by AVDC to approve the Taylor Wimpey Planning Application for the land south of Weston Road has continued to dominate the thoughts of your Parish Council, but in addition we are progressing with our Parish Plan 2016 work as well of course with our normal business such as maintenance and budget setting.

Parish Updates

Planning

The Weston Road Planning Application has been called in by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government. The Parish Council has been given Rule 6 status which means that it will be one of the formal contributors at the public inquiry. For the time being AVDC cannot proceed any further with the application. We are currently constructing our case using appropriate experts which will hinge upon legal and planning issues.

It could take up to 10 months for this to be heard but we are determined to get the AVDC decision reversed and ensure our Neighbourhood Plan is not undermined. The PC will draw on the remaining $\mathfrak{L}7,500$ in the Neighbourhood Planning Team account and if necessary, $\mathfrak{L}5000$ of its own reserves which are held for legal challenges for this purpose.

Gypsy and Traveller Policy

I attended a meeting chaired by the Rt. Hon John Bercow MP with the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government the Rt. Hon Greg Clark MP and accompanied by John Hamilton from Nash Parish Council, Carole Paternoster from AVDC and Sir Beville Stanier in the Houses of Parliament on 13 October. The following policy issues were covered:

- Inability of local planning authorities to provide suitable sites for travellers.
- · Tension between traveller and settled communities.
- Perception that there is one rule for travellers and another rule for the settled community with respect to planning regulation.
- Location of existing sites and creation of alternative new sites

The meeting was very useful to discuss the dichotomy between policy for gypsy and traveller sites and the provision of sites in appropriate locations. Of significance, the Secretary of State said that he did not wish to see temporary sites in open countryside made permanent by AVDC unless there was an overriding reason, and AVDC should look again at land they currently have but also make provision as part of new large-scale housing developments forming part of the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP).

Although we were not allowed to discuss specific cases, there are implications for the Nash Park site which has temporary permission until November 2015 and for which we are awaiting an AVDC decision. We expect AVDC to grant an extension to the temporary permission for the Nash Park site for around 2 years to coincide with alternative site provision by the VALP in the Spring of 2017.

Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan

The VALP consultation document has been issued by AVDC and a detailed response by the Parish Council has been formulated to meet the 6-week deadline of the 4th of December for submissions.

Great Horwood Parish Plan 2016 Consultation

You will have seen the yellow handouts concerning our Parish Plan 2016 included with the November edition of *FOCUS*. The responses to the questionnaire will be invaluable in gauging the opinion of our local community concerning priorities, timescales and budget for parish initiatives, facilities and organisations. This is essential for our revision of the 2006 Parish Plan. I look forward to giving you an overall summary of the responses in a later edition of *FOCUS*.

The Green

Cllr Mayne is exploring various options to improve The Green and we have noted points raised by our local community of safeguarding the visibility on exit from the parking area.

Planters

We have agreed for the summer plants to be swapped out for winter plants as winter draws inexorably closer.






