This year, at the time of writing, I can't provide details of the services, but rest assured on the assumption that we are allowed back into church to worship we will.


Christmas this year is going to be very different, but it is not cancelled.





Scheduled Service Update

In the past few weeks, we had progressively resumed our scheduled routes to include Wednesday, Friday and Saturday services.

Unfortunately, with the announcement of Lockdown 2.0, we will have to suspend most services once more with immediate effect.

It is our intention to continue the Wednesday Winslow Market service for essential activities only in line with the new Government National Restrictions.

The Government website describes essential activities as:

"You can leave home to buy things at shops which are open, for instance for food and medicine, or to collect any items - including food or drink - ordered through click-andcollect or as a takeaway, to obtain or deposit money, or to access critical public services"


If you wish to use the Wednesday service, in compliance with the restrictions above, please contact the Bus Coordinator, to reserve your place in the usual manner.

We hope to resume additional services once the latest restrictions are eased, currently this is projected as being after 2nd December.

Other News...

We have some good news! The Bus has recently been resprayed and is now very bright and shiny again. In the course of the next week, we will be adding new and improved signage to complete the upgraded look.

In order to reduce our operating costs, we will be ceasing usage of our landline telephone number. In future, all telephone contact should be via our mobile telephone number: 07483 336440.



PROPOSAL TO REPLACE THE STREET LAMPS IN GREAT HORWOOD WITH ENERGY SAVING LED LAMPS

Since February this year the Parish Council has been exploring the possibility of replacing the lamps on the 30 streetlights in Great Horwood with LED lamps. Progress (or lack of it!) has been reported in the minutes of each Parish Council meeting since then. In September a business case was presented to the Council and they agreed that the project should be taken forward.

This notice is to seek comments and support from Parishioners.

There are currently 30 streetlights in Great Horwood. The existing lamps in Great Horwood are old technology and consume 6,045 kWhrs per annum. If these were replaced with 18W LEDs they would consume 2,215 kWhrs per annum, a saving of 3,830kWhrs. The cost saving on electricity would be £841 a year. LEDS would also result in a reduction in maintenance costs of £339 per annum, a total saving of £1,180 per annum.

The capital outlay would be £7,800 ex VAT (the VAT is recoverable).

The Council has secured in principle an interest free loan of $\pm 4,057$ from Salix Finance.

Salix provides interest-free Government funding to the public sector to improve energy efficiency, reduce carbon emissions and lower energy bills. The loan is calculated at a level that allows it to be paid off from the energy savings within 5 years, so this loan would be cost neutral to the Parish.

The approval of the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) needs to be obtained before this loan can be taken up, and this is ongoing.

In addition to the loan a further £3,743 would be needed. Provision of £5,000 was made in this year's budget for Parish and Community planning. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic it has not been possible to take these forward, so these funds are available for the balance of the expenditure.

There would thus be no increase to the Precept arising from the proposal.

In addition to the financial savings there will be environmental benefits from the proposal.

The anticipated energy saving of 3,825 KWh would give a tCO 2 e saving of 191. This is the same as taking 40 cars off the road for a year or charging 24 million smartphones.



LOCAL CAUSES BENEFIT FROM PARISH COUNCIL GRANTS

In these uncertain times, Great Horwood Parish Council is pleased that it Parish Council can make a difference to organisations in the village.

Income has been lost for many groups as subscriptions haven't been paid and it has not been possible to hold fund raising events in the usual way. We received 4 applications this year from local groups and the grants were allocated as follows:

The Football Club received £500 to buy additional kit, cleaning materials and signage.

The CofE Combined School received £1000 to enhance their outdoor learning environment

The Silver Band received £500 to buy additional equipment in order that they can hold rehearsals indoors again.

The Scouts received £1000 to pay for their insurance and fire extinguisher servicing.

Usually the recipients are invited to the December Parish Council meeting where presentation cheques are awarded. Sadly, this will not be possible as meetings are currently being held via Zoom due to Government guidance.

The organisations will still receive the funds after the December meeting has taken place. Congratulations to all!


I am sure I speak for all our members when I say that we look forward to being able to meet up with our painting friends again.


