The Christmas story provides all of us with the hope of experiencing new beginnings and something better. Jesus came to bring peace and goodwill towards all of humankind; the possibility of peace and goodwill are God's gift to us. It is a gift we should prepare ourselves to receive through Advent and then welcome with joy at Christmas, so please do come and join us in our Advent and Christmas services as we prepare to receive and then give thanks for the greatest gift ever given.







#### UNITARY COUNCIL FOR BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

The Government has announced a new, single council for Buckinghamshire. The new council will be established on 1 April 2020, with elections in May 2020. Snippets picked up at outside meetings appear to forecast that the South plans to use North Bucks as the dumping ground for extra houses and goodness knows what else!

#### **PLANNING**



I received an objection to my piece in the October "Focus" (because I used an identifiable planning application to illustrate the foibles of the planning system) and this makes me wonder how many people register

that all planning applications are a matter of public record. Documentation is freely available on the District Council website and, therefore, a legitimate topic for discussion.

On another issue this highlights the need for good neighbourly relations and the importance of talking to those immediately affected by one's building plans. Communication, no matter

how difficult, is common sense but what does one do if faced with a neighbour from hell? Lots of groups have an arbitration service – why not planning! In a worse-case scenario, disputing parties could render their properties unsalable and make each other's lives a misery. New Forest District Council has, perhaps, taken a small step in the right direction by writing to anyone affected by a planning application, (although it is still possible to miss an application and the opportunity to comment simply by being on an extended holiday). Bucks County Council might consider doing this when they take over planning from AVDC – or will they simply rebrand what we already have?

#### **SPEEDING**

Mick Wood is our much valued MVAS (Mobile Vehicle Activated (speed) System) caretaker. Thankfully, his wife Gill has also been seen acting as safety officer when moving the box from the less than safe Winslow Rd. He recharges the box every couple of weeks and downloads the data. Whilst monitoring the speed of drivers on Winslow Rd he has noted a reduction in average speed from almost 42 mph to about 39 mph (12/11/2018). It is still too high but is good news. The factors that could be affecting this are the MVAS, Speed Watch and the newly painted 30 mph roundel and yellow rumble (ish) strips on the approach to the village. To keep up the momentum we still require more Speed Watch volunteers. Please volunteer and speak to Jane Holland.

#### SCHOOL CROSSING PATROL



A great deal of effort was put in by Bucks County Council in previous years to recruit a village school crossing patrol officer, including extensive publicity, visits to events, cut out cardboard officers and adverts on beer mats.

However, there is a county wide shortage of people willing to undertake this task. Great Horwood did set the money aside to pay an officer but as it wasn't being used, reallocated it for contingency. If anyone were to offer to fill the post, the plan could easily be resurrected. All you have to do is contact the Parish Clerk.
