Hope triumphing over adversity is, in some ways, central to understanding the Christmas Story, Mary and Joseph were, after all, on their way to Bethlehem form Nazareth (about 70 miles in distance), when Mary went into labour. As the story goes there was 'no room in the inn,' and the baby Jesus was born in a manger, in a stable.

The fact that over 2,000 years later we are still celebrating the birth of a baby born in a stable, in a manger, should give us all hope. It should also put things in perspective, for sometimes it is the small, seemingly incidental, stories that make the real and enduring difference. Sometimes the small stories turn out to be the biggest stories.

So please do come and join us at St. James this Christmas, under the temporary roof, to celebrate the birth of the Christ-child and the triumph of hope over adversity.


The next Bags2school event being held for Great Horwood School is on the 15th January 2020. Please look out for bags coming through your door.

Florence Nightingale Hospice Charity has announced details of their 2019 Tree of Light events.

The Charity recognises Christmas can be a very emotional occasion and hosts two Tree of Light events which are open to all, regardless of religion or spirituality, and whether or not your loved one was cared for at the Hospice or elsewhere.

"The Tree of Light events are designed to give people a space where a part of the season is set aside to remember and reflect on loved ones," says Ann Kenny, the Bereavement Support Team Lead at the Hospice. "Christmas can often be a time of conflicting emotions, or it can be so busy that those who are grieving can't find a time to process feelings of sadness which may come to the fore at this time of year."

This year's Buckingham Tree of Light event will take place on Saturday 14th December from 4pm at St Peter and St Paul's Church and will retain a traditional feel, with prayers, readings and carols.

The Aylesbury Tree of Light event will have a change of format, with more secular readings and music, rather than carols and prayers, so the Charity hopes that there is something for everyone in the two events.

"We are aware that many of our families are not Christians and may prefer something less religious but still thoughtful and meditative," says Vicky James, Events and Community Manager. "There are lots of other poems and readings which bring comfort, and beautiful music apart from carols, so we are trying something new to see what people think."

The Aylesbury Tree of Light event has also moved indoors for 2019 and will take place at Aylesbury High School on Walton Road on Sunday 1st December at 5pm.

LETTER FROM A VILLAGER

We live in a largely safe and peaceful village and having the windows open in the summer is a great pleasure. We often hear the gentle sounds of summer – people cutting the grass, having BBQs and the hustle and bustle of nature all around us. But there are two harsher sounds that in recent years seem to have been disturbing us more and more: barking dogs and helicopters.

I like to think I'm a reasonably tolerant person – "live and let live" - and I understand the positive things that both dogs and helicopters provide – Dogs bring unconditional love and companionship for the lonely, and helicopters often provide a vital service in emergencies and police operations, but this summer I couldn't help notice the increasingly frequent interruption of these sounds to my daily life, just within my own four walls.

I know owners often get bad press in this publication for dog fouling, but I have another small plea with you all to respect your neighbours by please acting promptly on hearing your dog barking. There has been one near us that has barked for half an hour at a time, setting off other dogs several times a day, throughout the summer - particularly noticeable with windows open obviously.

As for the helicopters, I'm sure there's a flight path across the village, especially to/from Silverstone. I used to live under one of Heathrow's, and it therefore might sound strange me complaining, but I find helicopters have a more penetrating sound somehow. It used to be just one day a year it affected us – the British Grand Prix – when we accepted these sounds as part of living here. But now I suspect it's an aerial commuter route. There's probably nothing that can be done, but I'm sure other villagers will have noticed this. Are pilots supposed to avoid flying directly over villages, I wonder?

I'd like to invite comments/answers from other villagers on these subjects. We've been in Great Horwood over 25 years and are still very happy living here. I look forward to a more peaceful time over autumn and winter, windows firmly closed against the elements!... and hope against hope that when we open them again in 2020, all we hear will be the happy sounds of village life!! HORWOOD PECE

The major activity in October was the Autumn Working Party and in early November 'Fireworks on the Pece'.

The Working party was held over a long weekend 18th-21st October, first the three new oak benches were treated with a weather proof resin (on the 18th), then on the 19th these were installed down the Rec. cemented into the ground with metallic anchor fixings attached to each leg. The other benches were wire-wooled and treated. This addition of benches now provides seating at intervals around the entire Rec. On the 20th the woodwork of the shelter was 'surformed' and sanded to remove any sharp splinters, the hedges were cut back and the Zip-wire adjusted to the correct seat height, removing slack from stretch of the Zipwire. On the 21st additional pruning, bulb planting and groundwork completed a successful weekend maintaining our Rec. Thanks to all who helped.

The remaining work to complete this Autumn was a second

resin coat on the oak benches and replacing the wood facia on either side of the tunnel. It is pleasing to see that the grass has taken and is growing well. The landscaping work has significantly improved the condition of the play areas.

The annual Firework Display proved challenging! With such atrocious weather on the Saturday that it was due to be held, the decision was made to postpone for 24 hours and hold it on the Sunday. This had an adverse effect on the attendance level and food consumed – though the mulled wine went down a treat! Overall the display was a financial loss but our thanks go to all who attended and supported us, and a huge thanks to everyone involved in putting on what was still a great display. Here's hoping the weather is kind to us next year.

Looking forward to Spring, we are in the process of getting final quotes for the woodchip to rubber chippings replacement for the surfacing of the play areas.






