



Chairman's Monthly Report: Last Meeting - Monday 13 November 2017

The emerging Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) is now at the final consultation stage before it is sent to the Planning Inspectorate for independent examination. The consultation closes on 14 December and links to all the documents and details of how to respond

can be found on the AVDC website at https://www. aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk/valp-proposed-submission It is is open to any resisdent to comment on the Submission Plan.

The Plan provides for 27,000 houses to be built in the Vale area by 2033, although around half of these are already built or have planning permission. Building will be concentrated around Aylesbury as part of the Garden Town vision, but there will be significant development at Buckingham, Haddenham and Winslow. The possibility of the redevlopment of RAF Halton for housing is being proposed. A large development has been agreed at Salden Chase.

Smaller developments are proposed for villages. However, where a village has a Neighbourhood Plan in place, as at Great Horwood, no further expansion is proposed beyond that agreed in the Neighbourhood Plan. At present there is no intention to build a new settlement, but this may change in any review of the Local Plan, once there is a clearer picture with regard to the government proposals for the Oxford-Cambridge Expressway.

The Parish Council is preparing a response and is looking in particular at issues related to affordable housing, management of increased traffic and proposed development at Winslow.

The Parish Council at its recent meeting also gave further consideration towards its Budget for the year 2018/19 with a view to finalising the Budget at the December meeting. Applications from village organisations for grants from the Parish Council were also considered.

Finally, may I take this opportunity, on behalf of the Parish Council, to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Please note that there is no meeting of the Parish Council in January, unless it is necessary to call a special meeting. The first meeting in 2018 will be at 7.30 pm on Monday 12 February.

For a more comprehensive report of the recent Parish Council meeting please read the minutes published on the website http://www.bucksvoice.net/ greathorwoodpc/. This website also has updates of items on its latest news page.

If you have any items that you would like to bring to the Council's attention at any time please contact the Clerk or any Councillor. We are always pleased to welcome residents to our monthly meeting during which there is always a public participation period. The next meeting is to be held at 7.30 pm on Monday 11 December 2017 in the Village Hall.
